

#### **Thoughts**

Hello First Reformed Church,

Your Devil Crushing Ninja Trainer (Youth Director for short) here to give you an update on what is happening and hopefully to encourage you! I hope that you all had a wonderful Christmas and a very happy New Year. I think it is funny how we have branded the new year celebration as a way of setting goals that we want to accomplish through this next year, and then approximately 80% of people break those new year resolutions. This is not to come down on anyone or to discourage anyone from wanting to set goals or to try and achieve excellence in some way. However, this is where I think we go wrong. # THE DISTINCTIVES OF REFORMED THEOLOGY?

Last month we looked at how we are alike the Fundamentalists and the Evangelicals. But what is it about our Theology that makes us Reformed and distinctive from other Christian traditions? There are many ways that theologians have approached this question, and most of them are more well educated than I am. However, this is my task and so I am borrowing from several excellent teachers!

You may have noticed that over the past few months we have looked a bit at the history of the Reformed Church (December) and our relationship to other protestants (January). From here on through the rest of the spring newsletters we will look at our confessions but also the confessions of the Presbyterians. Why? Because the Westminster Standards are excellent and because they sometimes asked and answered questions a bit differently than the Dutch confessions. All of these confessions are Reformed, they just came from two different branches of the Calvinistic tradition. Orthodox, bible believing Presbyterians are among our closest theological kindred. *Joel Beeke and Sinclair Ferguson published "Reformed Confessions Harmonized" in 1999 and the book is an excellent way to compare the confessions and catechisms. I use it all the time!* 

So what would be our choices for tackling this subject? We could organize around the Five Points of Calvinism—but they only answer a set of challenges and do not cover some very important points. We could go with the Five Solas of the Reformation and yet might not cover material in a way that would make clear our Reformed distinctives. When I am asked what it means to be Reformed I have a few concepts that come to mind and this is the way we will frame our next few newsletters.

**FIRST.** The word Reformed came from the movement known as the Reformation of the 16th century. The early reformers were interested in returning the church to the teachings of the Bible. They were not revolutionaries—they were reformers. The Five Solas and the Five Points of Calvinism were statements that outlined this return to Biblical teaching. Reformers are also interested in reforming ourselves and our culture. *The last in this series in May*.

**SECOND.** Reformers insisted on scripture alone as the special revelation of God. We used to be fierce about this, however our denomination has become more lax on this point. *More on the next page!* 

**THIRD.** Reformers have what is called a 'high' view of God which means that they base their theology on the view that God is sovereign over all. *This topic next month.* 

**FOURTH:** Reformed people look at the Bible through the lens of the Covenants. We see the world as one story of salvation—a story of creation, fall and redemption. *Wait until April for this topic!* 

By the time we get through the spring newsletters—in time for our next General Assembly—we at Sibley FRC should have a better understanding about the decisions before us as a congregation.



# DISTINCTIVE #1—SOLA SCRIPTURA

During the Reformation one of the major points of contention between the Roman Catholic church and the Protestant movement was the question of authority. Luther and Calvin held that the scripture, and scripture alone, was sufficient. Meanwhile the Roman Catholic church said that scripture was important, but not more important than the traditions of the church, the opinions of previous church councils, and the voice of the pope. How did the Reformers come to this conclusion? Let's look.

The most familiar verse for most of us is 2 Timothy 3:16. "All **Scripture** is inspired by God and beneficial for teaching, for rebuke, for correction, for training in righteousness;" But this is the Bible simply claiming something for itself—it could be seen as a form of bragging unless there is more for us to consider.

The Greek word that we write as scripture is used 51 times in the New Testament. The transliteration of the word is *graphe* and it means writing. Jesus himself used the word nearly 20 times and regularly quoted the Old Testament and declared it authoritative.

One of the best examples of this is when Jesus was walking on the road to Emmaus. Read Luke 24:27, "Then beginning with Moses and with all the Prophets, He explained to them the things written about Himself in all the Scriptures." In this passage we see that Jesus considered all of the Old Testament true. And then in Luke 24:32 the men he was walking with said, "They said to one another, "Were our hearts not burning within us when He was speaking to us on the road, while He was explaining the Scriptures to us?"

### We believe because He believed the scriptures to be true and authoritative.

Paul and the apostles considered each other's writings as scripture and inspired in the same way that the Old Testament was inspired. The reading of the apostles letters in worship was a regular practice. In Jewish tradition only scripture could be read in worship. No one would have encouraged them to read anything that wasn't inspired by God. Like them, we wouldn't read a textbook in worship—we would only read scripture.

However, in our day the church has turned away from thinking that the Bible is inerrant. We no longer trust the Bible as our source of all special revelation about God or salvation. Even in our own denomination we have listened to the theological critics who don't accept the inerrancy of scripture. Add to that the push for us to trust science, or the government, or other experts instead of the Bible.

