It's hard to believe we are in the month of June. It has been almost 2 1/2 months since we have worshipped together. I have missed our time together and have come to realize the value of corporate worship and the weekly opportunity to see each other and build relationships centered around Jesus Christ. On June 14th, I am excited that we will return to what church should be. I know the process will be gradual with some returning right away and others taking their time, assessing what is happening, and determining when they will feel comfortable to return.

I want to encourage you to come back when you feel comfortable and safe. You will know when that will be. For those planning on worshipping on the 14th I want you to know we are taking all measures possible to keep you healthy and safe. As many of you know, we have developed a three phase plan for returning. A decision made by the administrative team/ consistory will determine when we move to the next phase. Phase 3 will bring us back to the new normal.

I just want to take some time to remind you of what to expect when you return on the 14th. The church has been deep cleaned and will be completely disinfected when you come through the doors. All the hymn books, Bibles and other materials in the pews will be removed. The only doors that will be open are those on the east and west side of the sanctuary. The parking lot door by the offices will remain locked.

The front doors will be propped open so no one will need to open and close them. On days when the doors cannot be propped open someone will be opening and closing the door for you. We will not hand out bulletins and offering will be dropped in plates located by the back doors. The fellowship hall and balcony will be closed.

We are encouraging a 6 foot distance from those around you. Family units can sit next to each other. Every other pew will be taped off and the pews you can sit in will need to follow the 6 foot rule. Masks will be optional and we will have some masks available for anyone who doesn't have one but would wear one out of concern for others.

Following church there will be no fellowship inside the building. We will dismiss your pews accordingly. For those who want to have fellowship, you will need to do that outside during Phase 1. Again abide by the 6 foot rule. The only restrooms available will be the two closest to the sanctuary. Also, at this time, the Library will remain closed. In between the 9:00 am service and 11:00 service we will do a deep cleaning of the restrooms and sanctuary.

We will not offer coffee and refreshments nor will there be nursery available. Please use the hand sanitizer stations we have installed by the east and west sanctuary doors. At this point no other events or activities will take place. Chances for small groups to meet will come in Phase 2. During this entire time we will continue to do Facebook live.

I want to encourage you to be patient and understanding of those around you. Our goal is to make sure we are loving our neighbor in such a way that we are concerned about them and not ourselves. I realize we all want church to be the way we have liked it and maybe what it use to be. I also recognize church may never be the same as it was before. There are simply things that have changed, just as each of us have had to adjust so many other areas of our lives.

My ultimate prayer is that when you return, you are returning with a desire to worship as God has designed us to do. We are to celebrate what Christ has done in our lives. We want to give God the honor and glory He so deserves. We want to lift up our voices in song and have a passion for God like we have never had before.

I look forward to seeing your beautiful faces and am excited to see what our new way of worship will look like. In the coming weeks take time to pray for our return and that the Holy Spirit will bring a new attitude and excitement as we return to church and worship together.

