# Belgic Confession Article 7: The Sufficiency of Scripture

We believe that this Holy Scripture contains the will of God completely and that everything one must believe to be saved is sufficiently taught in it.

For since the entire manner of service which God requires of us is described in it at great length, no one— even an apostle or an angel from heaven, as Paul says—ought to teach other than what the Holy Scriptures have already taught us.

For since it is forbidden to add to the Word of God, or take anything away from it, it is plainly demonstrated that the teaching is perfect and complete in all respects.

Therefore we must not consider human writings— no matter how holy their authors may have been— equal to the divine writings; nor may we put custom, nor the majority, nor age, nor the passage of times or persons, nor councils, decrees, or official decisions above the truth of God, for truth is above everything else.

For all human beings are liars by nature and more vain than vanity itself.

Therefore we reject with all our hearts everything that does not agree with this infallible rule, as we are taught to do by the apostles when they say, "Test the spirits to see if they are from God," and also, "Do not receive into the house or welcome anyone who comes to you and does not bring this teaching."

# **Sportsmen's Devotional**

#### **Bible Study Verses**

I Timothy 4:7-8

Have nothing to do with godless myths and old wives' tales; rather, train yourself to be godly. For physical training is of some value, but godliness has value for all things, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come. (NIV)



#### **Thoughts**

Saltwater anglers fishing Texas coastal waters all agree that wade fishing is a great way to catch fish. Slip into the water from your boat along a shoreline or drive up to the beachfront and wade in.

At first glance for someone who hasn't waded much, it looks like a pretty simple way to sneak up on a bunch speckled trout, redfish or flounder. However the neophyte to this type of fishing doesn't realize what a workout this type of fishing can be. Normally the wade fishing angler doesn't stand in one place unless he is along an ambush where moving tidal water is pushing or pulling fish by.

It's done mostly by shuffling along, while keeping your eyes tuned to birds diving for shrimp, slicks, mud boils or tell-tale signs of fish activity. Experienced waders might shuffle half a mile or more, casting, looking for fish activity.

The bottom varies from compacted or shifting sand, shell or just plain mud. I have come to the point in my life where if the bottom is mud, I'm not going there. I don't care if there are redfish boiling all along the shoreline, they can stay there. Pulling one foot out of ankle sucking mud after the next foot isn't worth it.

#### **Action Point**

Experienced wade fishing anglers know you have to be in good physical shape to do this type of fishing. After wading along and casting a beachfront or shallow water flat for about an hour or more over varied assortment of bottoms, the "hike" back to the boat or parked vehicle sure can look like a long trek prompting the statement, "Gee, I wish I hadn't gone that far!"

At times our everyday life can get to be a struggle if you haven't done some preconditioning, reading God's Word and praying, before the muddy bottoms pop up.

Spend time alone with God every day, having a spiritual workout. Just 10 minutes a day will help you handle the events of the day. "Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ," Romans 10:7 (NIV).

Ask yourself, how does what you read apply to your life? What does it say about mankind? Then pray. Confess your sins to God. Thank Him for what He has shown you. Pray for yourself and others. Make preconditioning a daily workout. It will strengthen every area of your life.

#### Sportsmen's Tip of the Day

When driving along a beach looking for a good place to start your wade fishing day, be aware of the tidal flow for that day. Not only for matching up your fishing efforts to fish movement, but also to where you park your vehicle. You might come back and find it surrounded by water.

# THE REFORMED CHURCH—VISION 2020

The Reformed Church in America is undergoing serious discussions about the future of the denomination and the options open to those who disagree with one another. If you have been carefully reading **RCA Today** (our denominational magazine) for the past few years you will be very familiar with the ideas that both unite and divide our denomination.

In 2018 a commission was formed to find ways to stay unified, or to separate peacefully. The report – Vision 2020 – was released in 2019 and was to have been considered and voted on at the 2020 General Assembly in June of this year. Unfortunately Covid made it impossible to hold the Assembly, and the vote has now been postponed until June 2021. Make sure you read what is written in the report—and keep up by reading the magazine.

Our congregation will be called upon to make some big decisions in the near future. In order to do this to the glory of God, this space in our monthly newsletter is going to devote itself to an explanation of what we historically believe, what the challenges before us are, and how the Bible should inform our decisions.

# VISION 2020—3 MAJORITY RECOMMENDATIONS

After two years of intensive work, the Vision 2020 team appointed by the General Assembly in 2018, presented a report in May 2020 that did not resolve the differences between churches and classes, but suggested three solutions that they believe will **ALL be necessary** moving forward.

- 1. Together, Yet Changed (Recommendation 1—Restructuring) This would provide ways for all churches/ classes who wish to remain with the denomination to do so in spite of the serious differences of theological positions. Classes would be reorganized as affinity-based, rather than geographically based, Classes would be responsible for decisions related to ordination and marriage, disciple of consistories would reside with the classis, and regional and general synods would be re-examined.
- 2. Preserving Our Shared History (Recommendation 2—A New Mission Agency) In order to preserve our missionary/evangelistic outreach in the world a new Mission Agency would be established that both those who remain in the RCA and those who leave could support.
- 3. **Forward with Grace (Recommendation 3—Mutually Generous Separation)** Realizing that separation is inevitable, the RCA would provide new streamlined rules for separation from the denomination. There are significant organizational and financial obligations that are part of membership in the RCA and these ties need to be broken legally and graciously. Currently there is no single solution for future denominational membership for churches wishing to leave the RCA.

