




When America had an urgent need, These brave ones raised a hand; No hesitation held them back; They were proud to take a stand.




They left their friends and family;

Words from Pastor Luke

I sit looking out my window at the clouds and the rains that have fallen the previous night. I am reminded how big and awesome our God is. As we plant our crops it is God who brings the rains and of late, has he brought some big rains. It got me thinking about the magnitude of water that has

fallen on the ground around us. I googled this statistic. One inch of rain falling on 1 acre of ground is equal to about 27,154 gallons and weighs about 113 tons. Last night we got about 3 inches. That equates to 81,462 gallons of water weighting about 339 tons on a single acre!

If you have ever tried to water your lawn after planting new grass you know it takes a lot of work and it takes a lot of water to keep it growing. In a matter of hours God opens up the skies with rain that covers more ground than we could ever imagine. It is done in an instant and in His perfect timing. The amount of rain water is unbelievable. Isn't God great!

This is the God who loves us and desires to be in a relationship with us. This is a God who was willing to sacrifice His one and only Son for us. Have you taken the time this day, this week, this month to reflect on the beauty and joy of your relationship with Him. Why would we ever want to think that we can live our lives without Him. There is no one like our God.

Over the last several weeks I have truly enjoyed our sermon series on the 10 commandments. It has been a great reminder to me of how valuable they continue to be within our lives. Our Heidelberg Catechism is divided into three parts. They are Sin, Salvation and Gratitude. If I were to ask you where you would find the 10 commandments in the catechism what would you say? For some it might be the sin section, others maybe the salvation section. The truth is that the 10 commandments are in the gratitude section.

As God has given us the commandments we are also reminded of the grace he gave to each of us. Because of that grace it should be our desire to live our life as best we can to please God. The commandments were a gift from God for us to be able to enjoy the fulness of life. They strengthen our relationship with God and they strengthen our relationship with others. Thus, the summary Jesus gave when he was among us.

Mark 12:30-31. "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these."

This summary is also found in Matthew and Luke. We see great value in the commandments God has given us. I encourage you to continue to join us as we discover how we can grow our relationships with others. My prayer is that the commandments will continue to be embedded into your lives.

On a side note, I want to encourage and lift up in prayer our summer activities. Pray for those attending summer camps, the High School Mission Trip to Texas, Power Connection for the Middle Schoolers and our College Trip to Louisiana in August. These are great opportunities to grow our young adults into individuals who passionately love the Lord and will go out into the world and serve.






your support! As always if you need a hug, this big ole' teddy bear has got one for you!



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

Sportsmen's Devotional

Bible Study Verses

Revelation 20:2

He laid hold of the dragon, that serpent of old, who is the Devil and Satan, and bound him for a thousand years. (NKJV)

Thoughts

Yesterday, a friend played a joke on me with a rubber rattlesnake, bringing back a flood of memories from years past . . .

My son, 13 at the time, was with me on a quail hunting trip. We were camped out in a remote area with friends. It was my son's first time out carrying a shotgun, my old HR 20-gauge single-shot.

We had walked out of camp to hunt a nearby wash where we had heard quail calling. We hadn't gone far when I heard "SNAKE"! As I looked over toward my son, I saw him bringing his rifle up from the hip, and at the same time saw a huge rattler raise its head like a cobra ready to strike.

The 20-gauge sounded its report and the snake's head was gone. That night, we ate snake for dinner; and today, the snake's skin adorns a rifle sling. After this experience was over, I am not sure who was more relieved, my son or myself. What I am glad for is the snake's demise and the protection my son received.

Action Point

That snake experience was scary for my son and me. We both cried when it was all over. There is a snake (serpent) that stalks each of us today. He knows our weak, unprotected selves, and works to strike when our guard is down.

By reading the whole story in our Bible, we find that Jesus has already defeated this "serpent" on the Cross, will soon have that serpent thrown into the pit for a thousand years, and later thrown into the lake of fire.

The first "official day", May 12th, we spent mostly driving. The drive from Budapest to Lupeni where the Lampens live is about 6 hours. On our drive we stopped to see an ancient Romanian ruin location that was from the first century. After that we finally made it to Lupeni. We got to Jeff and

Chelsea's apartment where we had to climb five flights of stairs. Let's just say I really didn't ever want to leave because I wasn't looking forward to going up the stairs when we got back!
