



One way to understand all of scripture is to think **Creation – Fall – Redemption**. The Bible begins with the book of Genesis, or the beginning. God creates all, but into the perfect world he created man brings sin and the Fall. Now separated from God by our sin, God introduces Redemption. The rest of the scriptures unfold God's plan of redemption for man – and for all of creation. When we reach the end of the Revelation we find a 'new heaven and a new earth.'

Each week, read the appropriate section of "The Story". Remember that this is not a Bible! It is a retelling of the history of God and his people as told in the Bible. Christianity is a religion rooted in real history and is not myth or fable. To help us all to learn more we are including a list of Biblical references tied to the chapter in *The*

Story, along with a timeline so you can keep track of the history of God's work. As you read along in our study book we suggest that you also read along in God's word.



THE STORY THE RELATION CONTINUES STORY OF ONE AND HE REFERE SERMON SERIES



The Story Home Study Questions for you to ponder as you read through this month's chapters.

Chapter 1 "Creation: The Beginning of Life as We Know It":

- 1. What words would you use to describe the God who is revealed in the Creation narrative?
- 2. The story of the fall indicates that every part of God's good creation was fractured by Adam and Eve's rebellion. As you observe our world, what evidence do you see that the world was created to be a good and beautiful place? Where do you see evidence that it is broken by sin?
- 3. In the flood story, we encounter a God who takes action to prevent the spread of human rebellion and sin by destroying most of his creation. The flood is both an act of judgement and salvation. How do you see these two activities of God reflected in the story? How do these themes differ from the "popular" picture of God that is often presented in this passage?

Chapter 2 "God Builds a Nation":

- 1. "God's will is lived forward and understood backward." What do you think this statement means? How does it reflect the truth of Abraham's life? How have you seen this to be true in your life?
- 2. What kind of consequences did Abraham and Sarah face for trying to make God's plan work for him? Have you experienced negative consequences from trying to make what you perceived to be God's plan happen on your own?

Chapter 3 "Joseph: From Slave to Deputy Pharaoh":

- 1. What are some of the things the Lord may have worked into Joseph's life through his many years of struggle? What were some of the doubts he may have faced? What can you learn from his example?
- 2. In effect Joseph said to his brothers, "What you meant for evil, God meant for good." Have you ever had an experience where, looking back, you can see God bringing good out fo a sinful choice or an evil act?

Chapter 4 "Deliverance":

- 1. "Always remember!" is a recurring theme in Scripture. God called the Israelites regularly to celebrate festivals in which they recounted the stories of God's work in their lives. What stories of God's power at work in your life could you repeat more often?
- 2. As you consider the life of Moses, several parallels between him and Jesus emerge. Can you list some of them? What is the significance of this overlap?

Chapter 5 "New Commands and a New Covenant":

- 1. In the wilderness, God presented himself in thunder, lighting, and flame on a mountain that could not be touched. What does this tell us about God's character? Are these things true today? What other images does God use to describe his presence in Scripture?
- 2. What role do the Ten Commandments play in your life with God? Should and /or how can they play a more significant role?
- 3. Why do you think it was so easy for Israel to slip from covenant affirmation to idolatry? What, if anything, should we learn from this?

We have been processing 36 new books to be added to the library. Among the new additions is "The Men from Lancaster County" series of four. If you think about it, usually books are written about women. As indicated these books focus on four different Amish men. Following are partial synopsis from each of the books.



Book one: THE AMISH GROOM—Tyler Anderson is torn between two worlds— Amish and *Englisch*. Born to an ex-Amish mother and an *Englisch* father, he is raised as a military kid until his mom passes away and his dad places him in the care of his Amish grandparents. Now 23, Tyler knows it's time to commit to the Amish church for good. Still he hesitates, unsure if he'll ever truly belong.



Book two: THE AMISH BLACKSMITH—Talented horse gentler Jake Miller, an apprentice blacksmith for the Kinsingers, is at odds with the beautiful but emotionally complex Priscilla Kinsinger. He much prefers the lighthearted, easygoing ways of Amanda Shetler, the young woman he's been courting. But his boss is Priscilla's uncle, so when the man asks Jake and Amanda to help his niece reconnect with community life, they have no choice but to do just that.



Book three: THE AMISH CLOCKMAKER—Newlywed Matthew Zook is expanding his family tack and feed store when a surprising property dispute puts the remodel on hold and raises new questions about the location's mysterious past. 




Bible Translation
