







Dear First Reformed Church,

Your Devil Crushing Ninja Trainer (Youth Director for short) here to give you another newsletter to hopefully encourage and inform you. We ended the school year well, even though it was a very interesting year with a lot



of ups and downs. When I had returned in February, I was trying to plan events for the summer, but I think that everyone all around the nation was also wanting to do things too. We were planning on visiting the Ark Encounter again with our Middle School students and doing a summer mission trip with our High School students. However, there were no buses available for a reasonable price, and all the jobsites that Samaritan's Purse was offering were all waitlisted. This just proved two things. First, we need to plan these things essentially one year out. Second, that Samaritan's Purse is really an "in-demand" organization. I told our students that it should reveal just how good they are if everyone in the nation wants to go and work with them. On that note, I highly encourage you that if you have never been on a mission or work trip with Samaritan's Purse, to do so. There is always something for everyone to do, no matter what age or health.

I hope that you were all blessed by yesterday's sermon. The final point of that sermon is something that I would like to elaborate on right now. That point being, that even if you feel that God is not moving in your life or feel like you are being taken on this winding road by God, He is working and He is making your path's straight. I remember last year around October, I met with a former student of mine (I will refer to this student as "they" not because of a gender thing but trying to protect their privacy), and they were really struggling with some things that were going on in their life. They were explaining to me that they were feeling depressed. I explained to them, "At some point in your life you are going to stop for a moment and think where you are and think back to where you were and what you went through to get there." As soon as you do that it will essentially click in your mind, "That is why that happened, if it didn't then I wouldn't have ended up here." I think back during situations like that to Habakkuk when God explained to him, "I am doing a work that you would not believe if told." Of course, I paraphrased but the context is still the same. God said that because to us, as human beings who cannot see the future, if we are told what the future holds we would doubt because we need to know, "How is that going to happen?" For example, if I was told before I met Hannah or even before I moved to Arizona to attend college that I was going to move to Iowa to be a youth director and to do all these great things with this great church, I would not believe it. However, I kept a journal before I went to college, and I recorded everything that happened in my life. The other day I dug out that journal which had been packed away, and I was just amazed at the journey that God has taken me on. The whole time, even when I felt He was not there working, He was working and was making my paths straight. Believe that He is doing that for you too.

As a youth team, we are putting plans together for Remnant activities on Sunday evenings during the summer months of July and August, so please be on the lookout for those events. Also, remember that if you ever need a hug this big ole teddy bear has one for you! Thank you for reading.



THE BIBLE & THE 5 QUESTIONS

CREATION ~ FALL ~ REDEMPTION ~ RESTORATION



This month we are going to start by quickly reviewing the Biblical answers to the *Five Questions*. Last month I listed questions that all people and worldviews try to answer. Some of us will be tempted to say that "we're ok, we believe in Jesus. Leave us alone, we don't have to learn this." But, as believers in Jesus Christ, and in the truth of the Gospel as expressed in the Bible, we need to be thinking about the world the way that God looks at the world. Christianity's influence over culture in America is dying. We are the last to believe in truth—including

the one who is Truth. So, hopefully I will be able to demonstrate the importance of God's view of the world.

