
Do you ever wish you had a place where you could connect with others who have experienced the same







Bible Study Verses

Romans 12:2Do not be conformed to this world (this age), [fashioned after and adapted to its external, superficial customs], but be transformed (changed) by the [entire] renewal of



your mind [by its new ideals and its new attitude], so that you may prove [for yourselves] what is the good and acceptable and perfect will of God, even the thing which is good and acceptable and perfect [in His sight for you]. (Amplified)

Action Point

In today's verses we are encouraged to be changed by the renewing of our mind! The only way to renew our mind is to refresh our mind in ?God's holy living Word. When you first wake up, say, "Hello," to God who has given you another glorious day!!!

Connect with Your Creator!!! He is just hanging out giving you rain, sunshine, a cool breeze, a great day fishing, or a soul-renewing hike--if you only clear your mind and see His Creation.

Open up His book and see what He has to say. Talk to Him on your commute to work, or when you're out enjoying what He has made for you!!!

When you realize you've been on autopilot... open up His manual and choose to let Him be your pilot!!!

The second book to look for is: <u>The Noel Diary</u>, by Richard Paul Evans.

We also have <u>Sound of Fear</u> by Marta Perry. Here is a synopsis found in the book: "The foundation of Amanda Curtis's very existence cracks the moment she discovers the woman she thought was her mother had never given birth. Where she belongs is a question she can't put to rest. But when the clues lead to a charming yet chilling small town, the threat against her begins to unfold. Trey Addison is a fixture in Echo Falls, the town and the people are his to protect. He was born to take his place in the family legal firm but now that a stranger, desperate to unlock her past, is depending on him, he's forced to make an impossible choice. If Trey doesn't protect Amanda she'll walk straight into a deadly trap. If he helps her expose the secrets that haunt her, the truth could shatter them both.

The newest Karen Kingsbury is now in our library. *In This Moment* (The Baxter Family): "Luke Baxter, a lawyer specializing in religious freedom cases, takes on the fight of his life when public high school principal Wendell Quinn is sued for starting an after-school Bible study called "Raise the Bar." Wendell has already lost the love of his life because of the program, but still he refuses to end it. Thanks to the program, Hamilton High has seen a dramatic decrease in drug abuse, violence, and teen pregnancies that once plagued the student population. However, this lawsuit threatens to bring everything to a halt. But God's truth won't be silenced, and Luke Baxter vows to stand up for Wendell Quinn. Because the fight is about more than statistics, improved test scores, and better student life-it's about religious liberty and protecting the very things Wendell and the Baxters hold dear: faith, family, and freedom. At home, though, Luke struggles to keep his work from taking over his life. His wife, Reagan worries about his increased hours and time away from the family. She knows his job is crucial, but at what cost?




New In The Pew...

Confidential. Secret. Hidden. Concealed.
False Identity. Fake name. Pseudonym.
No internet. No file synchronization. No risks.
We lift our eyes to the hills, where does our help come from?

It has been an incredible and humbling experience for me to work with translators and teams that face danger. It seems that this year, more than in any previous year, I have had to help teams that need to be careful. Several times this year I have met translation teams in neutral locations. Few weeks go by without questions about how a team can use current computer technology to do their work but at

the same time conceal their identity. Some of these translators have a regular job, like a driver during the day and log into an encrypted and hidden part of their computer at night to work on their translation of the Bible. Some translators are refugees and able to work on the translation freely but then have great difficulty getting the translation back to the people in their home country. For others, their families have fled but the translators have stayed to continue the work of translation, in spite of the dangers. One translator shared with me that only two people from his Church know he is translating the Bible. Isolation, separation and danger are constant realities for many. I wish I could show you

pictures or share their names, but the risks are too great.

Remain faithful in prayer. You bring hope; you bring life to many unreached, unknown, isolated... but dearly loved people.



Funeral Serving Policy

In October of 2017, The Consistory voted in a new policy regarding how funerals will be handled at First Reformed Church. This vote was based on survey's that had been handed out in the beginning of summer, collected and tallied. When this vote came down from the Consistory in October, group leaders were notified of the change, which was effective immediately. The following are the new guidelines:

- Serve buffet style with 2 lines starting at middle of kitchen window.
 If the immediate family requests, we will serve them at their table.
- Use disposable plates (<u>furnished by church</u>) for the food and "real" cups and silverware.
- Tables will be set with silverware, placemats, and napkins. Coffee server, water pitcher, glass with a few spoons in it, a few glasses, and coffee cups will be in the center of each table.
- Cake will be ordered from the bakery, at family expense. Currently, the bakery charges \$45 for 64, 2" by 3" pieces or 96, 2" by 2" pieces.
- Buns, chips or potato salad, and bakery cake will be the standard menu. If family wants
 more, it is their responsibility to make it or have it at church in time.
- Catering is always an option. The family is to make the arrangements and let the serving group leader know as soon as possible.
- Non-church members are encouraged to have it catered.
- We will leave the serving as is it now, with each group having a month at a time in rotation.
