## **PASTORAL SEARCH TEAM NEWS**

At last, it feels more as if we are on our way! The Church Profile is finished and on its way to the RCA website. Many potential candidates will see that notification and apply. However, not all people look at that website. We are considering posting notifications with a collection of seminaries, including some non-RCA seminaries. There are many seminaries that share our theological view-point and we think that we will reach out to them as well.

Now the team is starting the task of deciding how to proceed when we do get an application. The first thing is to have a set of minimum expectations that a candidate must meet. The Co-Chairs Greg Kosters and Duane Vande Hoef will review the initial qualifications. If we remain in the RCA there are rules we need to follow in selecting a pastor – and those will be the initial framework for deciding minimum qualifications. From there we will develop a process for moving forward. One helpful tool at our disposal is the presence of recorded church services and messages online. Without sending people across the country, we will be able to see/hear many of our candidates online. This is a great advantage that we did not have last time.

## **Sportsmen's Devotional**

#### **Bible Study Verse**

#### Genesis 1:26

Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." (NKJV)



#### **Thoughts**

Ruling over the fish of the sea and the birds in the air is an awesome responsibility that God has given us. With new technology, it is easier to overharvest our fish and game. It is crucial to maintain proper predator/prey ratios.

Harvesting game should depend on the populations. Once an animal is harvested, we must utilize it as a food source and thank God for His provision.

#### **Action Point**

Take the responsibility to promote rules within your party for hunting and fishing that emphasize good ethics and stewardship.

#### Sportsmen's Tip of the Day

Try going barbless, release your fish carefully, and only keep injured predator fish or prolific prey fish. When bird hunting, always use a trained hunting dog. In heavy cover (cattails, switchgrass) with multiple flushes, shoot one bird, line it up, walk directly to the downed bird, and call for the dog if he is not in the immediate area. Take the necessary time to find your downed birds.

The high school group had their mission trip to Lake Charles, LA the first week of June. It was such a hard week, but it was also an amazing week. The humidity was horrible down there. I think at one point the humidity was at 99%! It only rained one time, but it was at night and it was only for five minutes. Things were closed some due to COVID, others due to recent flooding they had two weeks prior to us arriving. One of the best parts of the trip was seeing our senior Carter Brouwer use power tools for the first time with Samaritan's Purse. This is not to say that Carter does not know how to use tools, the exact opposite he does construction, so he knows his way around a power tool. Samaritan's Purse has a rule that anyone under the age of 18 cannot operate a power tool. This trip all of that changed. He was finally able to operate power tools and to help in actual construction work and not just painting or nailing things in with a hammer and nails. It was a very nice moment.

We are getting ready to take our middle school students to the Ark Encounter and Creation Museum. We are very excited for this trip because we have never taken our middle schoolers on a trip like this before. We have taken them to Power Connections which are usually anywhere from 3-6 hours away. The Ark and Creation Museum are almost 13 hours away! We rented a charter bus to take us there, so we will not be doing any driving ourselves. We are most excited about the impact that this trip is potentially going to have on the kids and on us as leaders as well. It seems that science, creation, and evolution are three topics that are ignored in the church. Either due to lack of knowledge or fear of offending someone, so it will be very beneficial to get some answers and for the kids to see where we get our answers to science questions that they have. Please be in prayer for our students but also for the leaders as well.

Overall, I would like to thank the congregation again for their continued support of the youth group and my family as well. In September Hannah is due to give birth to our second child and it is amazing to see the support we get from members of the congregation because of that. ## High School Remnant Summer Mission Trip 2021 Lake Charles, Louisiana

Lake Charles, LA was hit hard with two hurricanes and major flooding in recent years. Samaritan's Purse is one of the organizations that is currently in Lake Charles to help clean up from the storms, and rebuild people's homes. Over the course of the week we as a group are assigned a foreman who is assigned a house with a specific list of jobs that they would like to have accomplished everyday. We go to the jobsite and we attempt to do those jobs as best we can. The different jobs vary. It starts at the demolition stage. Which is where the team has to rip out the drywall, installation, carpet, floors (if damaged severely), essentially tearing it all down to the foundation. Which leads to the next stage which is, the rebuild stage. This is where the teams will reinstall brand new flooring, windows, trim, dry wall, etc. Then it finishes with the final stage which is, home dedication. This is where Samaritan's Purse holds a big ceremony in which they dedicate the home to the homeowners after all of the work has been finished from the first two stages.

What separates Samaritan's Purse from other organizations is first, they do not charge anyone to come and volunteer with them. They do accept donations but it is not something that they require from the volunteers. Second, the way they treat you when you are there is one of the best displays of hospitality and generosity I have ever seen. They feed you plenty of food, the cook during the week said, "If you leave here hungry it's your fault." Third, they are a big prayer run organization. Meaning that they are there to accomplish work but they also spend a lot of time in prayer before the work, during the work, and even after the work. Finally, they preach the gospel. There are other organizations that tell their volunteers to not talk about Jesus until they get back to the church after the day is over. Samaritan's Purse at the beginning of the week actually provides each volunteer with tools that aid in preaching the gospel to people. If you have not been on a mission trip you need to go on one! It really is life changing. Not only for you as an individual but for the individuals that you are going to serve. I want to finish with 1 Peter 4:10, "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace."

While wreckers search for valuables along the windswept Cornwall coast—known for its many shipwrecks but few survivors—Laura searches for clues to the lives lost so she can write letters to next of kin and return keepsakes to rightful owners.