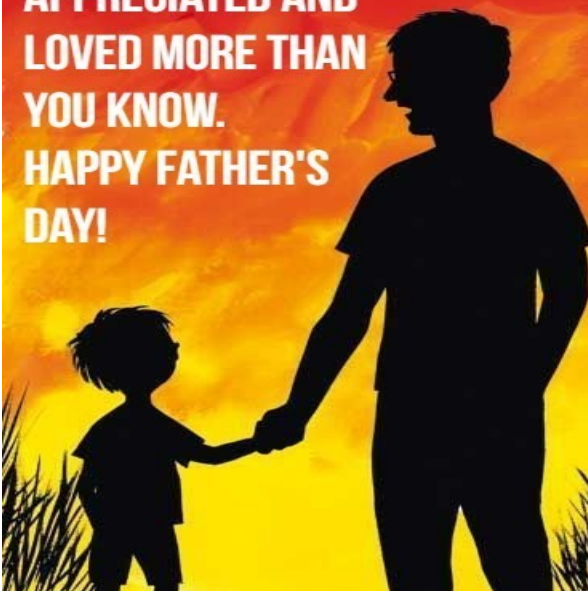

Consistory Meeting Highlights

May 18, 2020

- **MMSC** to upgrade our video equipment with a bid around \$24,000 from RDI of Milford. Money for upgrade will come out of a designated fund specifically for building upgrades and improvement.
- **MMSC** to give congregation an opportunity to contribute to the video system fund.
- The “return to church” date is tentatively set for June 14th, pending the results of a meeting on June 8th whether to return at that time.
- “Return to Church” Guidelines, approved by the Administrative team, were reviewed
- Daily Vacation Bible School is postponed to August 3-7, 2020
- Due to Inspiration Hills canceling summer camps this year, the camp is promoting “Camp In A Box” program where kids would get the materials they would have received for activities in an effort to simulate the camping experience at Inspiration Hills. The Administrative Ministry Recommended our church pay the first \$50 of each “Camp In A Box” for our member students. **MMSC** to approve the recommendation of the Admin Ministry Team to pay \$50 toward the cost of each box.

Our Outreach Team has purchased some Community Express Bus passes to be given to church family/ individuals in need. If you would like a round-trip ticket or know of someone who could use one, please stop at the office.

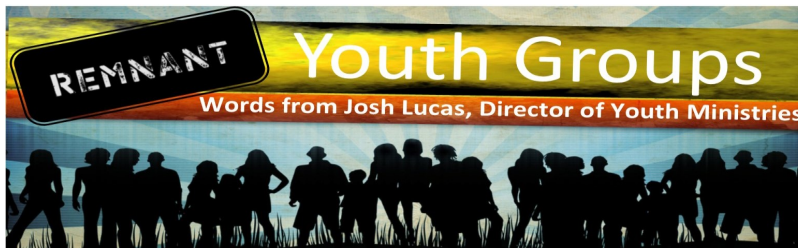

Adrian and Bernardeth Bobb-Kelly in Bluefields, Nicaragua

Amid an imminent threat of the pandemic disease known as coronavirus or COVID-19, we are still functioning by putting into practice the measurements given by health doctors. Thank you so much for your prayers and financial support. With your support, we were able to build a new feeding center in a neighborhood known as Beholden. Its dedication took place on November 14, 2019.

On that very special day, we were honored with the presence of our area supervisor Rev. Luis Ruiz from the RCA, the Bishop and senior pastor of the local Moravian church, Tabitha's Home directive board, and a representative of the Beholden neighborhood. We sang and praised the Lord and a child from the feeding center prayed for the meal.

Last year the food for Beholden children was prepared at the first feeding center and then transported to the children in the Beholden neighborhood. Now the food is cooked and served right there in the new feeding center. From the end of last year, the amount of children has increased from 120 to 160 at the first feeding center and from 40 to 55 at the second feeding center. In December of last year, one of the girls from Tabitha's home by the name of Jolecsy graduated from nursing school. Now, as she waits for her call from the Health Ministry to go and give her social service to one of the small communities, she helps us with the medical brigades and also with the attendance control of the children at the first feeding center. Bernardeth and Adrian's ministry Bernardeth Kelly Bent and Adrian Bobb, who is ordained, work with the Institute of Social Development of the Moravian Church (IDSIM) training health workers, pastors, and other people from villages and neighborhoods. They work with churches to establish foster homes, feeding programs, and scholarships for children from poor neighborhoods in Bluefields, and they provide pastoral and health care to people in remote villages along the Rio Grande de Matagalpa. Learn more at www.rca.org/bobb-kelly. In January, we had our medical brigade trip along the river. Jolecsy and Abayomi, our second daughter, were able to join the trip. Jolecsy went to help as a nurse and Abayomi carried along Christmas packages to share with the pastors and their families and the children from all the villages we do clinics along the river. At this time, the Nicaraguan government is not calling for any type of social restriction from COVID-19, so the schools are supposed to function as normal. Nevertheless, parents have decided to keep their kids home. Consequently, most schools in the Bluefields area are closed. We are trying to continue serving meals to kids by delivering it to their homes. There are some challenges in attending this way but we also want to be responsible for avoiding them from getting infected from the coronavirus in the kitchen. Prayer Requests: 1. Pray for the world as we face this pandemic and may our faith and trust in God grow more and more as we face these difficult days. 2. Pray for Jolecsy as she is preparing to work as a nurse somewhere in Nicaragua, with so little resources and exposing herself to COVID-19. 3. Pray for the Bobb-Kelly family and all the children that are under our care. May the Lord Almighty keep you safe from the coronavirus just as how He protected Noah and his family in the ark.
