'I love it,' he stated with the enthusiasm of an eight-year-old having just been presented with a new puppy.

'Mr. Jones, you haven't seen the room; just wait.'

'That doesn't have anything to do with it,' he replied.

'Happiness is something you decide on ahead of time. Whether I like my room or not doesn't depend on how the furniture is arranged ... it's how I arrange my mind.

I already decided to love it. 'It's a decision I make every morning when I wake up. I have a choice; I can spend the day in bed recounting the difficulty I have with the parts of my body that no longer work, or get out of bed and be thankful for the ones that do.'

'Each day is a gift, and as long as my eyes open, I'll focus on the new day and all the happy memories I've stored away. Just for this time in my life.'

'So, my advice to you would be to deposit a lot of happiness in the bank account of memories! Thank you for your part in filling my Memory bank. I am still depositing.' Glorify God in all we do, Grow with Him daily & Go with Him to share His love.

My mother-in-law had a deep-rooted faith as she walked with Jesus Christ. The beauty of who God is comes from the salvation given on the Cross. As we mourned her loss we also celebrated the resurrection of Jesus Christ, because through Christ we are all given hope.

When the doctors told my mother-in-law, she wasn't going to get better, she was excited. I have never seen someone so excited, knowing they were finally going to see Jesus, after they just been told they were going to die. That was followed by a re-

quest for us all to sing the doxology which begins "Praise God from whom all blessings flow..." On Monday morning she was upset when she woke up because she was hoping to be in heaven. On Tuesday she said to the Doctor, "I told Jesus to take the wheel and step on the gas!" Throughout those last days we prayed together, sang, laughed and cried. Each and every one of those moments was filled with the presence of the Holy Spirit.

My mother-in-law's life was a witness to the resurrection. It was a life of hope and a life of love. In Hebrews 12:1-3 we read:

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

To me, she will always be one of those witnesses sent by God. As I have had time to reflect on her beautiful life she truly lived the words of the Apostle Paul when he said in Philippians 1, ²¹ For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain.

How are you living your life right now? Is it for Christ or something else? The life God has given us is short. It flies by quickly, in the twinkling of an eye. We celebrated her life filled with living for Christ. With every breath she took, Christ's presence was there. And when she died Wednesday morning and took her last breath, she gained. I want you to know the same Jesus she knew. There is beauty and joy walking in a relationship with Christ. There is strength and hope. Jesus will be there to help us through the ups and downs of life and in the end it will all be good.

On Wednesday morning we gathered as children around mom's bed to read to her from her devotion booklet that she has read from for so many years. Not more than 15 seconds after we finished, my mother-in-law took her last breath. It was at that moment that her life ended in this world and she began her new life with her heavenly Father whom she finally got to meet. She was finally home.

In that moment her five children stood around her crying outwardly because she was gone but celebrating inwardly because she was in heaven. It was a moment that was truly holy. In that moment I see Jesus embracing her with strong yet loving arms, welcoming her home, and then looking into her eyes and saying, 'Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness!' Matthew 25:21

Life is short, dig deep in your relationship with Christ. There is nothing greater in this world to find than Jesus himself!





Sportsmen's Devotional

Bible Study Verses

Ephesians 2:8-9

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith-and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God- not by works, so that no one can boast. (NIV)

Thoughts

Gifts come in many forms:

The gift of sight, to see the mountains and animals.

The gift of hearing, to hear a bull elk bugle or a goose calling.

The gift of the deer I killed that happened to be where I could see it.

So what is the gift from God?

(A) Grace

(B) Salvation

(C) Faith

(D) All of the above. You answer "D". Yep, you got it.

As the verse reads, the emphasis of the gift focuses on grace and faith. Romans 10:17 says that faith comes from hearing, and hearing from the word of God, the Bible. Therefore, by applying this principle, God gives us the faith to believe in Jesus; therefore, God gives us salvation from our sins; and, therefore, salvation is ours because of God's gift of grace. The overriding principle here is that all three are gifts from God.

God gave us the mountains, the rivers, the sea, the sky, and the animals that we enjoy. We didn't create them. Similarly, we can't "create" or earn our salvation. It comes from God and God alone.

By the way, I've often heard grace defined as "God's riches at Christ's expense." Good definition; but I believe one word should be changed and that the phrase should read, "God's redemption at Christ's expense." Either way, I want it!

Action Point

Unwrap God's presents to you today: faith, salvation, and grace. Accept that they are gifts, and that there is no repayment necessary; just believe in Christ and be saved.

Give a gift to your children or grand children that they can't have any other way--the gift of your time in the outdoors. It's a gift they will never forget!





JJ and Tim Tenclay

I continue to serve as a missionary and Refugee Ministries Coordinator for RCA Global Mission. My family and I returned to the U.S. after serving migrants, refugees and asylum seekers in Italy for four years last July, so we have now been back in the U.S. for just over a year. What an amazing but difficult year it has been! We continue to miss the people we came to love dearly during our time in Italy, and continue to do as much as we can to support them spiritually, emotionally and economically; they are a continuous reminder to us as to why caring for refugees and displaced people is not only the right thing to do in the midst of a humanitarian crisis,

but the faithful response to the many, many teachings in our scripture on caring for the foreigner, the widow, the orphan, those enslaved and oppressed, and ultimately, to love our neighbors as ourselves. I am filled with joy and hope when I meet with people from the RCA and other sister denominations throughout North America and listen to their stories of how they are blessing those in their communities and around the world who have left their homes seeking refuge...it is humbling to sit with someone who breaks down in tears after realizing—sometimes for the first time—the immense pain, fear and hardships a person forced to flee their home faces...it is sacred to meet others who themselves have been forcibly displaced from their homes and listen to them share their stories of God's providence in the midst of their past, present and continued struggles, as well as thanking God for the ways they are using their gifts and skills to make this world—so loved by God—a better place.

Despite all the joy and hope I have experienced in the past year, I have also experienced deep pain and concern, both personally and professionally. In June the UNHCR released their latest <u>report</u> on statics and analysis on the global phenomenon of forced displacement of people , and we know that at the end of 2018 over 70.8 million people living in our world have been forcibly displaced and are in search of refuge. It is difficult to hear numbers like this and not feel overwhelmed...it is even more difficult to be one of the 70.8 million people forced from home to begin a difficult and dangerous journey to find a place to rest or rebuild, to find the resources to sustain your life and the lives of your loved ones, to find people willing to greet you with kindness and compassion and say, "you are welcomed here." We, as Christians, have so much more work to do to build a safer, more compassionate world for all, and to care for those seeking refuge—whether they live in our communities or halfway around the world. Is it a big task? Yes. Do we serve a bigger God who—not only calls us to this work, but equips us with the gifts, skills and resources to engage in this work? Absolutely.

In June my older brother, Jeff, died unexpectedly. My family and I have made a couple of trips back to Iowa for his funeral and to spend time with family since this tragedy, but I realize now that I have not take en any real time this summer for myself to process the loss and grief. I look forward to taking some time off here and there between now and the end of the year to rejuvenate myself and to spend time with my husband and children, who have also experienced incredible highs and incredible lows over the past year as we've transitioned back to living in the U.S.


I would like to remind everyone that I continue to work with Partners Relief & Development to raise \$40,000 to rebuild a school in Iraqi Kurdistan and to provide intense trauma care to Yazidi children in the region. We started fundraising for this project at the end of May, but unfortunately, we have only raised approximately \$15,000 so far.

I will end with a plea from a colleague and former RCA missionary, Rev. Richard Otterness. Richard was diagnosed with stage 5 Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD) and is in search of a kidney donor.