- WHERE DID WE COME FROM? This is the question of origin of both the world and human beings. Beside God being the creator, he also made distinctions in the creation. Human beings are created in His image—we have attributes that make us special and give us meaning. We are not frogs, we have a distinct relationship with the creator that gives us meaning. Schools have assumed that they are going to help students find their meaning, but we can't do that on our own. We have value because it is God himself, who send his Son to sacrifice himself for those created in His image. We have value because he gave it to us. Genesis 1:26-27 Science cannot answer this question at all. Science has no answer to origin or meaning.
- 2. WHY ARE WE HERE? This is the question of purpose or meaning and is tied to the first question. We are here to serve God. No matter what occupation we choose, where we live, how affluent we are (or are not), we are here to glorify God and enjoy Him forever. Our lives have purpose if we follow God's purposes for us. Our work is of value, as is our day of rest and worship. Genesis 1:28-30 *Marx, Nietzsche & Freud each denied any external answer to this question. One result is the explosion of suicide and depression today.*
- 3. WHAT'S GONE WRONG WITH THE WORLD, WHAT EXPLAINS THE EVIL WE SEE AROUND US EVERY DAY? We believe that sin is what's gone wrong with the world. It is the sin of Adam and the sins of all people since Adam. The creation itself is tainted by our sin, and is the source of all the physical evils from earthquakes and forest fires, to the personal issues of sickness, life and death. The Biblical concept of original sin and the fall is the only consistent answer to this question. Genesis 3:14-19 The answers by the 4 Horsemen do not work or explain.
- 4. What can be done about it? By ourselves we can do nothing. Our redemption from sin is in Jesus Christ, but so is the redemption of the creation. Creation, fall, redemption and restoration—that is the story of God's work in the world. If we want to see the world around us transformed, then people must be redeemed. Laws and government are important, but they do not create righteousness. Redeemed people do not live in the same way that the unrighteous do—at least we hope not. Read Romans 1—11 to savor God's plan of redemption, including Romans 8:19-22 where we read that the creation is eagerly waiting for the restoration, and freedom from the effects of sin. Romans 1:18-31 clearly outlines what happens when people deny God. Isn't this what you are seeing on the news every night? All 4 of our horsemen's solutions have failed.
- 5. WHERE DO WE GO WHEN WE DIE? When the Christian dies they go to be with the Lord. Remember the thief on the cross? "today you will be with me in paradise." Luke 23:43. That isn't the end of it, there is a time coming when we will be raised from the dead and live before God in a new heaven and a new earth. This is the final death of sin and death. All will be restored, all will be as God intended in Genesis 1. All four said death leads to nothingness.

On the following page is a short (over-simplification) of the ideas of four influential thinkers—its only a beginning!

THE FOUR HORSEMEN OF ATHEISM

CHARLES DARWIN ~ FREDERIC NIETZSCHE ~ KARL MARX ~ SIGMUND FREUD



1809-1882

We all know the name of **Charles Darwin**. The debates over evolution are significant, but that isn't going to be our point here. Darwin proposed the theory of **natural selection** and the **survival of the fittest** as the answer to the first question. He tried to answer the questions of origin and purpose from a purely **material** viewpoint. Materialism is the idea that atoms (material) are all that exist. Darwin cut science free from God and said that everything came into being from time, space and chance without God. He believed that science would be able to answer all of the real questions of life without God. The result—the modern idea that a frog has the same value as a human being,

or that nature in general is more important than humans. *The answers to life (truth) will come from science, God is not allowed to speak when science is speaking. Save the whales, protect the owls—kill the unborn.*



1818-1883

Karl Marx was an atheist and not interested in anything that religion had to say. He hated Christianity. His work tried to solve the third and fourth questions by applying the new 'rules of science' to history and economics. Marx said the problems in the world resulted when those with power and money treated others unjustly. His solution was to have a series of revolutions in which those who were oppressed would overthrow those in power, establishing a new society. This would happen over and over again until we achieved a balanced world in which no one would have more than anyone else—either power or wealth. We hear his voice in several ways. (1) The gov-

ernment should control production of wealth—they know how to distribute things more fairly. (2) We need to tear down institutions that have power—there isn't any way to fix anything. This is very much the language of the WOKE movement. *Take from others, destroy all—do not forgive or redeem*. **Totalitarianism is a result.**



1844-1900

Frederic Nietzsche was another philosopher that denied the existence of God. He too hated Christianity, calling it 'weak' and 'feminine'. What he said we needed were *Supermen* who could exercise their own views over others. He advocated for **individuals** who would make up their own values, and then impose them on others. He said, "God is dead, and we have killed him." In the 20th century we saw his ideas come to fruition in two ways. First, Hitler loved his works and shared them with both Stalin and Mussolini. Hitler believed his 'superior' race should rule (or destroy) all others. Later thinkers took his individualism and expressed themselves in the existentialists who

said the values were personal and relative. No moral law from God—just your own personal choices, and radical individualism.



1856-1939

Finally we come to **Sigmund Freud**, and the roots of the sexual revolution. Freud is generally understood to be the founder of psychology as a scientific discipline. He gave us terms which are now very familiar to us—ego, id and superego. However, he had other concepts that are really important. First, Freud said that all of our personal issues, concerns, fears etc. were the result of repressions put on us by society, religion, parents and others. His solution was to overthrow these repressions—do what comes 'naturally' to you as an individual. Second, he thought that all of our bad behaviors were the result of things done 'to' us. *It isn't our fault*. We get to blame everyone else—particularly parents, society and religion. Sexual identity is mental, choice, inner and not tied to anything physical. If you "feel" something, it must be so. *All sexual desires and ac*-

tivities are legitimate and should not be repressed.

