

- MMSA to approve Josh Lucas coming under care of Consistory while he finishes his M.Div degree.
- MMSA to revert back to the traditional phasing of the Apostle's Creed by replacing Holy Christian Church with Holy Catholic Church.**

**The reason the consistory has decided to return to the original wording is basically threefold. 1) The word catholic best expresses what we are saying when we are talking about the universal body of Christ that is the church. It derives from the Greek word kathlikos meaning "universal" and from the adverbial phrase kath' holou meaning "on the whole".

DISCERNMENT UPDATE

An update on the work that Consistory, and others, are doing as Sibley FRC faces the challenges surrounding our membership in the RCA. This is a big decision so the Consistory planned a 40-Week Discernment process that would be finished in time for the fall congregational meeting.

Two teams were commissioned to help with the research needed to make an informed decision. The RCA Research Team, led by Ken Loerts, is investigating the strengths and weakness of the RCA. Their assignment is to make a recommendation to Consistory about why we should stay, or why we should leave. The Denominational Selection Team, led by Kevin Klassen, is investigating what denominations we should consider joining if we decide to leave.

Both groups have met over the past two months and are reporting back to the Consistory each month on the progress being made. The goal is to be ready in the late summer, or early fall, to have recommendations for the Consistory to consider. The ultimate goal is to be ready to present to the congregation at the fall meeting the outcomes of this work.

The Consistory and the work groups need your prayers and your patience as they work through this challenge.

Justice God's Way

This week while reading some passages in Isaiah I was struck by chapter 58. Please read it out loud at some point this week. Could it be that this is God's word to us today?

The words are directed against a group described as self-righteous and meticulous in their religious observances. The group's members engage in theological study, they say they desire to get closer to God, they even fast. According to the prophetic voice of the passage it is all a sham. They exhibit hypocritical acts that fail to meet the test of true worship.

...as if they were a nation that practiced righteousness and did not forsake the ordinance of their God; (vs. 2)

The problem is not that these people are unreligious, that would be easy to condemn. The problem is that they are hyper-correct in their religious observance, they exhibit their piety for all to see, but in their exercise of religion they miss the essential point, God's order of compassionate justice. God's word spoken through the prophet indicts this group for their rebellion and their sins.

...Look, you serve your own interest on your fast day, and oppress all your workers. (vs. 3)

These religionists have memorized all the conventional forms of religion. They bow their heads. They lie in sackcloth and ashes. They fast. God remains unimpressed.

Will you call this a fast, a day acceptable to the LORD? (vs. 5)

The severity of the prophetic attack upon self-serving, dehumanizing religion is marked by the wonderful fast that is acceptable to God.

Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke? Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them, and not to hide yourself from your own kin? (vss. 6-7)

In this community, those who regarded themselves as the most religious had converted religion into a private thing, leaving social relationships and commerce under the rule of ruthless self-serving exploitation. Isaiah reaffirms the understanding that God does not desire ritualistic religion but a heart that breaks for others who experience injustice.

Prayer: O Sovereign Lord may our acts of worship be authentic. Forgive us for pursuing our own interests and trampling the Sabbath. Help us to take delight in you. Through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.

A TIME TO STUDY & REFLECT



I hope that you have taken the time to attend Pastor Troy's classes on the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds. It is good to study what we believe and why we believe it. It is essential to everyone at Sibley FRC because we are trying to decide if we should continue to remain members of the RCA or if we leave where we should go. Both teams established by the Consistory are looking at the confessional standards of our denomination, and the others are open to us.

Whatever denominations and confessions we consider, we have to have a way to decide if they are valid or not. The Reformed tradition has always been to stand with scripture's clear teachings first and consider other influences afterward. Do you remember what Martin Luther said to the Diet of Worms when asked to recant his writings?

"My conscience is captive to the Word of God. Thus I cannot and will not recant, because acting against one's conscience is neither safe nor sound. Here I stand; I can do no other. God help me."

During the Reformation, the doctrine of *Sola Scriptura* was a significant reason for the separation from the Roman Catholic church. The Catholic church (then and now) think other sources of knowledge are equal to, and maybe superior to, the Bible.

We may not have a Pope to listen to, but plenty of other voices tell us we don't have to believe what the Bible says. Over the past two years, I have written about many of them, so let me quickly recap the list.

