

#### **Bible Study Verse**

Mark 7:14-16

Again Jesus called the crowd to him and said, "Listen to me, everyone, and understand this. Nothing outside a person can defile them by going into them. Rather, it is what comes out of a person that defiles them."

#### **Thoughts**

I come from a ranching and farming heritage. Growing up in a very rural area, I was tasked from my earliest childhood with taking care of horses, livestock, and hunting--the only kind of life I knew until adulthood. Butchering livestock and wild game was nothing out of the "norm".

Along with that, harvesting various parts of animals for consumption, not considered edible by your average urban dweller, was also normal--the stomach of a cow or the liver of a deer to name a few. I have mentioned this to some friends throughout my life with less than positive responses: "Ugh! Cow tongue?!" "You eat rattlesnake?! You can't eat that stuff!"

#### **Action Point**

Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like a man who looks at his face in a mirror and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. Read James 1:23-24.

Just as eating the less popular parts of an animal will not make you unclean, if your actions are not forthright, affiliation with a respected sportsmen group will not make you a true sportsman. Likewise, it does not matter what church you belong to, if your life and doctrine are not in agreement with it, membership will be of no advantage to you. "But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it-not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it-they will be blessed in what they do," James 1:25 (NIV).

Do not be tempted to cut ethical corners in the field, but be an ambassador for Christ wherever you are. You never know when the clean bright light that comes from you will shine on someone who will be influenced toward Christ!!!

#### Sportsmen's Tip of the Day

When dealing with anti-hunters or anti-meat eaters, try not to overpower them with your opinions on the subject. They expect that from us. I always find it interesting to listen and take a philosophical approach. I have influenced at least one non-meat eater this way. Though he still does not eat meat, he is actually an advocate of hunting!

#### From the library--

Along with the "Book of the Week" in the bulletin each Sunday here are synopsis from three more new books being added to the library.



Book #1 in the "Friendship Letters" series is LETTERS OF TRUST by Wanda E. Brunstetter. "Life is good on their Pennsylvania Amish farm for newlyweds Vic and Eleanor Lapp—until a tragic event occurs and Vic truns to alcohol to numb the pain. Things get so bad that Vic loses his job and their marriage is falling apart. Eleanor is dseperate to help her husband and sends letters asking for advice to a friend who lives in Indiana. The trust Eleanor puts in her friend Doretta and the gentle words she reeives in return are a balm for even darker days to come.



If you have read books one and two of the "Wyoming Sunrise" series by Mary Connealy, you will definitely want to read MARSHALING HER HEART the third and final book. "Becky Pruitt has always prided herself on knowing everything that's happening on her successful ranch, so an unexpected admission from her foreman, Nate Paxton, comes as quite a surprise. With the notorious Deadeye Gang on the loose, Nate—a former U.S, Marshal—believes Becky's ranch is the best spot for a group of Marshals to use as a base to hunt the Gang down. The timing couldn't be more crucial for the town of Pine Valley, and Becky feels obligated to help. But after escaping the grasp of her harsh father, she's never liked giving up control, of

her life or her ranch. If there's anyone she can trust with her ranch, and her heart, it might be Nate. But the outlaws won't go away quietly, and as danger draws ever nearer, Becky and

Nate are faced with impossible choices that will test their growing bond."



Last we have a 4in1 book, THE LIBRARIAN'S JOURNEY, four historical romances. "Part of FDR'a New Deal was the Works Progress Adminstration, which funded the Pack Horse Library Initiative. Ride along with the four book-loving women who bravely fight for literacy in remote communities during the Great Depression. Will their efforts be rewarded by finding love in the process?

LOVE'S TURNING PAGE by Cynthia Hickey—1935, Ozark Mountains—Grace Billings jumped at the chance to be a traveling librarian, but she didn't anticipate the long days of work, the intense poverty, or the handsome new school-

teacher whose love for the mountain people surpasses even her own.

FOR SUCH A TIME by Patty Smith Hall—1936--Pine Mountain, Georgia—Ruth Sims joins the traveling library initiative, only to discover she must go to the one place she swore never to return. The children instantly steal her heart with their thirst for books, and she's happy in her post, until she meets their teacher, Will Munroe—the man who broke her heart.

BOOK LADY OF THE BAYOU by Marilyn Turk—1935, Mississippi—Forced out of her comfort zone, Lily Bee Davis travels by horse or boat, taking books to remote areas. When she meets little Evie and her reclusive father at a dilapidated plantation house, she is moved by their losses and longs to draw them out into life again.

THE LIBRARIAN AND THE LAWMAN by Kathleen Y'Barbo—1936, Kentucky—Lottie Trent connects with a backwoods bully's wife by secretly carrying messages for her in exchange for books. FBI agent Clayton Turnsbow is on the trail of a criminal gang and discovers the packhorse librarian may be a key member."

Visit the library, there is sure to be a book that will spark your interest.

It's not just my own son's graduation that's making me nostalgic. It's watching his whole friend group pose in cap and gown, friends who just a few summers ago were sporting sno-cone staches from vacation Bible school and piling onto buses for their first week at away camp. I watch them stand for pictures together, lanky arms across one other's shoulders with grins as wide as their dreams.



And I want to tell them — breathe it in. Enjoy this fully.

Because I know something they don't. This is ending, I whisper silently. It took 18 full summers to get here and it will never be again. Even when you come home from your colleges and get together, it will be great but it won't be this. The momentum, at first hardly detectable, is unmistakable now.

Breathe it in. Enjoy this fully.

I'm watching these kids step from our lives into their own. I always imagined being a mom as a destination. I knew from the start that there would be release one day, but it was way down the road and I couldn't see it because I was up to my eyeballs in mom stuff. Release is here now and release is hard.

