Bible Study Verse

Micah 7:19



He will again have compassion on us, and will subdue our iniquities. You will cast all our sins into the depths of the sea. (NKJV)

Thoughts

Like many of you, I've had some humorous things happen to me in the outdoors. I remember growing up in Ohio and fishing the Great Lake Erie. On one particular night, I made a cast that seemed to go out forever. Finally, my friend and I heard a faint splat. He turned to me and exclaimed, "I think you just hit Canada!"

We joked about me having to get a Canadian fishing license and other nonsense. It was indeed a long cast but in reality the line was only out a little ways. Night fishing, however, provides an open season to the imagination.

Action Point

It's no joke what God will do with our sin. When we confess it, He is faithful and just to forgive it and to clean us up. Read I John 1:9. He takes away our sin for good and forever. God helps us understand this in ways we can relate to:

- He casts our sins into the depths of the sea. Or, as the psalmist sings, He removes our sins as far as the east is from the west, Psalm 103:12.
- When Jesus was nailed to the Cross, He canceled the debt of sin we owe, Colossians2:14.

Jesus paid it all! If you have not done so already, confess to Him that you are a sinner and confess that Jesus is Lord. There's beauty in the Blood regardless of the curse of the Cross. That, my friend, is a wonderful view of salvation from this side of the depths of the sea.

Sportsmen's Tip of the Day

When bottom fishing in deep water, place your sinker on a leader that is long enough to allow the baited hook to be suspended several inches. This will:


- Minimize snags;
- Present the bait in a more suitable feeding zone for most game fish.
- Reduce the chances of losing bait to bottom-feeding scavengers.

Followers of The Way

Congratulations to all of our recent graduates and their families. I enjoy watching all of the preparations and attending the parties. What I don't enjoy as much are most of the commencement speeches. After attending three graduations a year in full academic regalia, I got tired of listening to the same tired themes and phrases. *Live your dream! Believe in yourself! You can be anything you want to be!*

I follow the online chatter every year about good and bad, or at least controversial, commencement speeches. This year, the two most talked about were those given by Jerry Seinfeld and Harrison Butker. My all-time favorite is the one delivered by Dr. Peter Kreeft in 2022 to the graduates of Franciscan University. It is called *"The 10 Lies of Contemporary Culture";* you can see it on YouTube. <u>https://youtu.be/K7FtUInIXd0?si=L-RRwWup4SRm9BaM</u>

Why bring this up? Because commencement is a time of beginning. Graduates are usually relieved to be 'done,' but they are just getting started on the rest of their lives. Similarly, at Sibley FRC, we are also at a point of commencement—a time of beginning. We are making crucial decisions about our future as a congregation and preparing for the ministry of a new pastor. It is just one month until Brian Carpenter and his family will be with us. *Are you ready for this commencement time?*

Paul's great conversion is recorded in Acts 9. The history begins with verses 1 & 2, "But Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest and asked him for letters to the synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any belonging to the Way, men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem."

Did you notice what the believers were called before being named Christians? We were known as followers of "**The Way**." This title was used because the Apostles shared what they learned in the upper room: "Jesus said to him, "*I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me*." We, too, are followers of this Way, and I want to focus on two words to help us think through our own Christian lives.

First, consider what it means to follow a 'way'. Way is defined as *a road, a path, a direction, or a method or style of doing something*. Jesus wants us to choose His path, His style, and His ways of doing everything we do.

Next, I want to think about the word 'the'. This word is a *definite article* pointing to a single thing. The article 'an' means there is more than one, but 'the' means only one. Jesus is the only way, the only truth, not one that is equal to any other idea.

We live in an age that idolizes 'choice'. Not only do we have many options, but we are called on to make choices to determine what is true or real. In the past few years, we have taken the old cliché

"you can be anything you want to be" to absurdity. It isn't that you can choose to be president if you want to; it means you can choose to deny reality—and yet call it the truth.

Christ called us to a life that is radically different from the lives of those who are lost. Our culture used to be a better place for Christians to live—now it is not. And yet, our culture speaks louder to us than ever in the church's history. Because we listen to media, to cultural influencers, to the pressure of our peers, to the demands of our children, to whatever we listen to – instead of listening to Jesus, we are in trouble. We must follow **The** Way, because it is **The** Truth, and **The** life, and apart from Him we will be lost to the evil one for all eternity.

 We need to choose the future of our congregation's association with a denomination based on what would be the best **Way** to follow Jesus. We need to think not only about individual desires, but to consider the needs of those we serve now, and those who will come after us.

2. We also need to prepare to get to work when our new pastor arrives. He is not coming to do all the work of our congregation, but to help us get to work and serve. We are the church that Saul went to persecute, before dying as Paul in that persecution. Is there anything about us that would lead to persecution? If not, maybe we need to examine ourselves.

Over the next few weeks, I hope we each examine our lives to ensure we are following our savior. Wherever we find failings, confess them to Him because he is faithful to forgive. He will work with us to conform our lives to become like Him. He is the Way, Truth, and Life.

Even though it is summer, let's work to make sure we continue to practice the 'ordinary means of grace'. We need to study the Word, pray, share in the sacraments of baptism and the Lord's supper, and if necessary, share in the church's discipline and care of souls. We live *Coram Deo!*

"But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings as eagles, they shall run and not be weary, and they shall walk and not faint." Isaiah 40:31



Hello First Reformed Church,

Have you recently been wondering where is God in my trial? Where is God in my hurting? Where was God when I prayed for healing or something and it did not happen?



I had a lot of my family say this very thing when both of my grandparents passed away within a week of each other. This was truly a tragedy within my family. My grandparents were very involved in all our lives, as grandchildren and even their great grandchildren. I told Hannah when we first started having kids that I have such a high expectation of grandparents because of what my grandpa and Mimi (that is what we called my grandma) did when we were kids. When I heard the news about my grandpa passing, I cried a lot. I came home and just wept with Hannah. A few days later I got the call that my Mimi had also passed, and I lost it in my office. I had to go home once again to tell Hannah and the girls about it. I got into my car and before I started the car I just prayed, "God where are you in this? I prayed for healing for them, and you did not do it. Where are you in this?" I turned on the car as tears are streaming down my face and I am shaking in frustration. As I start to drive home, the song on the radio began with these words, "Where is God in the heartache? Where is God in the fear? Where is God in the sickness that the prayer didn't fix? When it don't make sense, where is God in all of this?" I was sitting in the car going, "Yes, right there! Preach it, this is what I am currently feeling!" The song continued to serve me a piece of humble pie, "He is right here where He's always been. He never left and He never will. Where is God? God is with us." It was in that moment that I realized that I was doubting God, and I was trying to tell God how to be God. I was asking where the omnipresent God was in this moment of life. When He was there the whole time.

We live in a fallen world brothers and sisters. What this means is that all of us, as human Beings, are a part of this world and must deal with sickness, disease, pain, suffering, and death. Death can come to us at any time, but the hope we have is that God is working through all of it.