- The Five Horsemen of Atheism: Freud, Marx, Nietzsche, Darwin, Schleiermacher
- Liberal and Neo-Orthodox theologians inside the church who begin their theology with a doctrine that does not include classic inerrancy and infallibility of scripture.
- Cultural Leaders Celebrities, politicians, social influencers, and other religions.
- Satan (and ourselves) when we say or act out, "Did God actually say?"

I know I sound like a broken record; by that, I mean an old vinyl LP. But what we believe about the Bible is ESSENTIAL. If the Bible is God's inerrant and infallible word, then everything in it is to be believed – including the resurrection of Jesus from the dead and his atonement for sin. But, if we say it is only *'sorta' true*, then we can throw out what we do not want. Then it is no problem for us to go our own way when someone says, *"Did God actually say?"*

THEOLOGY 101

INERRANCY AND INFALLIBILITY OF SCRIPTURE

We are taught that our Bible is 'inerrant' and 'infallible'. However, this doctrine is under attack both inside and outside the church. According to the State of Theology 2022 findings, adults are more and more rejecting the divine origin of the Bible. This survey has been conducted every two years since 2014. When asked to respond to this statement *"The Bible, like all sacred writings, contains helpful accounts of ancient myths but is not literally true."* in 2014 41% of adults agreed with the statement, while in 2022 the number grew to 53%. <u>https://thestateoftheology.com</u>

But, according to the Reformed Confessions, the Word of God was given to us by the Holy Spirit—the third person of the Trinity— and is without error. Go read Article 7 of the Belgic Confession. It begins with *"We believe that those Holly Scriptures fully contain the will of God, and that whatsoever man ought to believe unto salvation is sufficiently taught therin."* The confessions depend on scripture for their doctrines. Here are four of the many verses that teach the origin and infallibility of scripture.

- *"All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness," 2 Timothy 3:16*
- "And we have the prophetic word more fully confirmed, to which you will do well to pay attention as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts, knowing this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture comes from someone's own interpretation. For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit." Peter 1:19–21
- "Every word of God is pure; He is a shield to those who take refuge in Him." Proverbs 30:5
- "so faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ." Romans 10:17



Hello First Reformed Church,

By the time this is posted we have finished our year, but there is something that I wanted to share with all of you. This past year we did a couple of different things in youth group. On Wednesday night in Middle School, we went through the book "The Pil-



grim's Progress." We did this with the thought and hope that at the end of the year we would show the movie that was made based off of the movie. If you don't know anything about The Pilgrim's Progress let me give you some background on the book. It's an allegory that was written by Pastor John Bunyan in the 1600s while he was imprisoned for his faith. Back in that time, the King of England required pastors to get a certain license that would ensure that pastors would only preach messages that the King approved of. As you can imagine, the King only wanted messages to be preached that did not preach the gospel but only benefited himself, but John refused and went to prison for it. While he was there, he wrote The Pilgrim's Progress for his children to have and they could discuss it during visits. As soon as it was published it became the second most inspirational book next to the Bible ever written. What is it about this story that captivated so many people for hundreds of years? Well take a stroll with me and you will find out.

The Pilgrim's Progress centers around Christian Pilgrim who lives in the City of Destruction with his wife and children. There everyone essentially does the same thing, they work, they exist, and then they die. The only thing is, there is no happiness in the City of Destruction and no real hope for anything else, until one day Christian discovers a book written by the King of the Celestial City. In this book it talks about how all pilgrims are born in the City of Destruction, but through the grace of the King he has made a way for pilgrims to come out of the City and go and live in the Celestial City forever. This causes a huge burden, that only Christian can see and feel, to grow on his back. Every passing day it grows bigger and bigger. Finally, he has had enough and makes the difficult decision to leave the City and head toward the Celestial City. He tries to bring his family, but they refuse, and he makes the most difficult decision yet and leaves his family to go to the Celestial City. On his journey he meets all kinds of different characters who either help him on his journey or distract him away from his journey. If you couldn't tell by now John Bunyan wrote Christian Pilgrim as an example of regular everyday Christians on their journey to the Celestial City, Heaven.

