The Church is a School of Life

Since I've arrived here at First Reformed, one of my main goals has been to cast a vision for our church as a spiritually healthy place for people to meet the Lord Jesus, come into a personal relationship with him, grow in a consistent and reliable way, and ultimately learn how to share what they've learned with anyone who wants to know. You see, God's whole rationale for

calling the church into existence is so that it can be a school of life. That is, a place where anyone who wants to can come and learn from Jesus, in a community context, how to live their lives as Jesus would live their lives if he were in their place.

Where do I find the scriptural support for that assertion? Well, it's in many places in the Bible, but we see it quiet clearly in Matthew 28:16-20, a passage we refer to as the Great Commission. I wonder if you've thought about those words very often?

Jesus starts by saying, "All authority in heaven and earth has been given to me." That's who we're working for. Those are the resources he makes available to his helpers to accomplish the task. We're not resource-poor. We are promised all the help we need.

"Therefore..." Jesus says. Whenever you see the word "therefore" in scripture, you need to pay attention. The writer is about to present a conclusion based on what he's just said. In this case, Jesus is saying, "I've got power over everything in heaven and earth for the express purpose of accomplishing the task I'm about to give you. You can do this because this is something we are doing together." Most of our translations give the next word as "go." I think it's better translated as "as you are going...."

This presents making disciples as something of a by-product to the normal living of our lives with the Lord Jesus, and eventually people noticing that we're different and asking you about it. I think that's a really important point. We've made evangelism this awkward, stand-alone thing where we approach strangers with free Bibles and maybe gospel tracts. Basically we've turned evangelism into the systematic bothering of people who don't particularly want to be bothered by people who don't particularly want to be doing the bothering. That's why nobody evangelizes. And I don't blame them. Think about how you feel when the Mormons or the Jehovah's Witnesses show up at your front door or pigeonhole you in some public place to push their religion. I bet you don't like it much. Me either. And so I don't want to participate in anything like that myself.

"All authority in heaven and earth has been given to me, therefore, as you are going make disciples......" Notice Jesus didn't say, "make Calvinists." Nor did he say, "make Reformed People" or, "make Presbyterians" or even, "make Christians." He said, "make disciples." What is a disciple? This is a super important point that we are very confused about in our day. Currently, the gospel has become so obscured that we think you can be a Christian without being a disciple. There's no encouragement to think that way in all of scripture. A disciple is an apprentice. A disciple is someone who is living and learning in an interactive relationship with a Master Teacher. The goal of that interactive relationship is to be able to do the things the Master Teacher does when it is appropriate to do so. Discipleship isn't merely getting together once a week for a Bible study, though Bible study is a wonderful and necessary thing. Discipleship is about changing the human heart, because that's where all of our actions originate from. (Luke 6:45)

"All authority in heaven and earth has been given to me. Therefore, as you are going, make apprentices, teaching them to obey all that I have commanded you...."

When we think about that last part... the part about teaching the apprentice-in-training... we usually think in terms of "teaching them that they <u>ought</u> to do all I have commanded, but aren't really expected to actually do so. Because grace. Or something." That's assuming that we've thought about it at all, which is not readily apparent.

Since a disciple is one who is in the process of learning from the Master to do what the Master does, then it only makes sense that Jesus means something like, "....teaching them in such a way that they learn to actually do all that I have commanded. They become capable of completing that task." We're not just teaching people that they ought to change. We are also teaching them how to change. And how can we teach someone in such a way that they are able to routinely do all that Jesus has commanded if we don't have the ability to do that ourselves? You can't teach people how to do what you don't know how to do yourself! So the Great Commission presupposes that we ourselves have made some progress along the path of apprenticeship to Jesus. It presumes that we are at least becoming the sorts of people who can "do all that [he] has commanded," and are sharing our knowledge and experience with others who are not as far along the path as we are.

And here we get to some very good news. Becoming more like Christ is not automatic. You don't pray to receive Jesus on one day and find that you wake up Christlike the next day. It requires effort on our part. That effort is, of course, assisted by grace. The good news is that there are reliable, repeatable ways of changing in our depths so that what comes out of us is sweet and kind and good. These are witnessed to in the Bible, and they have a long history of success in the church. These activities, when empowered by the Spirit, change us into the likeness of Christ on the inside, so that what comes out of us naturally is good. These are things like fasting, solitude, meditation on, and study and memorization of the scriptures, forms of prayer you probably haven't tried before, secret acts of service, worship, right use of the Lord's Supper, and others.

The mission of First Reformed is for her members to become the sorts of people who are intentionally and systematically pursuing spiritual transformation into Christlikeness, and who are sharing that journey with others who want to know, inviting them to come and experience life with Jesus for themselves. That's really our only purpose. If we try to make this church about anything other than that, we might be able to create some buzz and excitement around town for a few months, but nothing more will be accomplished, and the church will eventually peter our and die.

But if we become apprentices who are inviting others to become apprentices, this congregation will flourish. It will become a genuine place of life-giving blessing. That is what I want for you. The real question is, what do you want for yourselves?







We have two mysteries to tell you about this month: The first is **OVER THE EDGE** book #2 from the "Undaunted Courage" series by Irene Hannon. "'Someone is on a relentless campaign to destroy her credibility—if not her life!' 


I greet the Iowa Church in the name of Jesus our Savior. May God always keep the church firm under His power, He who created the heavens and the earth.






