





#### **Bible Study Verses**

#### **Thoughts**

One of the more memorable hunts of my life occurred about a decade ago, but the irony of this memory actually has nothing to do with an animal or an actual hunt.

A group of us connected up at a friend's hunting property in northern Michigan. We had been hunting together for several years and had always camped out on this property as we hunted. Well, the owner of the property decided that he wanted a more permanent camping scenario, so he bought an old full sized camper to leave on the property for us all to sleep in. The camper had been placed there during the summer months, and none of us had gone in it to check its condition prior to us using it.

We all just showed up -ready to sleep in this rig. As we tossed our gear in the camper, we were all looking forward to being in this bigger and better outfit. That night, we all were trying to drift off to sleep when we started hearing sounds coming from the walls - scratching noises.

We laid there awake trying to figure out what it was. But, it wasn't until the middle of the night that we finally figured out what was happening. The "new" camper was infested with mice!

Several of us awoke to the pitter-pattering of mouse feet across our sleeping bags. They were everywhere! We did stay in there for the night. But, I took my sleeping bag, pulled it over my head, and cinched the draw string down to the point where the opening of the sleeping bag was about the size of a quarter. Just large enough for me to get a breath of air through...and of course I was praying that no mouse hopped through the little hole that led to the interior of my sleeping cocoon.

I'm not sure if I got one second of sleep that night! Wow! Did we have an infestation. We had hundreds of mice that were scampering around the camper everywhere. It was disgusting!

#### **Action Point**

There are times in our lives where we need to sit down and take a serious assessment of our lives. How are we doing as husbands/wives? How are we doing as a parent? How am I doing as a son or a daughter...?

It is my personal belief that way too many of us as Christians are being absolutely infested by the messages of the world. We are trying to live double lives . . . a Christian life and a worldly life! It flat out doesn't work to do this.

Technology is great and can be used for wonderful ministries (such as this one). But, how much info do you need in your life? How much time are you spending on the internet? Your cell phone? Social Networks? Blogs? The list could go on and on. But the point is simple. Are you controlling these "tools" or are they controlling you? An addiction is an addiction!!!



No April Consistory Meeting.

#### Rowland and Jane Van Es in Kenya April 2020

About a year ago, we were preparing a memorial service for Jane's Mom. What a blessing it was to gather as a family to remember Trudy—to have her friends and church family come together to tell us how she had impacted them in some small way that we would have never otherwise known. Receiving all those hugs of condolence at the service healed our souls and soothed our broken hearts. As Jane was thinking about this, she began to cry for all those who not have this experience now due to the pandemic. In the months leading up to

Trudy's death, we were in Michigan on home service so we were able to visit her regularly while she was in hospice care. Jane was thinking of all those who in the current situation of social distancing cannot physically be with their loved ones. She was also thinking of all those wonderful hospice workers and volunteers as well as chaplains and pastors who ministered to her mom in those final weeks. How difficult it must be for them now to have restricted access to those very people they want to comfort. And this brought tears again. For some, this sadness may seem like a lack of faith. As we look through social media we see people saying that we should not be sad or afraid because God is with us. And of course, this is very true. But sometimes the way they say it seems to include a condemnation—the idea that if you are sad or afraid in these difficult times then you don't trust God. However, there is plenty of evidence in the Bible that God wants us to cry out and express all of our emotions. Consider the Psalms of Lament. First, notice how many there are, both individual (like Ps 54) and communal (like Ps 44). The Israelites were not afraid to take everything to God in prayer, even their laments. Next, notice that usually after the opening invocation and honest complaint, there is also a confession of trust, then a petition for help, and finally a vow of thanksgiving. We can pray like that, too. Two weeks ago, the government of Kenya banned all weddings, funerals, and public gatherings to curb the coronavirus. While we see the wisdom of this, we still cry for all those who have lost a loved one at this time. In Kenya when someone dies everyone goes to visit the family at home. Usually, there are so many visitors that they need to set up a tent in the garden to hold them all. Hundreds of people will come every day to sit with the family, to pray with the family, to help the family plan for the funeral, and to raise money for any unmet expenses. Widows and orphans are always vulnerable when they lose their husband and father—how much more so when they cannot have the support of their community. So now we cry out for Catherine, from Jane's Bible study group, who lost her husband last Saturday and now is sitting at home alone with her four young children. We cry out for Miriam, one of our students, who lost her father on Tuesday and whose family didn't receive any financial support in their time of loss. Miriam now wonders if she will be able to return to school once we open again. We pray for our former students who are now serving as pastors. We cry out for them as they are frustrated in their desire to comfort those who mourn. Life is hard right now. We see the consequences of injustice more clearly in this time of crisis. We cry out not because of our lack of faith but because we know that our Lord is so loving. God will accept our cries of anguish and will comfort all those who mourn. This is what brings us hope. "May the God of hope fill us with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit" (Ro 15:13).

#### From the library--

I was desperate, I needed a book to read and didn't have a whole lot of choice among the new library books waiting to be brought to church. I found one, MY JOURNEY by Robert Schuller and debated, remembering the controversy over the Chrystal Cathedral in the 80's. So thinking, "if I don't like it, nothing says I have to read it" I started reading the very thick book.

From the first chapter I was hooked. Pastor Schuller has an interesting way of writing. The book is in three sections: "Small Beginnings," the first one, about his birth and growing up in a Dutch household in the 20's and 30's. He had a very humble beginning and life on the farm was not easy. The second part is "The Wonder Years" and he tells about starting the church at a drive in theater and later obtaining land and building. It was just amazing how God was blessing his work and providing money. The last section is "The Summit Years." He writes about where his fame lead him and some of the health issues he had to deal with.


Final note: I could relate to growing up In the Dutch family and different incidences he related. Since he grew up in Sioux County, the towns he talks about will be familiar also to you. I don't think I will ever drive through Newkirk again without remembering that he graduated from high school there and his wife was from that area. He was a man of God even with all his dramatics (a talent God gave him and he used for God's glory) and a man of faith.


