# **Sharing Jesus**

Have you ever been met with suspicion when you tried to share the Good News of Jesus with someone? I have. I've found that it is often because another Christian has tried to share Jesus in a way that does not mesh

with the Good News of Jesus. Christianity is not about following the correct set of rules. There is only one criterion for being a Christian. Do you want to know what it is? **It's a rock solid faith in the truth that Jesus really is the Son of God and he really did pay the price for all of creation to be reconciled to the Creator**. That's it. No amount of doing makes you a Christian, only the knowledge that Jesus is Savior and Lord. First's mission statement claims that we Glorify when we live a life fully surrendered to Jesus the Christ

The Good news of Jesus Christ that we try to communicate as followers of Jesus rarely gets through because what outsiders often hear is "My worldview is better that your worldview, so let me tell you why I'm right and you are wrong." Listen to the way *The Message* translates Paul's letter to the church in Colossae:

Use your heads as you live and work among outsiders. Don't miss a trick. Make the most of every opportunity. Be gracious in your speech. The goal is to bring out the best in others in a conversation, not put them down, not cut them out.

Colossians 4:5-6

In many cases instead of opening their hearts to Jesus, well intended Christians merely perpetuate an "us versus them" mentality. Take some time this week to meditate on Colossians 4:5-6. Try to relate with people who have yet to meet Jesus. Use every opportunity that God opens to you.

Prayer: God open my eyes to the way I may be hindering others as they search for Jesus in a lost and broken world. Make me present to opportunities for spiritual conversations with others in my daily life. Amen.

Fear nothing-not wild wolves in the night, not flying arrows in the day. (Message)

## **Thoughts**

My dad use to tell us kids the story when he



tried to ride his bicycle to Uncle Dick's farm way up in the north woods of Minnesota. It was further than he had expected and it was getting dark when the wolves started to howl on his left, then on his right. He peddled faster and the howling got closer. His legs were like rubber from fatigue, but he was sure the wolves were trying to cut him off from reaching the safety of the old farm house.

He would of course only tell the story at night around the campfire and as kids it would provoke great fear and suspense. We could feel the fire in his lungs and legs.

As the old farm house came into view, the wolves were starting to come out on the old logging road, closing in. He was standing up peddling now, praying someone would be home to meet him at the door with a really, really big gun.

## Action Point

I love that the Bible relates directly to me personally and that within every story there is a promise to me personally. "Fear Nothing, not even wild wolves in the night."

God has my back, my future and promises to rescue, shield, protect, fend off, be my shield, be my refuge and be my fortress. As light takes the fear out of darkness, God takes the fear out of life.

It's a choice to let our minds conjure up all kinds of fears or take the promises of God and believe them personally.

There is a new Christmas book for children in the library: **SANTA'S PRAYER** written by Tom Roberts who lives in Sioux Falls, S.D. It is about a brother and sister who were out walking and found themselves at church. They go in and find Santa there kneeling in the hay before the manger in which the Baby Jesus lay. What follows is a very meaningful prayer by Santa talking about what Christmas is all about.



In the adult section there is a new fiction book by a favorite Amish author, Beverly Lewis, **THE BEGINNING**. "Susie Mast's Amish life in Lancaster County has been shaped by events beyond her control with the tragic deaths of her Dat and close-in-age brother casting long shadows. Now twenty-two Susie remains unmarried despite her longtime affection for friend Obie Yoder. Unfortunately, her concerns are soon multiplied due to her mother's worsening health and her younger sister's urgent desire for answers about her adoption. Once again, Susie faces the possibility of loss.

Will long-held family secrets and missed opportunities dim Susie's hopes for the future? Or is what seems like the end only the beginning?"



Kim Vogel Sawyer is the author of another new book **STILL MY FOR-EVER.** "Four years after leaving town to make a name for himself as a composer, Gilbert Baty has returned temporarily to Falke, Kansas. Now, he's trying to keep everyone from learning the truth about his disastrous years in New York City. He hopes to start writing music again in Falke, but he can't help being distracted by Ava Flaming, the brown-eyed baker to whom he was briefly engaged before he ended things-and who still stirs feeling in him he know he has no right to pursue. Ava had thought she was past the loss

of Gil Baty, but to her dismay, she's as drawn to him as ever. The situation only gets worse when Gil establishes a youth band in Falke, showing once more what a good man he is. But when the band has a chance to compete in a statewide competition Ava faces the prospect of heartbreak again. Could music take Gil away forever this time? Or might God be stirring in Ava's and Gil's hearts a new song that will draw them together for good?"

