We are slowly making a transition! It has been great seeing your faces in church but also, we greatly appreciate those who continue to watch online. As we move forward into the month of July we continue to assess our next phase of ministry within the church. About every two weeks the administrative team has been meeting and discussing how Covid is affecting our community and then seeking God's direction for our next steps as a church.

On Monday, our Administrative Team met once again and decided that we will continue in Phase 1a which means keeping things like they are when it comes to worship. We however are going to move to Phase 2b for other church activities. This means, beginning Sunday, June 28th, we will allow small groups (10 people or less) to meet in the church. We ask that groups who meet in church abide by the social distancing guidelines of a 6-foot distance. If you would like to meet in the church you need to contact Jamie in the office so we are aware when you are here. That will allow us to make sure we disinfect and clean the area you use after you are done.

We are asking all meetings to be held in the Fireside Room only. You can arrange the room according to your needs. Again, please inform Jamie if you will be needing the use of that room. The youth group will also be able to begin meeting. Josh will inform all students and parents of the guidelines he will have as they meet together.

When a church activity or meeting is not in the church, groups of more than 10 can meet if they are outdoors and again are social distancing. Our community has done a great job of keeping COVID numbers down. As we began to meet face to face with more people we want to continue to keep those numbers low.

As we continue to worship together each week, we thank those who have been attending for their discipline in following the Phase 1 guidelines we have put into place. Toward the beginning of July the administrative team will meet to again access our next possible move. We encourage you to be patient as we work towards a new normal.

We are also very grateful for all those who continue to watch us online. Thanks for your commitment to joining us each week. We want to make sure everyone is moving at a pace, to getting back to normal, that is comfortable to you. It might be in the next couple of weeks or it might be in the next couple of months. That's ok. We encourage you to stay in touch and stay informed on what is happening.

If you ever have any questions please let us know. We are here to help. Also just a reminder that the weekly bulletin can be found online or you can pick up a printed copy during office hours in the hallway during the week. We also want to thank you for your continued faithful giving. You have been such a blessing to this church during this trying time.

One other item just to make you aware of. Every day right about noon, I do a short talk with some sort of encouragement for the day. You can find this on my personal Facebook page. If you would like to get them make sure you friend request me. I have enjoyed helping make someone else's day just a little brighter. I am also grateful for those who have been watching and sharing the messages.

As we continue to move forward I ask that you keep our leadership in your prayers with each decision we need to make. Keep the many members of our congregation in your prayers as well. 

Sayuri & Abraham Kist-Okazaki

Dear Friends in Christ, Let us begin by giving thanks to all who have expressed concerns about our wellbeing since the outbreak of the coronavirus. To this point, the number of infected in Japan has remained relatively low. However, since last week's announcement that the Tokyo 2020 Summer Olympics will be postponed, the number of newly infected has begun to spike and there are various rumors about the possibility that the numbers are being suppressed. Two weeks ago when Abraham had a fever for four days along with a sore throat, congestion, and cough, we were told by the health department that he would not be tested be

cause he hadn't had contact with any known carrier of the disease or anyone who had recently returned from China, Iran, or Italy. Currently Abraham, the rest of our family, and the members of the congregation are all in good health. Schools have been closed since the beginning of March, sporting events and other large gatherings have been canceled or postponed, and employers are urged to have employees work from home, although most continue to commute in Japan's overcrowded trains. Throughout the past few weeks, things have changed dramatically in the United States and Canada and our prayers are with all of you.

In February, Kugahara Church in Tokyo, where we have been serving as Associate Pastors, celebrated the 80th anniversary of its founding. Before our installation, the congregation had gone through a very painful chapter with a previous pastor and the number of members left the church. It was truly a joy to see how, over the course of the past, there has been healing, reconciliation, and growth at Kugahara. It is a congregation with not only a past to remember but more importantly a future. from Sayuri and Abraham Kist-Okazaki in Japan April 2020 Sayuri and Abraham's ministry Sayuri and Abraham, ordained RCA ministers, work as associate pastors at Kagahara Church in Tokyo for local mission and visit many churches and regional gatherings to preach nationwide for evangelism and leadership training. Together they train and teach churches so they can more effectively reach non-Christians who make up 99 percent of Japan's population. Sayuri also works with the National Church Women's Guild as one of the executive members to empower women who serve churches faithfully, while Abraham teaches introduction to Christianity at Meiji Gakuin University. For the worship service, Abraham wrote a hymn based on Psalm 67: "May God be gracious to us and bless us and make his face to shine upon us, that your way may be known upon earth, your saving power among all

nations." The Psalmist
makes a clear message that blessings we receive from God are
to be used so that salvation might be known by all peoples of
the world. We are truly grateful that for the past quarter of a
century our supporting congregations have been sharing their
blessings so we can do ministry here in Japan.



From the library--

Have you ever read a book and at the end had lots of questions of what had taken place before the story you just read? That is what happened to me when I read LOOKING INTO YOU by Chris Fabry. I finished it and thought "There has to be a book that came before this one." So I did a little digging on line and found out that EVERY WAKING MOMENT was the prelude to LOOKING INTO YOU. The book was available at a second hand book distribution center and now we have it in our library.



The book I read first was LOOKING INTO YOU and the cover synopsis is as follows: "Every day Paige Redwine is haunted by a choice she made when she was only seventeen. Now, just past forty, still single, she lives a tidy, controlled life as a well-respected English professor at a college in Nashville. Nothing could prepare her for the day Treha Langsam—the daughter she secretly placed for adoption—walks into her classroom as a student, unknowingly confronting Paige with both her greatest longing and her greatest fear. As Treha sets aside

the search for her birth mother to concentrate on her education, Paige summons the courage to reach out to her daughter never dreaming her actions will transform them both as she faces a past she thought she'd laid to rest."

I closed the book at the end and wondered Treha had a strange disability, what caused it! At different times circumstances alluded to Treha's unhappy childhood. What happened? Was her adoption not a happy one?



You will find the answers in EVERY WAKING MOMENT so read it first!!! Here is what the book cover discloses about Treha's story. "Treha Langsam is a mysterious young woman who has fallen through the cracks, just like many of the elderly people she works with at Desert Gardens. But Miriam Howard, director of the assisted-living facility sees her extraordinary gift and untapped potential. Treha is a whisperer of sorts, calling those who have slipped into dementia back to a life of vibrant, if only temporary, clarity. When a documentary

team stumbles onto Treha's story, her gift is discovered and the search for answers about her past begins. As the truth slowly unravels, Treha and those around her must each tackle a difficult question: if this is as good as life gets, is that enough?"

To check out a book go the "mini-library" in the hallway west of the office. It is good to see that you have taking advantage of the books that have been out. Sorry that the selection could not have been larger. We hope to be able to get them all back into the library soon.