The Bible is an amazing book. Last February we had a handout that outlined some of the astonishing facts about the Bible. *Copies will once again be on the table in the narthex.* As we move forward as disciples of Jesus Christ we need to rediscover the Bible. We need to learn it, study it and meditate on God's words to us, making it the foundation for all our thinking!

## **Update from JJ TenClay**

Dear Friends,

In some ways, 2020 has felt like an extremely long year, and in some ways, I can't believe it is already December. I wonder if some of you feel the same. Many of us have experienced deep pain, suffering, grief, and loss this year. Some have experienced isolation—physical, social, emotional, and/or spiritual. For most of us, it has been a trying year.

He knows our need, to our weaknesses no stranger.

It has also been an incredibly difficult year for refugees and displaced people. We know that by the end of 2019 over 79.5 million people were forcibly

displaced by war and violent conflict, persecution, disasters, terrorism, economic and political instability or collapse, and climate change. The same data will be collected after December 31 of this year and will be studied and released in a report by the UNHCR in June 2021, but we already know that the number will, again, show us that the number of people who are forced to leave their homes to seek refuge continues to grow at an alarming rate.

2020 has also reminded us that those who are displaced from their homes continue to be vulnerable on their migration journeys and as they plead for global humanitarian assistance and welcome—the type of welcome that allows them legal protection and the means necessary to meet, at minimum, their basic needs and live in peace. The August 4 Beirut explosion immediately displaced 300,000 people in just one day; many of those affected by the explosion are refugees (mostly from Syria and Palestine), and at least 43 refugees were killed in the explosion. The September 9 Moria Refugee Camp fire on the island of Lesvos, Greece left up to 13,000 refugees and displaced people without food, water, shelter, and other needed services. Many are still without shelter three months later, as winter sets in for the season.

In November, a violent conflict began in the Tigray region of Ethiopia, which has, so far, led to the displacement of one million people. Over 96,000 Eritrean refugees live in camps in the region near the Ethiopia/Eritrea border and are at great risk of starvation, death due to lack of medical care, and violence/abduction. These are only three of the many ongoing events that continue to threaten the life and liberty of refugees and displaced people worldwide.

Chains shall He break for the slave is our brother; And in His name all oppression shall cease. This is the good news of the gospel! 2020 has been a stark reminder that we live in a broken and hurting world, but it is a broken and hurting world loved by God. So loved by God that God sent Jesus Christ to us as a baby, who lived and ministered on this earth for 33 years. Therefore, we will continue to work as ambassadors of Christ to love one another, to be purveyors of Christ's law of love and gospel of peace, and to break the chains of slavery and oppression. With your support, we will continue to share this good news with refugees and displaced people—those who live in our communities or have come to our countries seeking refuge, as well as those who live far, far away.


## From the library--

It is still winter and the evenings are long. True the days are getting longer but there is still plenty of time to read in the evening. Here are excerpts from a few of the new books that have been added to the library:



We have started a new series by Dani Pettrey, "Costal Guardians" Book number 1 is THE KILLING TIDE. When one Coast Guard officer is found dead and another goes missing, Coast Guard Investigative Service special agent Finn Walker faces his most dangerous crime yet. His only clues are what little evidence remains aboard the dead officer's boat, and the direction the clues point to will test Finn and the Guard to their limits. The already volatile situation is complicated even further by the arrival of Gabby Rowley-Finn's boss's sister, an investigative reporter with unrelenting questions about the crime. Now that she's returned,

the tug on Finn's heart is strong, but with the risks she's taking for her next big story, he fears she might not live through it. Thrown together by the heinous crime, Finn and Gabby can't ignore the sparks of judgments flying between them. But will they be able to see past their preconceptions long enough to track down an elusive killer, or will they become his next mark?





## THE STATE OF THEOLOGY 2020 LIGONIER MINISTRIES

Ligonier Ministries conducts a bi-annual survey called *The State of Theology*. This survey questions Americans (and in a separate survey people of the United Kingdom) about what they believe about salvation, ethics, the Bible and other essential theological questions. The researchers then compare the answers to this year's questions with the answers to previous surveys. The goal is to track the "theological temperature" of the nation to help us understand the overall health of the church in America.



The general view of Jesus is not Biblical. Most people in America do not believe that Jesus was God.

When you filter for just Evangelical answers, 30% of our own do not believe that Jesus was God!



The general view of scripture in our country is almost as dismal, and going in the wrong direction. Those who think the Bible is true are fewer in number than six years ago.

Evangelicals are a bit stronger than the general population but we are going in the wrong direction.

## **Consistory Meeting Highlights**

- MMSA to offer to rent the parsonage to the newly hired Christian Reformed Church pastor, with details to be worked out by property ministry and deacons.


## From the Westminster Shorter Catechism
