

Hello First Reformed Church,

Your Devil Crushing Ninja Trainer (Youth Director for short) here to give you an update on what is happening and hopefully to encourage you! I hope that you all have been very encouraged and challenged over the last month. The James series was a very challenging but rewarding sermon series for me, I hope that it was the same for you as well. I really appreciate this opportunity that you, as FRC, have given me. In my master's program currently, it is required of me that I put in a certain amount of time doing either a job in ministry, internship, volunteer, etc. I have just been using the youth group as my experience but taking on the role of preaching on Sunday has been a great help with my studies. It is very interesting over the last couple of months I have really felt a lot of pressure. Not from anyone in the congregation but from myself. I have felt that I am not good enough to be standing at the pulpit to preach to you because of my age and experience. This is something that a lot of people my age, mid-late twenties, deal with when stepping into a new role. We tend to think, "Are people going to listen to me because I am so much younger than them? Will I be good enough for this new role?" This was something that I was troubling myself with all throughout the month of January. It actually got so bad that I was even considering stepping down and not fill the pulpit anymore. That was until I was reminded of a man named Timothy.

If you do not anything about Timothy, he was a teacher of the word, or in our context a minister. He was a young man around late twenties to early thirties. He was given the position of authority over a congregation that was much older than he was. He suffered from shyness and being very timid. He was taught by none other than "the hardest working apostle." This seems like a guy that should not have suffered from any of these things, right? If you have not guessed yet I am speaking about Timothy from the New Testament. He was instructed by the Apostle Paul. Timothy was very shy and timid, and he was very nervous about the fact that his congregation was much older than he was. What does Paul encourage him with? 1 Timothy 4:12, "Let no one despise you for your youth, but set the believers an example in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity." This is the greatest encouragement I could ever receive in that moment of self-doubt. I now know where God has called me and as long as He continues to give me opportunities I will continue to preach faithfully, boldly, and biblically. If you are like me and doubt yourself because of your age or your personal "flaws" just remember who God used to accomplish His work here on earth.

He used a man with a speech impediment to free the Israelites (Moses), a man who was an adulterer and a murderer (David), a tax collector (Matthew/Levi), and a murderer of Christians (Saul/Paul). He used countless others, but I hope you get the point. Do not look down on yourself because of your age, height, weight, race, or your past. If you are repentant and have made a change then do not beat yourself up and keep yourself from doing ministry. If you feel the call go and do, but just make sure that this call does not contradict scripture in any way. Youth group is going great right now! We have been given approval to start planning for our annual mission trip and junior high trip so we will hopefully have more details next month! Be on the lookout for that! REFORMED THEOLOGY

REFORMED THEOLOGY has what is called a 'high' view of God. This is an old fashioned way of saying that reformed people base their theology on the view that God is sovereign over all. Most people who say they believe in God say that they believe that God is 'sovereign' and may talk about a 'purpose' behind everything that happens. However, five minutes into a conversation about the

subject it people reveal their doubt and confusion about this very doctrine. In our time it has become even less clear to us what we believe about God.

Let's start with a definition. **Theology** is the "study of God", and is based on two Greek words. "Theos" means God and "legein" to speak. *We all have a theology—or view of God*. The real challenge for us is to make sure our theology is focused on the God revealed to us in Scripture.

Think about the kinds of things that you hear everyday from friends and neighbors, or in media. When was the last time you heard someone say?

- It doesn't matter what you believe, as long as you're sincere.
- All religions are basically the same.
- God is god no matter what you call him.
- I believe in the god of the New Testament, not the Old.

Everyone believes that they are entitled to their own view of God, and that it is ok when our views disagree with one another. It isn't logical but consider this conversation.

Person One: There is no god.

Person Two: I believe that there is a god.

Person Three: You are both right!

This is a not unfamiliar conversation to have with people of differing viewpoints. It comes from the assumption that *all views (personal beliefs) are equally valid.* What is also clear is that we are not only contending with different religions, but with illogical thought and contradictory ideas.

