Hello First Reformed Church,

Your Devil Crushing Ninja Trainer (Youth Director for short) here to give you an update on what is happening and hopefully to encourage you! We had a very successful summer to say the least! We took our high school group to Lake Charles, LA for a mission trip, and then we took our middle schoolers on a trip to the Ark Encounter and Creation Museum. These trips were successful to our standards of what makes a trip good. We first measure what the majority of students got out of the trip. Was it a positive experience? Did they learn something new that will be beneficial to them later in life? Did they grow in their spiritual life? Second, we look at Bible study time. Did our students spend time in the word, not just a short devotional. Was there teaching involved? Did they dig deeper into the Word? Finally, how were they challenged? These three aspects are what make a good youth trip and/or mission trip. I have to say all three of these aspects were accomplished and then some. We obviously have it down as a majority, because there are times when we have students that do not get anything out of a trip or at least not as much as someone else did, so we want to score it based on majority and not just the whole group.

The mission trip was successful because one, it got our students out of the Midwest and to see a whole different culture. That in itself is a very positive thing. Next, our students were able to see what it is like for people who have lost everything materialistic in their lives. There were some homeowners that had lived in their homes for decades and raised their kids in that same home only to see it destroyed. It was good for them to see how invaluable our homes need to be. Also, they were able to work in extremely hot working conditions that they were not used to. It showed them the importance of hard work and what it means to rely on God for strength. Fourth, we spent a ½ hour to 1 hour every day and night, except for one night, in God's word doing devotions and expanding our knowledge of his truth. Finally, our students left the trip growing in their faith. I am sure you have heard the testimonies from the students of how God really worked in their lives.

The Ark Encounter and Creation Museum trip was very successful as well. It was a trip that really opened all of our eyes to the beauty and complexity of God's creation. A lot of questions were asked and answered on this trip and students left the trip with the mindset, "This is not just a story in the Bible, this actually happened and there is evidence for it." One of the biggest ways that we saw God moving was in the realm of science. Science tries to say that it created itself and that it governs itself and that we are all cosmic accidents, but that is not the case. Students left knowing that God is real, and he created everything and set things in motion for the world to sustain itself, and God is still in control of it. We did devotions everyday, two-three times per day to get their minds thinking about what they were going to learn about that day. Finally, we saw God moving to the point of students being excited and wanting to have conversations with their friends about science, Noah's Ark, and creation itself. You will hear from them soon! I hope that you have been blessed by my newsletter, and if you ever need a hug this big ole teddy bear has got one for you!

Update from Brian Renes

Why does it take 15 years to translate a Bible? No surprise, it is a big book with tons of complexities.

For over 30 years I have been encountering the wonder, the richness, and **b** the ever-deep complexity of the Bible, and specifically the unique challenge of translating God's Word into other languages. There are over 30,000 verses in the Bible. An experienced translator can maybe draft 20 to 30 verses in a day, depending on whether it is a story, poetry, or proph-

latter being much harder. The first draft itself takes years.

Once the draft is complete, it gets reviewed by the other translators. So again, 30,000 verses are gone over one verse at a time to improve the wording and ensure a solid understanding of the passage.

Eventually, after several revisions and much discussion, the team feels like the text is ready. But before any book can be published, it needs to be others who are not on the translation team. That is called a "community check." The translation team has done the best they can do, but they need to ensure it is understood by as many people as possible. So they read it or share it with people from various churches (as shown in the pictures).

Over the past months, the Tojolabal translators have shifted to that focus and are visiting churches far and wide in the region. This experience has been great because they can share the Word of God, reading it with people who have not yet heard these texts. Many were excited to hear Psalms for the first time. But in addition to that sharing, they also discover some words that are not understood in certain communities. After each of these reading sessions, the team comes back to discuss and further improve the translation. One beautiful step closer to the first full Bible in Tojolabal.

Please pray for the Tojolabal translation team that they can have the strength to finish and the wisdom to do their work well.

**note on 15 years:* The amount of time it takes to translate a Bible has many implications. The number of translators and their ability is foremost in terms of planning the time it will take to finish. In the case of the Tojolabal translation project, they started with two translators working full time. It was obvious that it would take far longer than 15 years to complete the Bible with just the two, so another pastor was added to work with them. As the years passed, one of the original translators went blind due to complications from diabetes (he was under 50). To make up for his loss, another translator, who was a young pastor, was added. Regrettably, another got sick, so a young lady was added. Each translation project is unique, but the Tojolabal story reflects what typically happens. People get trained to do the work but, with such a long-term project, there are due to be setbacks. Thankfully, the Lord provides. His Word will go out to all—sooner or later.

The first is in LARGE print and is A BLESSING TO CHERISH written by Lauraine Snelling. "After several years of widowhood and hard work, Ingeborg Bjorklund has reached a place of contentment with her life. She enjoys watching Blessing, North Dakota thrive and grow, filled not only with her extended family, but also newcomers like David Gould. Though a high-society businessman from New York, City, David has become a dear friend. But how should she handle the ways their relationship seems to be changing?"



Book #1 of a new series, "Colorado Cowboys" is A COWBOY FOR KEEPS by Judy Hedlund is our second new book. "Greta Nilsson's trip west to save her ailing little sister, Astrid, could not have gone more wrong. First, bandits hold up her stagecoach, stealing all her money. Then, upon arriving in Fairplay, Colorado, she learns the man she was betrothed to as a mail-order bride has died. Gracie Blaylock has known Buddy her entire life, and now that she is clerk of court for the county, their paths cross frequently. When Gracie hears that a teenager in town has gone missing, she knows Bud-

dy is the one for the case. Together with Gracie and Mayleah—the new detective in town—Buddy chases all leads, hoping to reach the missing teen before it's too late. And as he pursues one girl, he uncovers clues that could bring him closer to the girl he thought he'd lost forever: his own daughter".



WEFTE FASIN The last book is ACTIVE DEFENSE by Lynette Eason, the third book in "Danger Never Sleeps" series. "When former field surgeon Heather Fontaine returns from a party to find that someone has broken into her house—and threatened her friends—she assumes it is the stalker who has been creeping her out. She hopes to find safety and peace of mind by leaving the city and hiding out in a small town. But trouble follows her even there. Luckily, a stalker isn't the only one observing Heather. Travis Walker has been secretly watching

out for her for weeks. As owner of his own security agency, it's what he does. Together, Travis and Heather must figure out who wants her dead—and why—before it is too late."
