

The Bible refers to Christians as "children of light" (1 Thess 5:5). As we continue to paint a composite portrait of the children of light we need to look at the will/spirit/heart. Our heart (or will, or spirit) is the part of us that originates things. It seeks to bring things into being in the world. From the heart flow "the issues of life." (Prov. 4:23) What is the heart of the child of light like?

The children of light are sincerely devoted to doing what is good and right. They are habitually oriented towards it, just as their minds are constantly homing in on God and their feelings are habitually oriented towards love. They are attentive to rightness, to kindness, to helpfulness. They are purposeful in seeking knowledge about life- that is, what people need, and how to do what is right in appropriate ways. They don't run over others in an attempt to "help" them. They don't fawn over others to excess. They offer the best help they know how to offer, but if the offer is not accepted, they are not offended. They respect the rights and responsibilities of others. They also recognize that often love cannot be considered one-dimensionally, as though the only germane issue is with one person. Sometimes what one person wants is not good for others, and that needs to be taken into account when making decisions or offering help. The children of light try to be wise and balanced when faced with that sort of situation.

These are people who don't think first about themselves and what they want, and they really care very little, if at all, about getting their own way. "Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others." (Phil 2:3-4) These are good and easy words to the child of light. This is because they have abandoned themselves to God's will and are entrusting the outcomes of their life to God. They don't have to struggle or deliberate about whether they will do what they know to be wrong. They do not hesitate to do what they know to be right, because it's the obvious thing to do. Because of their confidence in God they do not try to manipulate and manage other people.

Relationships in the world are marked by two things: Attack and withdrawl. And we can mix those two things up in perversely creative ways. We can attack by withdrawing (the cold shoulder, pulling away from another for the purpose of wounding them out of a sense of revenge.) and we can withdraw in order to get more space for a covert or unexpected attack. The children of light don't do this. They don't ever go on the attack or intend to use or hurt others. They don't withdraw from a relationship when there is trouble. Rather, they stand still in love. Morever, the children of light are completely noncondemning, while at the same time they will not participate in evil. They pay only the attention to evil that is absolutely required by a circumstance in any social setting, beyond that, they make patient and joyful nonparticipation the rule. Like Jesus, they know how to really be present without sharing in evil. Other people may disapprove of their presence, just as they did with Jesus, but the children of light aren't


concerned. Of course, there are some occasions where we should just step away, but in doing so the children of light are not trying to distance themselves from the people who may be involved in the situation or end the relationship. They are only seeking to prudently step back from a situation that could result in harm. They really understand how to "love the sinner and hate the sin" in a graceful, effective way.

This past week while I was in California I attended a lecture by Dr Steve Porter, a professor of spiritual formation at Westmont College. He had a wonderful quote from Bernard of Clairvaux, who was one of Calvin's favorite medieval writers. Bernard said that we should be more like a reservoir than a ditch. A ditch empties as fast as it fills. A reservoir holds what is put into it until it is full, then the overflow flows out without any loss to itself. Once the reservoir is full, it costs it nothing to pour out the excess. We should think of the Christian life like that. It is perhaps most important to understand that all these things we've been talking about for the last four months aren't something that the child of light strains to produce, constantly gritting their teeth and carrying on as a ditch. Rather, these things naturally and effortlessly flow out of them because they have taken on the character and mind of Christ. They are full and overflow, sending forth streams of living water with no loss to themselves. Our job, as reservoirs of the Spirit is to continually seek fullness of the Spirit. When we do, we will find that living waters flow from our being to a thirsty world. (John 7:38)

Dear friends,

First of all, thank you so much for all the support you continue to give to our ministry with cards, money, and prayers.

We are overwhelmed with all kinds of challenges, but we are still going ahead with the ministry, trusting in this Bible promise found in Deuteronomy 31: 8 "I WILL NEVER LEAVE YOU NOR FORSAKE YOU."

The children of the two neighborhoods are fed, the pastors and midwives are trained, and the sick are visited in their communities.

Recently, we had the first medical brigade of 2025 and we were able to share the gospel and offer our clinic. We always seek to put God first before attending to the sick. First, we invite the people to a 30-minute devotional where we thank God for the trip, pray for those who will visit with the doctors, sing worship songs with them, share a short meditation, and send them to the medical doctors.





