
pretty crazy how fast time has gone. It feels only yesterday I was writing a newsletter and now I am doing it again. Before I get into the youth group and ministry, I wanted to take a moment and share something that happened to me the other day. It was actually this last Sunday when I went with the outreach team to the Freedom's Gate Church service in Sioux Falls. I was very nervous about this because I did not know what to expect. I did not know if I was going to meet some former inmates I guarded or if they would know me. I did not know if there was going to be a fight, an outraged member, or anything of that nature. I did come prepared. I was ready for anything as I was sitting and listen to the message or helping the team prepare the meal, I was constantly also looking out to watch the crowd. I then caught myself and it happened!

I stopped searching for a problem to arise and I started seeing the members for who they truly are, guilty sinners who have repented and are trying to honor God in all they do. Sound familiar? In that moment when I stopped looking for a fight or expecting something, I took a step back and I looked around to see what was going on around me. There were people all around me who had made a big mistake in their past and they realize it and they are trying to make it right. I remember when I first started as an officer and the Warden of the jail was speaking to our class. He said something that I will never forget about the inmates, "Remember that we all have broken the law in some way, some greater than others, but we all have done something that should have landed us in jail, the only difference is that these people got caught." That made so much sense to me, especially as a devout Christian. This type of mentality was first explained in scripture, John 8 to be exact when the woman who was caught in adultery and the Pharisees brought her to Jesus and told him she needs to be stoned according to the law. Jesus simply said, "He who is without sin, may he cast the first stone." We all have broken God's law and deserve God's wrath and judgment, but Jesus took that penalty so that we could be forgiven. Live that way and view people that way, you are no better than them. Going to Freedom's Gate you would never see an ounce of judgment in that place, just grace, forgiveness, and honesty. May we as a church mirror that as well. To be a church that is full of grace for the guilt sinner, to offer the message of forgiveness for sins, and to be honest with ourselves and each other.

Youth group is going great. We are finishing our summer program calendar and we are very excited for what is going to happen this summer! We are in the process of planning mission trips, retreats, and of course lock-ins! Please be on the lookout for those dates and there may even be a need for chaperones please consider coming with us on a trip if you are able. 

What is Right Now Media? Right Now Media is an online library filled of hundreds of resources that are valuable not only in a church Bible Study setting but also on an individual basis. Bible Studies and devotional topics range from Christian Living, Marriage, Work, Science, Leadership plus many, many others.

How do I get a FREE account? Please visit our website, www.sibleyfrc.org, and click on the Media tab. Scroll down until you see Right Now Media. Use the first blue link to set up your account and then once you are set up, use the second blue link to login to your new account, or simply go to rightnowmedia.com and click "login" in the top right corner. You can also download the App or scan the above code to get an account.

How do I find something on the website? Once you have an account you will be able to access the Right Now Media Library. Going to the top left corner you will find the word browse. Here you can search by topic, teacher, or age group. Let's say you find a Bible Study you think might be interesting. Simply click on the image of the study and then click on the small icon of a bookmark under the study title to save this study to your list of favorites. FRC Right Now Media users have also voiced their opinions as to studies they have enjoyed. Those studies can now be found by clicking on the words First Reformed Church on the top right corner of the page. Here you will see a listing of some recommended resources. What one person likes, may not be what you enjoy. However, with such a vast assortment of titles and themes, there is bound to be something on Right Now Media for you.

I am blessed to work with many mission partners, but the three that I spent the most time working with in 2021 were the Christian Reformed Church in North America, Church World Service (CWS), and Partners Relief & Development.

With the Christian Reformed Church in North America, I had the opportunity to continue as a blog writer for the CRC Do Justice blog, serve as a Core Team Member of the join CRC/RCA Journeys into Friendship Network (a group of people from both denominations who are interested in the biblical themes of friendship with those whom we often consider "the other" in our world, including immigrants/migrants, international students, refugees, and those who come from different faith traditions), and to connect with colleagues from World Renew re-

supporting refugees and those affected by natural disasters.

Being the

Foot of Support the Fa I serve on the Faith Solidarity Team for CWS, composed of representatives from various Christian denominations in the U.S. and CWS staff members who meet at least monthly to discuss issues related to refugees and displaced people and how we can work collaboratively to meet their needs. We have worked nonstop since July 2021 to assist in the resettlement efforts of 65,000 Afghan refugees who were airlifted out of Afghanistan and landed at U.S. military bases in the U.S. and beyond, while also advocating for compassionate care for other displaced people and people on the move.

