



Dear Friends,

I hope this letter finds you well. I'd like to give you updates on projects I've been working on for the RCA and RCA Global Mission.

#### March 2021

School Rebuilding and Trauma Care for Yazidi Children in Iraq

In March 2020 we finished raising \$40,000 for a project to rebuild a school and provide trauma care for Yazidi children in the Duhok region of Northern Iraq (Iraqi Kurdistan). Unfortunately, as COVID-19 turned into a global pandemic, the project was put on hold.

I am happy to announce, however, that rebuilding efforts have now begun! The use of local labor ensures that people in the community have employment and full participation in work that will benefit friends and loved ones who have been deeply traumatized by an attempted genocide, displacement, starvation, and numerous other atrocities the Yazidi people experienced at the hands of the Islamic State (ISIS). Thank you to all who donated funds and have prayed for this project and the people served by it. We also thank Partners Relief and Development who have continued to serve vulnerable populations such as the Yazidis, going into areas where very few international organizations have access or are willing to serve. I ask you to join me in continued prayer as this project develops and as we look forward to the day when children—many of whom have not attended school in over six years—walk through the doors where they will receive education and continue the process of healing. All too often, people who have been forcibly displaced by violence are not able to return home; I'm grateful for the opportunity to support a project that is defying those odds. Stay tuned for more updates!

#### **UPDATE May 2021**

I want to start this letter off with some amazing news. Thanks to the generous prayers and financial gifts given by many of you, the school rebuilding project in Iraqi Kurdistan is now complete! This project (a partnership between Partners Relief & Development and RCA Global Mission) was scheduled to be rebuilt in the spring of 2020, but due to the evolving COVID-19 situation, was delayed for a year. In February 2021, Partners began rebuilding the school with locals who were personally affected by the Islamic State occupation in the region providing labor for the rebuilding project. **The school was projected to serve 400-500 children who had been forcibly displaced from the region and suffered unspeakable loss and trauma by the Islamic State, but more than 600 children have enrolled so far; some have not received formal education services in over six years.** Partners was also able to build a soccer (football) field for the children, and to see children who have suffered such atrocities have the opportunity for education and play fills my heart with such deep joy and gratitude; I hope it has the same effect for you as well.

Again, I thank you for joining me in these efforts. I often have people ask me how we, as a small Christian denomination in the United States, Canada, and U.S. territories, can share God's love and compassion for refugees and displaced people worldwide. My answer is: This. This is one powerful example of how we can do it. Praise be to God.

I'm currently working with global ecumenical partners to identify a new project opportunity to provide care for refugees and displaced people, similar to this project in Iraq. Please join me in praying that the next project will come together and be fruitful as well. As always, if you or your church, small group, youth group, classis, etc. are interested in donating or raising funds for refugee care, please contact me at <a href="mailto:jitenclay@rca.org">jitenclay@rca.org</a> and we can discuss opportunities.

At the same time that I'm rejoicing in the rebuilding of this school in Iraq, I continue to lament the issues in our world today that have led, and continue to lead, to forced displacement and death of people all around the world. Wars and violent conflicts. Political corruption or instability. Persecution. Economic collapse. Climate change and climate or natural disasters. Profound and pervasive threats to life and liberty. We know that in our world today, over 80 million people have been forcibly displaced from their homes, and over 26 million are formally categorized as refugees.

I believe God laments this, too. I believe God calls us to care for those who are displaced from their homes and are seeking refuge, whether they live in our communities or thousands of miles away. ## From the library.

From the library--

New to the library this month is the "Heart of the Frontier" by Tracie Peterson trilogy.



The first book is **TREASURED GRACE**: "Grace Martindale has known more than her share of hardship. After her parents died, raising her two younger sisters, Hope and Mercy, became her responsibility. A hasty decision to head west seemed like an opportunity for a fresh start but has instead left Grace in a precarious position. When missionary Dr. Marcus Whitman and his wife agree to let Grace and her sisters stay at their mission for the winter, Grace is grateful. Until they hear from their uncle in Oregon City, the three sisters have nowhere else to go. As Grace ad-

justs to life in the West, she meets a fur trapper named Alex Armistead who intrigues and infuriates her in equal measure. But when a measles outbreak threatens lives at the mission and among the native Cayuse who live nearby, it is Alex who helps Grace use the natural healing remedies she learned from her mother to help where she can despite Dr. Whitman's disapproval. As the death toll rises, so do tensions between the settlers and the natives and Grace soon find herself and those she loves in more danger than she imagined possible."



Book #2 is **BELOVED HOPE**: "Hope Flanagan survived the massacre at the Whitman Mission, but at terrible personal cost. Safe now in Oregon City, the gentle rhythm of tending her family's flock of sheep is slowly healing her mind and soul, but her precarious new peace is shattered when Hope is asked to testify against the Cayuse responsible for the massacre. She's not sure she can bear to relive the events of those horrific days, but neither can she risk her attackers being released if she doesn't tell her story. As Hope struggles to make her choice, an Army lieutenant named Lance Kenner becomes an unexpected ray of light in her life. Perhaps she is

still capable of love after all. But will Lance still want her if he learns the whole truth of what happened to her at the mission? Or are the secrets that lie in his own past more troubling?"



**CHERISHED MERCY** is in LARGE PRINT and book #3: "Mercy Flanagan survived the Whitman Massacre and now her heart's cry is for peace between the native peoples and the white settlers inhabiting Oregon territory. Unfortunately, most of the settlers want the tribes removed from the land completely, one way or another. At the request of the family friend Eletta Browning, who is experiencing a difficulty pregnancy, Mercy travels south to the Rogue River Valley to help. At the Browning Mission, she meets Eletta's brother-in-law, Adam. Despite her attempts to befriend him, Adam seems determined to focus on ministering to the local tribes

and keeps her at arm's length. Why is he so intent on pushing her away? When tragedy strikes and tensions in the territory reach the combustion point. Mercy is pushed to the limit of her strength. She and Adam will have to rely on their faith in God and on each other in order to make it out alive."
