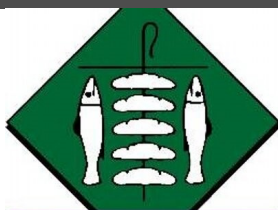

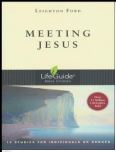

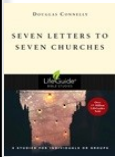

WHY? WHY NOT?



Have you ever thought about what you are saying when you ask why or why not? Generally, we are looking for reasons to do, or not to do something. It's easy to ask, *"should we go to the movie tonight?"* But it is very different to ask, *"Should I get married? Change jobs? Buy a new house?"* Those are BIG questions and they can be difficult.

As a congregation we are asking **big questions**, ones with eternal consequences. We are facing the decision to leave, or to stay with the RCA. It's hard! Our denomination has been in continuous existence longer than any

other denomination in America. The RCA was founded in 1628 as a branch of the Dutch Reformed Church. In 1819 we separated from the old country, and continued as an American church.

Throughout nearly 400 years the RCA has continued, but not without controversy. In 1856 the CRC separated and more churches joined them in 1882. Recently, more than 100 churches have joined the Alliance of Reformed Churches (ARC) and Kingdom Network, although other congregations have joined the Presbyterian Church in America (PCA). More churches are in the position that we are, deciding to stay or to go. And, if we decide to go, we have to decide where we are going.

But what are good reasons to stay or to go? I love the conversations, and the questions that are being asked—and answered. We need to decide in the light of what pleases God, rather than doing what a family member or friend says we should. *As my mama used to ask, "If your brother jumps off a bridge are you going to follow?"*

Here are some of the questions that the Discernment Teams are asking. Maybe they will help you think this decision through carefully. *And in all things, "pray without ceasing."*

- 1. Does the denomination make decisions based on the word, or on societies views?** Historically, denominations that start to ask "Did God really say...." are ones that begin to wander from the truth and become liberal. *Our discussions and study indicate that we want to remain faithful to the inerrant word of God.*
- 2. What does the denomination believe? Are we in agreement?** I think we have generally come to consensus in the past few months that the RCA statements of doctrine and faith are true and we uphold them. *While we may not read them, we did decide this is what we believe.*
- 3. Does the denomination practice what it preaches, are they consistent?** These could be questions of doctrine and practice, or mission and practice. For example, the RCA upholds marriage between a man and a woman. Is that what we practice? Or, if a denomination claims to be mission focused, are they? Do they have a robust mission program?
- 4. How does the denomination support teaching the congregation and providing for spiritual care?** Do they have colleges, seminaries, publishing divisions, conferences? How does the denomination interact with individual congregations?

WHY? OR WHY NOT? CONTINUED

5. **What about church government and ministry standards?** These are the questions of church government and the requirements of ordained pastors. The RCA is a form of the *presbyterian* form of government, and generally requires an ordained pastor to have an MDiv, and to undergo examination before ordination. The pastor is a member of the classis, rather than the congregation.
6. **What does the denomination believe? Are we in agreement?** I think we have generally come to consensus in the past few months that the RCA statements of doctrine and faith are true and we uphold them. We aren't just Dutch, we are reformed in our thinking—descendants of Geneva and John Calvin. *While we may not read them, we did decide this is what we believe.*
7. **What are the processes we will need to follow?** If we leave, the RCA has requirements for us to leave peaceably and any denomination we join has a process.

SUMMER READING



I love to read and I love to learn, especially about God and His ways of looking at the world. Summer reading is the best, and have even done it while fishing! *That could explain why I finish more books than I get fish into the boat!*

To help you learn more about reformed theology and how we ought to be looking at life, a collection of small books has been donated for you to take and read. There are 39 titles to choose from, and there is probably one for you. *Maybe there is one that asks the question you haven't dared to ask before.*

The books are located on a table outside the sanctuary. Please take one each—for every member of your family who is interested. Then wait a few weeks to take your second book. That way we can make sure everyone gets at least one book.

There will also be printed copies of the various reformed catechisms and confessions. Take those and grow in your knowledge of the God we love. *Let's spend the summer reading and learning!*

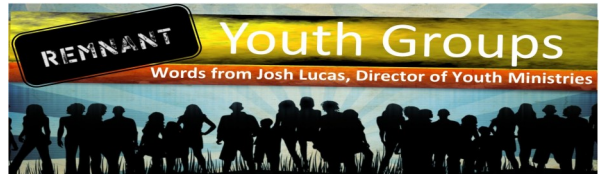

Hello First Reformed Church,

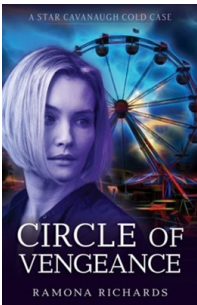

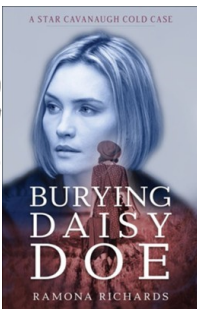

But becoming the target of the determined killer isn't the way Star wants to find the answers. Now it's a race to solve the case before it becomes a matter of her life or death."