Hello First Reformed Church,

"It's the most wonderful time of the year!" Seeing the snow hit the ground really reminds me that we are in the most wonderful time of the year. We have Thanksgiving that is approaching very quickly, and of course than we have Christmas.



What is your favorite Winter tradition? Is it decorating the Christmas tree, putting up Christmas lights, setting out the Thanksgiving/Fall décor, or is it snowball fights in the front yard? I am going to go ahead and say it's probably the last one. Regardless of who we are or where we come from, we all have different traditions that we like to do this time of the year. One of the traditions that I love to do with my family is to watch, "It's a Wonderful Life." We watch that at least once a month and especially during Christmas time. If you have not seen It's a Wonderful Life, you need to. It is the classic tale about George Bailey, the richest man in town, who is shown what life would be like if he was not alive when he contemplates suicide. It sounds very dark and sad, but it is labeled as one of the most inspirational and heartwarming movies ever made. It really is an amazing movie. I like to watch this movie because of its rich history and because of its amazing message. No matter how bad things might seem you must never give up your faith or you family. Another great tradition we do is we read the accounts leading up to the birth of Jesus Christ in our home. When I mean we read the accounts leading up to it, I mean we read the history of why Jesus had to come, essentially all of the main highlights of the Old Testament. Why do we do that? ## Update from Adrian and Bernardeth Bobb-Kelly November 2022

Dear friends,

For the past fifteen years, Tabitha's house has served as a home to more than thirty kids and young ladies. Most of these children were brought to us by the child protective service institution here in Bluefields. They would bring these children to Tabitha's House and we would take care of and provide for them until their case was solved. At times it would be just for a few weeks, but in other cases, it would be for up to five years. Many times they would not be attending school. In these cases, we would seek for them the appropriate school fit plus buy their books, pencils, and other needs, and have them go to school. Sometimes they would be nine years old or even older and hadn't gone to school yet. In these cases, we would seek schools with programs where they could get to study two grades in a year. We have also received kids who were at the age of kindergarten so they would get to enjoy going



to school at an early age. Some got to finish their high school studies and went further. We want to tell you the story of one of those students: Shayann Martinez Shayann's Little Story

Shayann was one of the kindergarten children who was left by her mother to the care of some relatives as she migrated to Panama. The mother promised she would be away just for a year or two. Shortly after she had gone, perhaps two months later, her relatives handed Shayann over to child protective service. One day, they brought the child to us, asking if we would be willing to take care of her until they contacted her dad who was not living in Blue-field. We saw the need and willingly accepted to help the child. Shayann finished her kindergarten year and went on to first grade. When she had finished her first grade, her dad came from Corn Island to Bluefields to ask for Shayann. They gave her to him. She was happy to see her dad and also to be reunited with her siblings.

Shortly after she had gone to Corn Island with her dad, I received a call from a lady who was a representative of the child protective service in Corn Island. She told me she was calling me to tell me that Shayann was not going to school and she was not treated well because her dad had taken her to a stepmother where she was physically and psychologically abused. Knowing this situation, we agreed to have her in Bluefields if her father agreed. Eventually, her daddy accepted to send her to us. That is how Shayann came back to Tabitha's House and got started in second grade. It was not an easy road for her because she had no contact with her mother until she turned 15. That is when her mother came with the promise to take her to Panama. We were not able to do anything about her mother's plan; it was totally out of our control, so she went. Then it happened that her mother called and told us that Shayann wants to continue at the home and she would not go to Panama again. Consequently, Shayann came back to Tabitha's House and continued with her studies, finishing high school in 2020 at the Colegio Cristiano El Verbo.

In 2021, Shayann requested admission at the Bluefields Indian and Caribbean University for a technical career.

Thanks be to God, in February she was notified that she was admitted to study Surgical Technician and Nurses' Aid. This was an intensive career of fourteen months. Shayann received her certification as a Surgical Technician and Nurses Aid this year. At present, she is working in the

Regional Hospital in Bluefields and enjoying what she does.
