You know the saying, "Four months between planting and harvest." But I say, wake up and look around. The fields are already ripe for harvest. (NLT)



Thoughts

A drive across the plains of South Dakota reminded me of the upcoming wheat harvest. The fields are especially green and full this year due to abundant rain. The varieties of wheat used for the fall planting varied widely. So the maturity of the fields reflected that variety. Some fields were still green. Others were just beginning to turn that light green that melds into yellow. Yet others were already heading into the golden color that announces the harvest is near.

Action Point

Partner with God in His harvest of people. In the context of the John 4 passage, the disciples of Jesus did not realize the priority of God in reaching people. When Jesus mentioned the harvest, they thought He meant food, as they had just returned from a trip for food.

Jesus lets them know that reaching people is a priority. He speaks of the nourishment He receives as He accomplishes God's priority of reaching needy people.

We need to prioritize people in our schedules. We need to reach out to them in everything we do. We must always prepare to share. We must purchase each chance to sow the seed of the gospel in the hearts of people.



REFORMED THEOLOGY IS COVENANTAL

Have you ever struggled to understand how the Bible all ties together? If we are honest we have all wondered why we have Leviticus and Deuteronomy in the Bible. I think that it all stems from the inadequate teaching and preaching that we have in the modern church—including our own. If we are to understand God's plan of redemption as revealed in the Bible correctly we need to see it all in light of the Covenants He made with his people.

As a young person you may have learned that covenants are 'agreements between two or more persons. And the Covenants in the Bible are the same. What is different is who the **parties** or persons are in the Biblical covenants. Covenants also have **stipulations** (things the parties are required to do); **blessings/cursing's** (what will happen if we obey God or disobey God); and **signs** (something pointing to the work of God in salvation). Covenants made with Adam, Noah, Abraham, Moses and David all have these elements.

Covenant theology is the organizing principle that leads us through the 66 books of the Bible into a living relationship with God himself. In many ways the covenants can be best summed up through the repeating statement, "I will be your God and you will be my people" (Gen. 17:6,8; Ex. 6:;7; 20:2; 29:45; Jer. 32:38; Ezek. 11:20; 34:30; 36:28; 2 Co. 6:17, 18: Rev. 21:3)

- Covenant of Redemption—arrangement between the Father and the Son in which the Son promises to act in the place of sinners, becoming a security for His people, obeying and suffering on their behalf. (Ps. 2:7,9; 89:3; 2 Sam. 7:11, 16; Zech. 6:13, John 5:30, 6:38)
- Covenant of Works, or Covenant of Life—Adam is the federal (representative) head of humanity, meaning that his obedience or disobedience is reckoned as humanities. So when Adam fell, his guilt was imputed to his posterity, including those who have never sinned (e.g. infants).
- **Covenant of Grace**—God's underserved favor toward the believer, viewed in God's covenant with Abraham and his seed (Gen. 15:18; 17:2, 4, 7, 9, 13, 19,21). Other covenants of the OT are subsumed under this covenant.

Can you hear all of redemptive history in the words of Jesus at the last supper?

And when He had taken *some* bread *and* given thanks, He broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body, which is being given for you; do this in remembrance of Me." And in the same way *He took* the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup, which is poured out for you, is the **new covenant** in My blood. *Luke 22:19-20*

There isn't enough room here to discuss this fully, and it is hard to distill this subject down when it is the whole counsel of God! Other systems of Biblical interpretation are in adequate (for example Dispensationalism). Reformed Theology see all of history in terms of Creation –Fall-Redemption and Restoration!



REFORMED CREATION—FALL—REDEMPTION—RESTORATION

Our world is complicated. If you are listening to the very loud voices in our culture then you may feel threatened and confused. We may be tempted to become **theological turtles**, pulling our heads inside our shells when confronted with someone who doesn't like what we believe. But God wants us to be out there speaking truth and calling people to faith and repentance.

Every worldview tries to answers one or more of the following questions, and we need to make sure that we know what the Bible says about these questions. Take heart, God is not defeated and neither are we.

1. Where did we come from? This is the question of CREATION.

The general perception in the modern world is that the world simple 'exploded' into being out of nothing. This is an illogical statement because *nothing comes from nothing*. We know that God created everything, that he created man in his own image, and that we all have purpose and meaning only through him.

2. What has gone wrong with the world? This is the question of the FALL.

We could spend much time on this question because so many have tried to answer this question. The Bible says that we are all sinful and that the entire creation has been tainted by Adam's sin. Here are three other perspectives you may hear being suggested to us every day.

- Sigmund Freud said there isn't sin, only the affects of parents and others on the individual.
- Karl Marx said that there is only conflict between those with power/money and those who do not have it.
- Fredrick Nietzsche said there was no sin.

3. Can anything be done to fix the world? This is the question of REDEMPTION

The three we looked at above also have answers to this question. Can you see how they tried to solve the problems of the world from their ideas about sin?

