

Action Point



From the library...


Have you ever read a book you couldn't put down, one that you couldn't wait to read one more chapter that lead to two or three chapters and before you knew it an hour had passed and you hadn't gotten anything accomplished?? I found the "If I Run" series by Terri Blackstock to be just that.

Here is a quick synopsis for each of these quick reads:



Book one IF I RUN—"Casey Cox's DNA is all over the crime scene. There's no use talking to police; they've failed her abysmally before. She has to flee before she's arrested....or worse. The truth doesn't matter anymore. But what IS the truth? BLACKSTOCK That's the question haunting Dylan Roberts, the war-weary veteran hired to find Casey. PTSD has marked him damaged goods, but bringing Casey back can redeem him. Though the crime scene seems to tell the whole story, details of the murder aren't

adding up. Casey Cox doesn't fit the profile of a killer. But are Dylan's skewed perceptions keeping him from being objective? If she's guilty, why did she run? Unraveling her past and the evidence that condemns her will make more time than he has, but as Dylan's damaged soul intersects with hers, he is faced with two choices, the girl who occupies his every thought is a psychopathic kill...or a selfless hero. And the truth would be the most deadly weapon yet."



Book two: IF I'M FOUND—"Casey Cox is still on the run, fleeing prosecution from a murder she didn't commit. Dylan Roberts—her most relentless pursuer---is still on her trail, but his secret emails insist he knows the truth and wants to help her. He's BLACKSTOCK let her escape before when he had her in his grasp, but trust doesn't come easily. As Casey works to collect evidence about the real murderers she stumbles on another unbearable injustice: an abused child and a suicidal man who's also been falsely ac-

cused. Casey risks her own safety to right this wrong and protect the little girl from her tormenters. But doing so is risky and may result in her capture—and if she's captured, she has no doubt she'll be murdered before she ever steps foot in a jail cell."



Final book, *IF I LIVE*—"Casey Cox is still on the run after being indicted for murder. The hunt that began with her bloody footprints escalates, and she's running out of places to hide. Her face is all over the news, and her disguises are no longer enough. It's only a matter of time before someone recognizes her. Dylan Roberts, the investigator who once hunted her, is now her only hope. Terrifying attempts on Dylan's life could force Casey out of hiding. The clock is ticking on both their lives, but exposing the real killers is more complicated than they knew. Amassing, the evidence to convict their enemies draws Dylan and Casey together, but their relationship has consequences. Will one life have to be sacrificed to protect the other.

This series will give you a better understanding of PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder). And I found their use of technology just amazing. Be sure to read the books in order.


Thank you all again for your continued prayers and support for not only our family and our future plans, but Children of the Promise, and the country of Haiti.