I also worked with Partners Relief & Development, raising awareness of the plight of the Yazidi people in Iraq and the Rohingya in Myanmar/Bangladesh, and raising funds through RCA Global Mission for education projects that serve both of these groups of people. Thanks to your generous support–both prayerfully and financially–Partners was able to rebuild a school in Iraqi Kurdistan that now serves over 700 children; these children faced five years of attempted

The Iraq project was such an amazing story of God's love shared with refugees in a lifegiving way that we decided to work with Partners Relief & Development, once again, and have committed to raising \$60,000 to cover the costs to run eight schools in Myanmar and Bangladesh for approximately 550 Rohingya children. The Rohingya have been called "the most persecuted minority in the world" by the United Nations, and this persecution has increased significantly since 2017 since Myanmar stripped the Rohingya of their citizenship and have conducted multiple campaigns of deadly violence and forced displacement against the Rohingya people, most of whom now either live in refugee camps in Bangladesh or in internally displaced camps (guarded by the military, who rations the people's access to food, clean water, medical care, etc.). These eight schools not only provide the students with education, but also clothing and shoes, school bags and school supplies, food and clean water, exam fees, and even transportation, as needed. The schools also supply training and stipends for the teachers, who are, themselves, refugees. We have currently only raised about onethird of the \$60,000 needed to fund this project, so if you or your church are interested in helping us


meet our goal of funding all eight schools for one entire year (at a cost of approximately \$140 per student), please contact me at <u>jitenclay@rca.org</u> for more information. You can also give to this project here: www.rca.org/give/partners-relief-and-development.

Beyond working with these three partners, I had the opportunity to explore new partnerships focused on the care of refugees and other displaced people around the world, including partnerships in Syria, Lebanon, Jordan, Greece, and Mexico, while also reconnecting with previous partners in Italy. Whether these connections will bear fruit beyond spending time with other members of the body of Christ in prayer and discernment is yet to be determined, but it is a blessing, nonetheless, to meet these brothers and sisters in the faith and to learn more about the ways they are providing compassionate care for refugees and displaced people in the name of Christ.

Three new books have been put in circulation in the library. Here is a bit about each of them.




THE CASE FOR CHRIST by Lee Strobel: "Retracing his own spiritual journey from atheism to faith, Lee Strobel, a former legal editor of the CHICAGO TRIBUNE, cross-examines a dozen experts who are recognized authorities in their fields of history, archaeology, and manuscript studies. Strobel challenges them with questions like 'How reliable is the New Testament? Does evidence for Jesus exist outside the Bible? Is there any reason to believe the resurrection was an actual event?' Strobel's tough, point-blank questions make this bestselling book read like a captivating, fast-paced novel. But it's not fiction. It's a riveting quest for the truth about history's most compelling figure."



THE SONG by Chris Fabry—"Jed King's life has been shaped and scarred by the songs and mistakes of his famous father. He wants to sing his own song, but the words and melody are elusive. Jed's dreams of a successful music career seem out of reach...until he meets Rose. Inspired by his love for the vineyard owner's daughter, Jed pens a new song—a song with such emotional power and longing that it catapults him into stardom. But with this life of fame comes temptation, the same temptation that lured his father so many years ago now threatens to unravel his marriage. The pull of 'The Song' takes Jed and Rose on a journey that will force them to deal with failure, the pain of

loss, and the desire to be who God created them to be. Together they will test the limits of the promise that love is the power that heals."



A DEEP DIVIDE by Kimberley Woodhouse is "Secrets of the Canyon" series book #1. "After being kidnaped as a child, heiress Emma Grace McMurray has seen first hand the devastation that greed causes in the world and she wants nothing to do with it. When she discovers her father has offered her up as a bargaining chip to expand his empire, she disappears into the night. Determined to stay hidden, even if it means always looking over her shoulder, she finds herself working as a Harvey Girl at the El Tovar Hotel. When Ray Watkins arrives at the hotel on business, he is immediately captivated by the beauty of the Grand Canyon. Though his fame-seeking father aims to lure new