# THE REFORMED CHURCH: WHO ARE WE?

We use lots of terms today to describe what we believe, and who we align ourselves within the broader Christian Community. We need to clearly define these terms—they are not interchangeable. Think of it more as a Venn diagram with some overlap, but also with distinctives. Reformed theology is deeper and more specific the basic principles of Evangelicalism or Fundamentalism.

**Evangelicalism** is a term that defines the movement that tries to bring all Bible believing Protestants together—while *minimizing any distinctives*. It is an umbrella term that seeks to refers to four shared ideas including: 1) commitment to the Bible; 2) cross centered salvation; 3) the need for conversion and evangelism, and; 4) an activism that adapts worship and doctrine to the times.

Today it also may refer to a type of churches and as a complete theological position. Many congregational churches (no external church government) would fall into this category. Evangelicalism has moved from being an umbrella to being its own thing that has very little depth, and is easily changeable by changes in culture. It is deeply tied to American individualism. We'll discuss this more next month.


**Fundamentalism** is a term that is used less today, *primarily because of the negative connotation of the word from Islamic fundamentalism*. However, the five points of this movement help to distinguish the differences between liberal and conservative theology. Developed in the early 20th century by orthodox theologians, the Five Fundamentals are: 1) the Bible is the word of God, and without error; 2) Jesus was born of a virgin; 3) Christ performed real supernatural miracles; 4) Jesus rose physically from the dead, and 5) Christ will return in person.

Mainline denominations have become increasingly liberal, rejecting the miraculous nature of Christianity and the authority and inerrancy of the Bible. The RCA is considered a mainline denomination. Our east and west coast congregations tend to be more liberal, while the heart-

conservative. Keep this in mind when considering Vision 2020.


Historical **Reformed** theology accepts the basics of evangelicalism and all of fundamentalism, but it is more—much more! Being Reformed is a maximalist rather than a minimalist position. We are called to teach the whole gospel—not just part of it. We have distinctive beliefs about salvation, worship, sacraments, biblical interpretation of the Bible, and the sovereignty of God, would be removed from our beliefs if we decide to identify as simply Evangelical or Fundamentalist.



We may call ourselves Evangelical or Fundamentalist in the common language of the times but as Reformed believers we are not limited to those definitions.


# From the library--

With the New Year we have more "new" books in the library. Here are summaries from a few books to wet your reading appetite!




There is a trilogy called "Bluebell Inn" by Denise Hunter. The first one is titled: LAKE SEASON—When their parents die in a tragic accident, Molly Bennett and her siblings pull together to fulfill their parents' dream of turning their historic Bluebell, North Carolina home back into an inn. Staying in town would be temporary—three years at most—then they plan to sell the inn, and Molly can get back to chasing her own dreams. Adam Bradford (pen name Nathaniel Quinn) is a reclusive novelist with a bad case of writer's block. Desperate for inspiration as his deadline approaches, he travels to the setting of his next book, a North Carolina lake town. There, he meets a young innkeeper who fancies herself in love with his alter ego, Nathaniel Quinn.

Molly and Adam strike up an instant friendship. When Molly finds a long-lost letter in the walls of her inn, she and Adam embark on a mission to find the star-crossed lovers and bring them the closure they deserve. But Adam has secrets he isn't ready to share. Past and present collide as truths surface, and Molly and Adam will have to decide if love is worth trusting.



The second book is CAROLINA BREEZE and features Molly's brother, Levi Bennett, who, as the oldest sibling and male, has taken on the title "head of the household" much to his sisters' chagrin. The final book is AUTUMN SKIES and features the baby of the family, Grace Bennett. Each book has mystery and romance. If you are the reader who likes a mystery but doesn't like nail biting suspenseful books then the "Bluebell Inn" series would be a good fit for you.



The "Global Search and Rescue " trilogy by Susan May Warren has been completed with THE PRICE OF VALOR. Kidnapped by rebels while serving as a humanitarian aid worker in Chechnya, Signe Kincaid has spent the past decade secreting out valuable information about Russian assets in the US to her CIA handler. Fearing for her daughter, Aggie, after being discovered as an operative, Signe sends Aggie to former Navy SEAL Hamilton Jones for safekeeping. Signe is ready to give her life for her country, and she can hardly expect Ham to rescue her after breaking his heart over and over. Hamilton Jones has never forgotten the only woman he loved—and he can't believe after all these years she's shown up alive. But can he forgive her

for her secrets? And, when Ham discovers the reason Signe has kept her distance he must choose between love for her and love for the nation he has vowed to protect. What is the price of valor? The other two books THE WAY OF THE BRAVE and THE HEART OF A HERO are already in the library. Visit the library soon.

## **Update from Abraham and Sayuri Kist-Okazaki**

For all of us 2020 has certainly been a very challenging year. Here in Japan there had been so much expectation building up for the Tokyo Olympics. I was kind of excited because I had been selected to be one of the chaplains to serve for the English-speaking Olympic athletes. In the aftermath of all that has happened and the midst of all that continues to be going on, the postponement of a sporting event seems so very trivial. One of the shocking things to me is how this global pandemic, which has impacted us all, seems to have heightened divisions among people rather than causing a greater sense of unity

throughout the world.

With almost no foreign travel being allowed into Japan, I really have felt more like a foreigner in Japan than at any other point in my twenty-five years living here. With international flights from Japan running at 4% of the pre-pandemic level, leaving is not an easy task. We had a neighbor who had to wait nearly two months to return home to California

However, throughout this year, I never felt isolated or distant from all those who have been sup-

porting us through the years. We have felt constantly uplifted by your prayers and support. It has also been wonderful that we've been able to join the Zoom and Facebook worship services of so many congregations in America.
