

I want to share these Bible verses with all of you who are a part of the church.




Colossians 3:14-17

HOW WILL WE LIVE NOW?

I am sure I am not alone when I say that during the past two years America has been turned upside-down and inside-out. 2020 saw riots unlike anything we have seen since the cultural revolutions of the 1960's and 70s. Since then our language has been littered with new words and terms, or by the redefining of existing words. Two years ago most of us were not regularly talking about WOKE, CRT, or LGBTQIA2S, gender identity, social justice, and many others. In October 2021, Merriam-Webster added 455 new words to their dictionary!

Media is quick to use these terms, and assume that we all know what they mean or where they came from. However, a followers of Jesus Christ we need to know what is being said, what it means and how we are to respond to these new ways of thinking.

While it may seem that these ideas exploded out of nowhere, they did not. Each of these new ideas and movements came from other, older ideas. As Dr. R.C. Sproul taught, there are *consequences to ideas*. Recently someone thoughtfully said that they liked hearing me teach, but said I was 'above their heads'. But I don't know anything that everyone can't learn—so during the next few months I am going to talk a bit about the ideas that have shaped our world. I am also going to add a few resources to the church library so you can read more if you are interested.



The changes we are experiencing now have come from philosophers and theologians of past centuries. One of the most influential teachers of my early adult life was Dr. Francis Schaeffer. One book above all others are worth reading now. In 1976, he published *How Should We Then Live? The Rise and decline of Western Thought and Culture.* Since reading this book I have visited many museums and cultural sites around the world and I always hear his words in my head. He explained the ideas that shaped our Western culture and he produced a video series—before everything was video. There will be a DVD copy in the library in the next few weeks.

In 1999 Charles Colson published *How Now Should We Live?* He continued the discussion, explaining how we became a post-Christian culture and suggested ways we could rebuild our world with a biblical worldview. I have also read this book many times. For a time the student version was a part of the catechism classes for high school students at our church. I'll keep looking for the DVD of this series—but the book will be available to read.

Why this? Why now? Because It seems that our culture is disintegrating around our ears. There will be no 'swing back' from the changes we are now experiencing. What we are witnessing is the end of the dominant influence of Christianity on the western world. Dr. Robert Godfrey said in March of this year (2022 Ligonier National Conference) that the Obergefell Decision (June 2015) is the date that marks the end of the Christian era in the western world. He contends that the date we legalized same-sex marriage is a good date to mark the end of 1,500 years of Christian dominance over culture. This is pretty depressing!

However, **we are not without hope**. Quite the contrary. Both books used Ezekiel 33:10 as the text for the title of their books. "Now as for you, son of man, say to the house of Israel, *'This is what you have said: "Surely our offenses and our sins are upon us, and we are rotting away in them; how then can we survive?"*

In verse 11 God gives us the solution. "Turn back, turn back from your evil ways!" If we do, and if our culture also turns back, then we will see our culture be redeemed. We have HOPE because God gives hope to us.



Bible study Verses

Thoughts

I come from a ranching and farming heritage. Growing up in a very rural area, I was tasked from my earliest childhood with taking care of horses, livestock, and hunting--the only kind of life I knew until adulthood. Butchering livestock and wild game was nothing out of the "norm".

Along with that, harvesting various parts of animals for consumption, not considered edible by your average urban dweller, was also normal--the stomach of a cow or the liver of a deer to name a few. I have mentioned this to some friends throughout my life with less than positive responses: "Ugh! Cow tongue?!" "You eat rattlesnake?! You can't eat that stuff!"

Action Point

Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like a man who looks at his face in a mirror and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. Read James 1:23-24.

Just as eating the less popular parts of an animal will not make you unclean, if your actions are not forthright, affiliation with a respected sportsmen group will not make you a true sportsman. Likewise, it does not matter what church you belong to, if your life and doctrine are not in agreement with it, membership will be of no advantage to you. "But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it-not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it-they will be blessed in what they do," James 1:25 (NIV).

Do not be tempted to cut ethical corners in the field, but be an ambassador for Christ wherever you are. You never know when the clean bright light that comes from you will shine on someone who will be influenced toward Christ!!!

Sportsmen's Tip of the Day

When dealing with anti-hunters or anti-meat eaters, try not to overpower them with your opinions on the subject. They expect that from us. First of all, receive our heartfelt thanks for your prayers and generous support towards our ministry here in Bluefields, Nicaragua.

Last year, despite all the COVID-19 challenges, we made it through with the children at both feeding places.

We ended the year with a great thanksgiving celebration. A lady from our church donated us a whole pig and the children had a pork meal for that special day plus their little gift packages.

We began this year with a new face of the feeding place. First, we painted the inner part of the building and made new tables with benches for the children. For the first feeding time of the year 2022, they were able to sit around a table like they used to before the COVID-19 days and enjoy their meal.

The Tabitha's Homes are still functioning, although not with the same objectives as before but similar. Since last year, they have been serving as a home for low-

income and poor family children from the small villages that are willing to continue with their studies in Bluefields. Currently, we have four boys and four girls, half in primary and half in the secondary level. The Spanish language has been a problem for some of them but they have improved a lot this year and are doing better for this year.



The Medical brigades continue to visit the sick and poor in the remote villages. Now, besides medical attention, we do papanicolaou and stress and pain relief therapy. Moreover, on some occasions, we even carry dentists when patronized by any generous person.

The pastor and midwife training was paused last year because of the pandemic threat but since we have gotten the vaccine we are thinking of starting again this year.

From the library--