Increasingly there is no clear, or universal, concept of who God is. In America it is not only possible to accept all view of God as equal, but it is nearly forbidden to hold to an exclusive definition. Believers in Christianity are told to avoid discussing anything close to truth. America's increasingly secular culture often gives the impression that studying the truth of God is no longer relevant and should be confined to the ivory towers of academia.

But we believe in the God revealed to us in the Bible—the infallible, inerrant, revealed words of God to his people. The Bible tells us that God is absolutely in control of all of creation. There is not one maverick molecule outside His control and he does not accept all views as equal.

The Kingdom of Heaven is not a democracy, and God cares about what we believe about himself. If in doubt, remember the first three of the 10 Commandments!



GOD'S SOVEREIGNTY OVER SALVATION

Among Christians there are many points that we debate, and the nature of human participation in salvation is a big debate. Reformed theology teaches that "at the heart of the Christian gospel is the declaration that God saves sinners from judgment through His Son Jesus Christ. Moreover, He saves people according to **His sovereign purpose and design**. The Bible teaches that God decided who would be saved before He even created the world (Rom. 9:23; Eph. 1:4; Titus 1:2). But this view, which tends to humble man and exalt God, is widely rejected by many" in the church. https://thestateoftheology.com

Research done by many reputable scholars reveals that only a minority of evangelicals agree with the biblical doctrine of the sovereignty of God in salvation. The influence of Arminian theology remains strong in American churches. https://thestateoftheology.com

Arminianism is based on the work of Jacobus Arminius, a Dutch theologian from the 16th century. Arminius taught that humans are not in bondage to sin and that they have the ability in themselves to choose to believe. In our language it is mostly like to be the question of 'free will' or a will that does not need God to sovereignly intervene before a person comes to faith.

His beliefs were considered heretical by Luther, Zwingli and John Calvin because it put man's will above God's. His ideas are closely linked to an earlier heresy known as Pelagianism. In 1610 a document entitled the *Remonstrance* was signed by 45 ministers and submitted to the Dutch church for consideration. The result was the Synod of Dort (1618-1619) which met to consider these differences. The result—**The Canons of Dort**—which is one of the RCA statements of faith.

The document is a masterful response to the Remonstrants and in our time has been reduced to the acronym **TULIP**. The five points of the Remonstrants were answered with what has come to be known as the Five Points of Calvinism. Reformed theology teaches that salvation is in God's hands alone and that we can do nothing to save ourselves.

TOTAL DEPRAVITY: Perhaps better defined as *Radical Depravity* states that every part of our lives is touched by sin. Not all that we do is as sinful as it could be, but nothing that we do is completely without sin. We are slaves to sin and unable to do anything to save ourselves.

UNCONDITIONAL ELECTION: This is the doctrine that God has chosen from eternity who he will bring to faith.

LIMITED ATONEMENT: Also better described as particular atonement, says that the substitutionary atonement of Jesus Christ is limited to the Elect. He accomplished salvation for those he chose from the beginning. No one that He died for will be lost.

IRRESISTIBLE GRACE: God's grace, given to the Elect, is so lovely that sinners cooperate, believe and come to faith.

PERSEVERANCE OF THE SAINTS: Again, we might want to change the word saints to believers, but the doctrine teaches that those who are truly saved cannot be lost. Jesus will accomplish not only justification, but also sanctification and glorification for his redeemed.

From the library--

A new series "Danger Never Sleeps" by Lynette Eason has been put in the library. We have the first two books and I will highlight them this month.



COLLATERAL DAMAGE is book #1. Honorably discharged from the Army after an explosion nearly killed her, former military psychiatrist Brooke Adams has set up shop to help others, but her days of helping military personnel are over. She's got her own battles to fight from her time overseas, and she's not equipped to take on more.

Former Army Special Ops Sergeant First Class Asher James could handle anything that war sent his way. The only thing that scares him now is sleep. As the shadows close in, the nightmares begin. Finally convinced that he needs help, Asher

makes an appointment with a counselor. When he arrives at her office, she isn't there—but a dead body is. When it becomes clear that Brooke was the real target of the attack—and that her secrets go even deeper than his own—Asher vows to protect he no matter what.