Our river trips with the doctors are made possible with a 200HP outboard engine donated to us by our late friend Amy Dekruyter and her family, and we are still so thankful to them. May the Lord Almighty continue to bless them. Revelation 14:13 says: "blessed are those who die in the Lord... for their deeds will follow them."

Our friends from Westwood Church in Omaha, Nebraska, also gave us some mosquito nets to shield

us from mosquito bites, and so far, they continue to protect us from these unfriendly insects in the small villages. There are many more helpful things given to us by different people that we cherish, and we are deeply thankful to all of them. We pray that the Lord continues to bless them and their whole family abundantly now and forevermore. Our Lord Jesus Christ said: "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." Matthew 25:40 NIV



I had a plan to talk about what to do with older children and even children out of the house, but I had a recent experience, and I feel compelled by the Holy Spirit to write this instead. I want to write about the importance of fathers. The week of July 14-18, 2025, I had the privilege of helping Inspiration Hills by being their chaplain during Jour-



ney week. Journey week is a week of camp that is regular camp, but it is for campers that come from a rougher background then most campers do. It is a challenging week for most because there are behavioral issues, dark and painful stories these children have gone through, and other things. The one thing that I noticed in most of these camper's lives that was the same, the absence of a father. Mothers this does not mean you are not important or that you are not valid, because you are, but there needs to be two parents in the home, mother and father. When fathers are absent your family's lives are at risk. Statistics say that children in father-absent homes are at a greater risk of poverty, behavioral problems, going to prison, to commit a crime, to become pregnant as a teen, to face abuse and neglect, to abuse drugs and alcohol, or drop out of school. Now here is the harsh reality, you do not have to not live at home with your children to be an absent father. These stats also reveal that absent fathers are ones that live at home with their children and are still married to their mom. An absent father is one that is not involved in their children's lives. They prioritize work over their children and family life; they come home and just want to watch tv and not play with their children. If you come home and just say a simple hi to your kids but do not engage with them, you can be labeled as an absent father.

What is your calling as a father? Your calling is to protect, provide, and guide. We as fathers need to protect our families from the evils of the world, not shelter, but you can protect without sheltering. We need to provide for our families so that they can have security and be taken care of. Finally, we as fathers are called to guide our families. As the head of the household, it is our job to lead and guide our families (Ephesians 5). Your wife wants to be led, your children want to be led, and your family needs to be led by you the head of the household. Here is the reality of the garden of Eden in Genesis 3 when God cursed the world and said that He was going to curse the ground that Adam and Eve were on, He also said that Eve was going to desire her husband. The term, "desire her husband" means that she will want to be her husband, she will want to be in charge. This is why we have so many issues with the fight for gender "equality", it is following the curse of the world after the fall. Fathers need to lead, and they need to be present. I know that it is difficult for fathers to come home after a long day of work and play with your kids, but fathers we must do it. There will come a day when your kids do not want to play with you anymore, there will be a day when your kids will not be under your roof, and you will miss them, have you prepared them for that day?

The call is simple, fathers when you clock out of your jobs, go home and love your families. Be present in your kid's lives and let them know that you are there. Even if you have older kids and they think you are lame, if you show yourself as being present, they will come to you. It is never too late to be a father to your children. Jesus can redeem and fix any situation, give it to Him and He will fix it. Pray for your children and teach them. In short, as I said before, be present fathers.

Thoughts

It all began in late May on the Yellowstone and Jackson lakes. We had to cast sinking fly line with large streamers long distances to reach the prime drop offs where the Yellowstone cutthroats and lake trout were lurking. It took some practice to be able to reach those distances.

When we were not fishing from a boat, but on the shore of a small mountain lake with trees behind us, we had to use a roll cast. On one mountain lake we ran into a callibaetis hatch right on the shoreline. This required long accurate casts avoiding the over-hanging trees with a delicate presentation. Occasionally, we had to make a side cast to the rising trout. Fishing the creeks and rivers also required a variety of different casts.

Two Sportsmen's Devotional writers came to Wyoming to learn fly fishing. We started them with all the basics and after some practice they experienced some success. The important thing is that we all realized that fly fishing requires learning new skills and continued practice to develop those skills.

Action Point

The same is true of our faith and our relationship with God. Once we are saved and the foundation of our faith is laid, we have a long journey ahead of us. It is God's hope that we "grow in grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ."

No matter how long we've been a Christian, BE HUMBLE:

- We haven't arrived.
- We have a long way to go.

Continue reading and studying God's Word, be in prayer, and be involved in Christian fellowship.