"Every small town has one unsolved case that haunts its memory, festering for generations below the surface with the truth of humanity's darkness. Can Christians so focused on the good really help her track down this evil?"

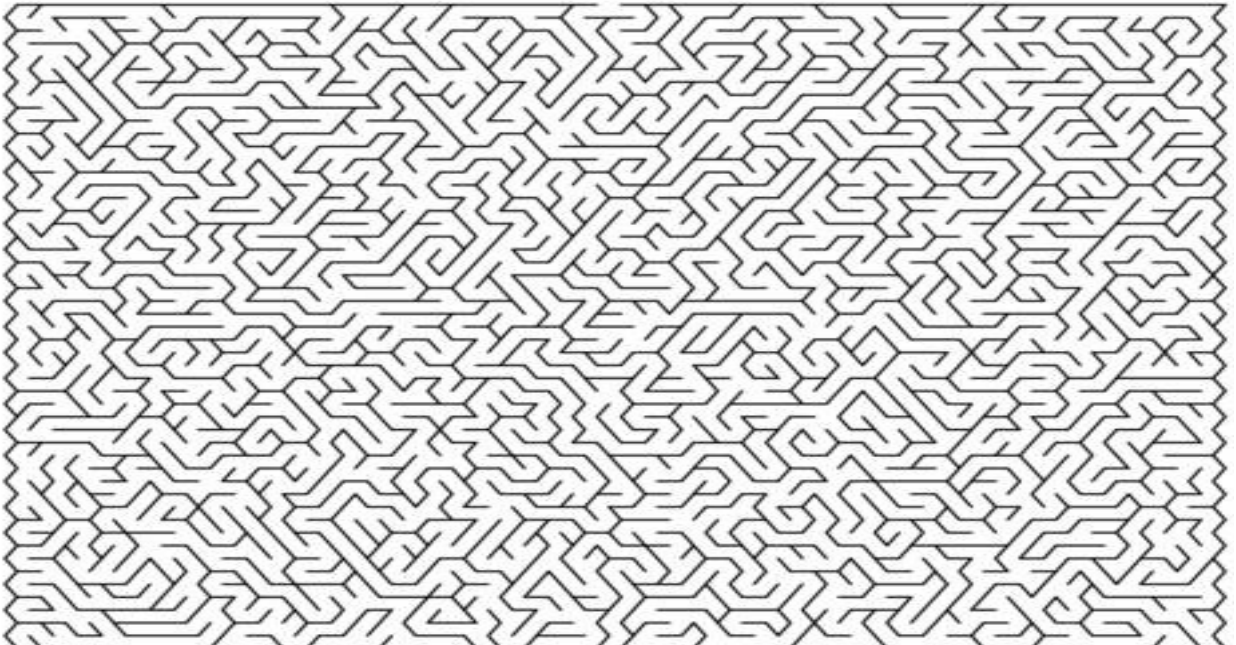

Bible Study Verse

Thoughts

Have you ever run a marathon, or a 10,000 meter race? There is a tendency among many to give up . . . to quit. There often comes a point when you are exhausted; every part of your body is aching; you are having trouble getting breath; you are thirsty, and you want to quit. Your body tells you that you can't take the next step - so quit; give up.

But, if you take the next step, if you continue, then you "catch your second wind" and wonder why you even had thoughts of quitting, of giving up, especially when you see the finish line and the crowd cheering. WOW! That takes me back to my younger days.

Action Point

The same principle can be found in spiritual matters. You start the race, then get knocked down. You get up, and the devil attacks you by trying to convince you that this "so-called Christian life" is not worth staying in the race. You want to quit; you want to give up. Listening to his voice, you almost quit, almost give up.

But then, the Holy Spirit comes to give you the second wind, the second opportunity, the second chance. You move on toward victory; you begin to see the finish line, the cheering crowd of fellow believers, and Jesus standing ready to crown you with the words, "His lord said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant; you have been faithful over a few things, I will make you ruler over many things. Enter into the joy of your lord,'" Matthew 15:21 (NKJV). WOW!!!!!!!!!!!!!!

Sportsmen's Tip of the Day

When searching for pheasants or other upland birds, ask yourself two questions: Where's the cover? Where's the food? The area between food and cover (called the edge) is a good place to start when surveying a field for birds. Don't concentrate on where you've known birds to be in the past. Be flexible and patient in your search. Last, but not least, pay attention to the cues from your bird dog.