This study has been so important to the kids to see how vital it is for us to take our faith seriously and to be mindful of the things we do and the people we allow to be our influences. If you have not, I encourage you to go and find a copy to read for yourself and maybe even try to locate one that has a study guide to go along with it. Everything that John Bunyan has written also comes directly from scripture, with a couple of things that he interprets differently than others do, but overall it is a great depiction of what it is like to be a Christian on the walk of life in faith in Jesus Christ. The movie that was made has been donated to the church library and is available for anyone to rent, it is suggested to watch it with 7 years and above. All of us feel like pilgrims in this dark and crazy world, but we have to remember to stay on the path and know that the King is always with us and will never fail us.



couldn't bring himself to fire a gun, which had deadly consequences for his best friend. Crushed beneath a load of guilt Linc is working at Melrose Estate as an interpretive ranger. But as danger closes in on Ainsley during her murder investigation, Linc will have to find the courage to protect her. The only question is, will it be too little, too late."



Launching Your Graduate: Three Biblical Life Lessons

I remember fondly that hot June day when I received my high school diploma in the school gym. My parents and grandparents beamed from ear to ear.

That was 53 Junes ago (1965) and the times were much different. For me, it was a mixture of excitement and total terror. The next chapter in my life was unknown. College was a strange new word in my family.

With time come the gifts of wisdom and perspective about life, and I realize now there was something missing in our home. God was not in any of the discussions about the future—not before, during, or after graduation. Yes, my parents both attended church most of the time and we grew up in Sunday school, but church was for Sunday and the rest of the week was for work and work alone.

I wish my father had taken to heart the sermons he heard on Sundays and shared some of those insights about life with me. I realize now you can't share something you don't understand or have not experienced. There are many lessons I wish my father had taught me about God's abundant life—lessons that would have given me a greater sense of confidence as I headed off to college.

After a lifetime of varied work experience, God has led me to a calling today in which I advise high school and college graduates, as well as older adults, about finding their purpose in their careers and callings.* Out of my own experience and what I have learned from meeting with hundreds of individuals, I have discovered three important things graduates should keep in mind during this season of celebration.

1. God Never Wastes Our Time

In both the Old and New Testaments, God made us a promise that he does not waste time. In the Book of Jeremiah, he made this promise to the nation of Israel as they were held captive in Babylon, "I know what I am doing, I have it all planned out – plans to take care of you, not abandon you, plans to give you a future you hoped for (Jer. 29:11, The Message). Again, in Romans, Paul reiterates God's promise: "That's why we can be so sure that every detail in our lives of love for God is worked into something good (Rom. 8:28, MSG)."

These verses are two incredible promises around which a family can build a foundation of faith that will give your grad encouragement when they become a bit hesitant about their next step. God wants us to flourish in our faith and be confident in his promises.

2. God Means for You to Be Where You Are

Although not an easy topic to discuss or thing to experience, God wants us to understand how to deal with tough times. In one of my favorite books, *The Red Sea Rules*, Robert Morgan reminds us that we can learn a great deal from the nation of Israel trapped at the Red Sea.

Even in difficult times, God has much to teach us about faith and trust. Morgan's first rule took me some time to ponder and accept, "Realize that God means for you to be where you are." Yes, that's right, God intended for the Israelites to be trapped at the Red Sea; it was all part of his plan.

Encourage your grad that even when they feel overwhelmed or unsure of their direction, they can trust that God has them exactly where they are for a reason. They should keep their eyes on God and remember that worry and fear cannot live in the same space with hope and action. When we stand on faith and take positive action, we evict worry and fear. In the words of Charles H. Spurgeon, "The Lord will make a way for you where no foot has been before. That which, like a sea, threatens to drown you, shall be a highway for your escape."

3. "Stand Still" and Wait on God's Timing

Today, many of us want everything to happen now, but that is not always God's plan. Robert Morgan understands timing and states this rule, "Stay calm and confident, and give God time to work."

In the Book of Exodus, Moses boldly proclaimed to the Israelites, "Fear not, stand still (firm and confident), and see the salvation of the Lord which He will work for you today. For the Egyptians you have seen today you shall never see again. The Lord will fight for you and you shall hold your peace and remain at rest" (Ex. 14:13 -14, Amplified Bible).

This is what the biblical phrase "wait on the Lord" is all about: committing our own Red Sea situations to him in prayer, trusting him, and waiting for him to work.

C. H. Mackintosh summed up faith this way: "Faith raises the soul above the difficulty, straight to God Himself, and enables one to stand still. We gain nothing by our restless and anxious efforts...It is therefore true wisdom, in all times of difficulty and perplexity, to stand still – to wait only upon God, and He will assuredly open a way for us." Understanding God's true wisdom and learning to trust him, no matter what, is the greatest lesson your new grad can learn in this graduation season.

Do not leave God out of your conversations; welcome him into your discussions. He will bless your family for putting him first.