- Sigmund Freud said everyone needs *therapy*. It's not their fault.
- Karl Marx said that we need to redistribute wealth and power, through the government or revolution.
- Fredrick Nietzsche was complicated but his essential answer was those will power could exert their moral will over the lives of the weak—Hitler loved his ideas.

4. What happens when we die? This is the question of RESTORATION

Freud, Marx and Nietzsche all believed there was nothing after death, this life is all that there is. But God has another plan—a plan to restore all of creation to it's original state of perfection. We know that when those who die in Christ will live with him in heaven, but we also know there is also going to be a new heaven and a new earth where the state of Eden is restored! (Rev. 22-24)

From the library--

You may recall that I have told about the 'True Colors" books in previous NEWS LETTERS. The series is a number of books written by different authors all based on 'Historical Stories of American Crime.' This month two new True Colors books have been added to our library: THE YELLOW LANTERN and THE PINK BONNET.



Hopefully, I can peak your interest by stating THE YELLOW LANTERN written by Angie Dicken is a weird book and I was wondering if it really was based on true events—it is!! With the "True Colors" books I have found it helpful to go to the back of the book (No, not to read the ending!!) but where the author gives a more complete picture of the crime involved. Here is the synopsis: "In 1824, Josephine Clayton is considered dead by everyone in her Massachusetts village—especially the doctor she has assisted for several months. Yet, she is still very much alive. After the doctor's illegal dealing with his body snatcher to obtain her body, Josephine awakens, positioned as the next corpse for his research. To cover up his crime, the doctor tries

to kill her, but Josephine begs to be spared. They strike a deal—Josephine will leave her village and work at a distant cotton mill. All the while, she's awaits her true mission—posing as a mourner to help the body snatcher procure her replacement. At the mill, though, Josephine is praised for her medical remedies among the other female workers, gaining attention from the handsome factory manager, Braham Taylor. Yet, when Braham's own loved one becomes the prey for the next grave robbing, Josie must make a choice that could put her dark past behind her or steal away the promise of any future at all."



I know that THE PINK BONNET by Liz Tolsma is for real—I have seen TV documentaries on Georgia Tann. "Widowed in Memphis during 1933, Cecile Dowd is struggling to provide for her three-year-old daughter, Millie. Cecile unwittingly trusts a neighbor who puts little Millie into the clutches of Georgia Tann, corrupt Memphis Tennessee Children's Home Society director suspected of the disappearance of hundreds of children. With the help of a sympathetic lawyer, their search for Millie uncovers a deep level of corruption that threatens their very lives. How far will a mother go to find out what happened to her child?"



The goal of St. Paul's University is to train servant leaders for various fields of service. Our role is to teach classes in the Faculty of Social Science (Jane) and the Faculty of Theology (Rowland). We also mentor students and develop relationships with them by living and working on campus.

Blessings of 2020: Just before the lockdown for the COVID-19 Pandemic, Rowland was able to present a paper on African Christology to the African Society of Evangelical Theology and published it in their Journal.

Students were also still able to study and train virtually all three

mesters and were able to do their field practicums while following COVID-19 guidelines. Rowland presented a report to Saint Paul's University on Pastoral Care during a Pandemic, using some of the stories of the students.

In one local church, due to a decline in cash offerings, they held a harvest festival with in-kind offerings



to raise money not only for their budget but so they could offer help to the poor. In another local church, when schools were closed, they decided to give sanitary pads to middle school girls who were used to getting them free from school, to meet this new pandemic need.

Challenges of 2020The COVID-19 pandemic was a major challenge from March when schools were closed through December. Classes for the January semester were moved online and students were able to finish and do their exams virtually. The May and September semesters were then both done 100% virtually.

While the pandemic reduced physical access to students and local congregations, we were still able to minister virtually for an Easter service and at least once a month for the rest of the year. St Paul's University was still able to hold graduation, albeit virtually, for students. A few faculty and staff (including Jane) we selected to participate in the recorded ceremony.



Hopes for 2021: In 2021, we plan to teach the Jan-April Semester and then come to the U.S. for home service, since we have not done that since 2018. Our goal is to connect with as many of our supporting churches as possible to share the good news about what God continues to do at St Paul's and in Kenya.



How We Can Pray: We need prayers for safety this year as some students have returned to campus to take classes in person even as other classes (all of ours included) continue to be done virtually. We are trying to keep as safe as possible by following guidelines about masking and distancing. Pray that Kenya continues to have relatively few cases and deaths and maintains a low positivity rate and that the vaccine will be available and distributed freely and fairly to the most in need of protection.

Additional Needs: We usually try to give either an African Bible or African Bible Commentary to graduating students of the Reformed Church in East Africa. The RCA also supports scholarships for needy students at St Paul's University studying in any one of the three faculties. Many depend on such assistance to afford a University education. In Kenya, families have to pay for high school, too, so money has to go to all their children, and often there is just not enough to cover them all. Q87. What is repentance unto life?




Consistory Meeting Highlights