Book number two is ACCEPTABLE RISK. Sarah Denning is a military journalist with the Army in the Middle East when she is taken hostage. When former Army Ranger Gavin Black is asked by his old unit commander—Sarah's imposing father—to plan an extremely risky rescue, he reluctantly agrees and successfully executes it.

Back in the US, Sarah is livid when she is discharged on a false psychiatric evaluation and vows to return to the Army, until she hears of her brother's suicide. Unable to believe her brother would do such a thing, she puts her plans on hold and enlists Gavin to help her discover the truth. What they uncover may be the biggest story of Sarah's career—if she can survive long enough to write it.



As soon as this pandemic ends, we would love to have you join us with your mission teams! We've learned so much this year through our local community and ministry partners. We've learned we should not close our hands to the needy, that we should help and encourage those who are trying to do good to others, and that we need to continue showing our love for others with our actions. Thank you for your partnership in this ministry work.

Blessings of 2020: Despite all the problems during 2020, it was a great joy for us to see two of the girls from Tabitha's Home

(Shayann and Arleen) graduate from high school. They were under our care from when they were four and two years old. Seeing them grow up has been a great blessing, and now we also celebrated with them this special day and pray they may continue to always seek God's guidance. We can recall seeing Shayann in 2009 at her promotion in preschool when the teacher called on Adrian to give her the preschool certificate. Now eleven years later, they call on Adrian to give her the high school diploma. Another highlight in this graduation was to see that, from a class of 28 students, 12 of them were part of the ministry. Some were in the Comedor (feeding center), others in the scholarship program, and of course Shayann and Arleen from Tabitha's Home. Another exciting outcome is that we were able to create more space in the old feeding place neighborhood in July so the children can come back to their original kitchen and continue to praise the Lord and have their normal meal Monday to Friday.

Challenges of 2020: The ongoing challenges we faced this past year were the COVID-19, hurricanes ETA and IOTA, and lack of funding for the healthy child program.

COVID-19 forced us to seek new mechanisms to continue to feed the children. To follow up with the new measurements of the World Health Organization and thus avoid getting infected with the coronavirus, we had to put the food in bags or buy rations and take it to the children's homes. Then, we had to borrow a place with a big space to fit all the children to give them their food to-go. While we did this, kids were always coming to the center to ask when we were going to start to serve food in the kitchen again. As soon as we thought it would be safe to serve the food in the kitchen, we sought for alternatives to bring back the children to their normal feeding center. Bernardeth came up with the idea of expanding the old feeding center by just removing some walls to make spaces. After doing this, we had a wider space to fit more kids at a time. So, presently we have all the children getting their meals at the original feeding center.

Regarding hurricanes Eta and Iota, they both made landfall on the North Caribbean coast in Nicaragua. They also affected some areas of the Rio Grande (Big River) communities. Both hurricanes destroyed houses and plantations of the people we serve in the communities along the river. Iota caused more damages because it made landfall closer to the south part of the Caribbean coast in Nicaragua. Even our village clinic roof in Makantakita was destroyed. Unfortunately, the government relief was focused on the larger areas of the North Caribbean coast where the hurricane hit the hardest. Given this situation and witnessing the pressing need of our people affected by the hurricanes in these villages, we felt the need to find a way to provide drinking water and food for our people on this side at least until the government could bring help. Getting the freight up the river was a great challenge because they do not have a freight boat to take anything up there. We had to charter a second outboard engine to help us carry the things. On our way back, we ran out of fuel because the weight of the freight burned out almost 90 percent of the fuel. But, thank God that there was a gentleman along the river who loaned us some fuel to make it down to Bluefields.

We acknowledge that during 2020 we had more challenges that came along with the pandemic because the unemployment rate increased even in the informal areas. It was hard for us to continue feeding the children. Our funding was limited and we had more and more children coming to the feeding center asking for food. It was very hard to turn them down. There were times when we used to run out of food and sometimes kids would go home without a meal. This was very sad because before we were always able to get something for the kids as long as they made it for lunchtime, and even when they were late sometimes.

Hopes for 2021: Put back the roof and do repairing wherever is needed on our village clinic.

Paint both the feeding centers and Tabitha homes and repair some areas that are damaged.Help more children with their educationHave two spiritual retreats with the staff.