**But I did know their value.** I've always sensed it — even on the hardest days and in my most impatient moments. I've treasured the little hand slipped into mine, a grocery cart full of tow-headed preschoolers, grass worn bare in the backyard from summers of touch football.

There were daily commutes in the car and hard nights up late and endless loads of laundry, but even those were cherished signs of full life with kids in the home. I tried my best to breathe it in and enjoy it fully, as if that would slow the steady march of days.

In the flurry of graduation activities, I've noticed the orange trees in our backyard producing small green oranges where there used to be a profusion of small white blossoms. Orange blossoms have an undeniable scent. I remember as a child driving through Florida's rolling hills of orange groves when the orange blossom fragrance was so strong it came right through our car windows. And yet, as heady as that scent is, no farmer would be content with a grove of orange blossoms. His labor is meant to produce fruit.

These last 18 years? They have been heady with the sweet fragrance that is childhood. But there is so much more.

#### Dear Mom, you know what no one told you about high school graduation?

There is yet great fruit. These first 18 years have been bud and blossom: a wonder-filled, breathtaking season. But your work was never meant to produce bud or blossom. All along, God has intended to produce fruit. Fruit only God can bring about.

And so, in this last lap of childhood, we let go. We release the bud and blossom, so tenderly stewarded these 18 years, and we trust the Master Gardener.

There is yet good, good fruit ahead.



#### **CHOOSING A CHURCH**

Technology affects everything—and always has! Have you ever thought about how the automobile changed the way we worship? At the beginning of the 20th century, most people attended a church close to home because people walked to church or came by horse or wagon. You can't go very far in an hour by either of these modes of

transportation. Today, people can get 50 to 60 miles away in an hour. *This probably depends on how fast you drive or if you must stop for coffee.* 

As the automobile became a common sight on the roads, people started flocking to cities and larger towns. This urbanization, coupled with the mobility offered by the automobile, led to a a significant shift in religious practices. No longer tied to their 'home' church, people could find new places of worship. The urban landscape offered many choices, presenting a new set of challenges. Post-WWII, the trend of urban dwellers moving to suburbs further expanded the religious landscape, with even more churches to choose from.

In the Protestant world, more and more churches were divided over theology while new church movements like Pentecostalism took root. Preaching styles, worship styles, and music changed through the end of the last century. At the same time, more people adopted part, or all, of secular thinking about belief and church membership, and people could stay home and watch religious broadcasting on TV. In addition, there has been a shift from thinking of worship only as music or a feeling you have during the service.

As a result, people are no longer always committed to their local church. If something happens they don't like it is really easy to drive down the road to another church that they think has better music or a better preacher. People are *shopping* for churches and can switch them as easily as they switch grocery stores.

There are reasons to leave a church, and if you continue to read this article, you can see *between the lines* what is driving our congregation to question staying with the RCA. I know that Guido de Bres did not have this in mind when he wrote the Belgic Confession, but it is still relevant to the questions we face today. *Article 29: The Marks of the True Church* outlines for reformed believers what we should consider when picking a congregation or a denomination to join.



#### ARTICLE 29 OF THE BELGIC CONFESSION

Article 29 contains three marks of a true church and an injunction not to be separated from it. At the time of the Dutch Reformation, it was most important to distinguish between the Catholic church, other emerging denominations, and the true church that came from Geneva. A true church will demonstrate the following:

#### 1. Pure preaching of the gospel

We must remain faithful to the truth of the Bible. It is inerrant and may not be changed or adapted to suit current trends.

#### 2. Pure administration of sacraments

The Reformed church celebrates two sacraments—baptism and communion. We believe that Jesus is present at those two celebrations but is not physically present in the elements. We baptize our infants, following the everlasting

**Article 29: The Marks of The True Church**We believe that we ought to discern diligently and

very carefully, by the Word of God, what is the true church— for all sects in the world today claim for themselves the name of "the church."

We are not speaking here of the company of hypocrites who are mixed among the good in the church and who nonetheless are not part of it, even though they are physically there. But we are speaking of distinguishing the body and fellowship of the true church from all sects that call

The true church can be recognized if it has the following marks: The church engages in the pure preaching of the gospel; it makes use of the pure administration of the sacraments as Christ instituted them; it practices church discipline for correcting faults.

themselves "the church."

In short, it governs itself according to the pure Word of God, rejecting all things contrary to it and holding Jesus Christ as the only Head. By these marks one can be assured of recognizing the true church— and no one ought to be separated from it.

covenant made with Abraham. We do baptize adult converts who have never been baptized. Generally, we sprinkle because the priests sprinkled the blood of sacrifices for the atonement of the sins of God's people.

#### 3. Practices church discipline

Many of you remember examples of congregational discipline from your youth that seemed severe. They may have caused you to leave that denomination as an adult. However, we are facing problems in the RCA that could have been solved with a church government that could lovingly discipline congregations and classis that have strayed from the truth of scripture. Church discipline is not only for the individual but for the congregation and classis in the full Presbyterian form of church government.

Like the church before us we need to *govern ourselves according to the pure Word* of God and reject anything contrary to it. Jesus Christ is our head, we must not be separated from Him or his Bride.





Hello First Reformed Church,

I heard something the other day when I was talking to a parent of a high school upper classman that really made me think, "Huh, I wonder what would happen if we all had this mentality." I was talking about prom with this parent



and they told me that they were going to still have their children attend Sunday morning worship, even though their kids got home around 5:00am that morning. I asked about this and they gave me just a simple response, "If they could be out all night for prom, they can come to church the next morning," It hit me like a freight train at first, because at first glance it seemed like a harsh punishment. However, I had time to think it over and then I realized something else, this is NOT the current state of our mindset with church and heavenly things.