Have you ever watched the same deer or elk for a few years? Each year, he takes on more and more of the likeness of his father, the old buck or bull.

Dear Friends in Christ,

We greet you in this season of resurrection with the good news that the message of salvation through Jesus Christ continues to be proclaimed here in Japan.

During the past winter, the Omicron variant of COVID-19 brought about the highest rates of infection and death in Japan since the pandemic began over two years ago. The rates have dropped since the

peak in late February but remain relatively high in comparison to the last two years. Nevertheless, there are finally signs that things are beginning to move toward what life was like before the pandemic.

COVID-19 has kept us from traveling to work with congregations in regions outside of Tokyo as we had been doing in the past. However, as it has continued to drag on, the pandemic has created a difficulty for congregations in our district to fill pastoral vacancies, giving us additional work here in Tokyo. Since the spring of last year, Sayuri has been serving as the interim pastor of Shinsakae Church, a congregation that will celebrate its 150th year of ministry next year and was the first church established in the city of Tokyo. Last month, they installed a new senior pastor. At the same time, of the 28 congregations in our district, there are now seven in need of a pastor. We do ask for your prayers for the churches as the two of us continue to work with them in this difficult time.


Abraham's classes that he teaches at Meiji Gakuin were scheduled to return to in-person lectures in April. He was very much looking forward to finally working again with students in the classroom. Meiji Gakuin's student body, just like the general population of Japan, is less than one percent Christian. And the Introduction to Christianity course is such a precious opportunity to be a witness and plant seeds. Unfortunately, the Omicron variant caused the classes to remain online until the fall. There has been a scattering of students for whom this format allows them to feel less inhibited and engage more with Abraham than they would in an in-person setting. So, meaningful evangelism continues to happen. Nevertheless, there is no question that being able to speak face-to-face is much more effective.

We are very much looking forward to the opportunity to soon see many of you face-to-face as well. This has been the longest period we have spent on the field without returning to America. Throughout this time of uncertainty, your continued support of our work has been a great source of encouragement. Our prayers are also with you.

RON RHODES

A couple of non-fiction books have been added to the library. **BI-BLE PROPHECY ANSWER BOOK – Everything you need to know about the end times by Ron Rhodes.** "Strengthen your faith and find real hope for the future in this extensive resource that provided concise answers to your most burning questions about Bible prophecy and the end times. Topics include everything from how to interpret prophecy to clarifying the perplexing specifics of the rapture, the antichrist and the afterlife. Questions addressed are: (1) Is it important that we be aware of

the signs of the times? (2) Do Christians agree about the role of America in Bible prophecy? (3) Is there biblical evidence that the church will escape the tribulation period? (4) Will only believers enter into Christ's millennial kingdom? (5) In what way will the heavens and earth be made "new"?"

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN WE DIE? by David Jeremiah is the second book. Where do we go? Is there an afterlife? Does the Bible say anything specific about heaven? Are there really streets of gold there? Pearly gates? Has anyone been to heaven and returned with insider information? This book will answer those questions and tell you what's up with heaven. God wants you to know all about your eternal homes so you can anticipate the future.



A fiction book this month is **DON'T KEEP SILENT by Elizabeth Goddard** and book #3 in the "Uncommon Justice" series. Investigative reporter Rae Burke will do anything to find her missing sister-in-law, even if it means facing Liam McKade, a man who almost lost his life saving hers. A former DEA agent, Liam thought he could find peace at his Wyoming ranch, but he doesn't feel at home anywhere anymore. When the reporter who blew his cover on an important investigation inserts herself back into his life, he's less than thrilled. But Rae's keen investigative skills have led

her down the right path—and directly into the dragon's mouth—leaving Liam no choice but to protect her. As the danger increases, the past they both tried to flee catches up to them, along with the feelings they once had for each other.

There are many books to choose from in the church library, such as six fiction books recently obtained and written by Lois Henderson on various women of the Bible, both Old and New Testament, those written in story form are: **HAGAR, RUTH, MIRI-AM, ABIGAIL, LYDIA, PRISCILLA AND AQUILA.** Just an added note: The copyrights on these books are quite old and none of them was bought new at this time. They were obtained from used books collections. Some books are hardcover with the jackets still on, some are paperback. So don't look at the condition of the book but the story it contains that is timeless.
