

Change happens all the time. Sometimes, we are excited for the new beginnings life has to offer us and other times, we drag our feet, rebel, and run from the changes in our lives. We hate giving up the control we thought we had. Living on this earth, it is sometimes hard to remember that we are not in control as much as we would like to believe. Sometimes, it's down right hard to except the changes around us.

But, You cannot go with God and stay where you are.

Once you come to believe in God, you demonstrate your faith by what you do. Some action is required.... You cannot continue life as usual or stay where you are, and go with God at the same time. To go from your ways, thoughts, and purposes to God's will always requires a major adjustment. God may require adjustments in your circumstances, relationships, thinking, commitments, actions, and beliefs. Once you have made the necessary adjustments you can follow God in obedience. Keep in mind—the God who calls you is also the One who will enable you to do His will.

You cannot go with God and stay where you are.

You must make major adjustments in your life to join God in what he is doing. Once you understand what God is saying to you, you have to make adjustments in your life to follow him. You cannot stay where you are and go with God.

What kinds of adjustments might you have to make? There are several areas where you may need to change. Changes may be needed: in your circumstances, (job, home, finances, where you live) in your relationships (family, friends, boy/girlfriend, children, how you relate to people), in your thinking (prejudices, methods, values, potential), in your commitments (to family, job, church, traditions), in your actions (how you play, talk, routine, hobbies), in your beliefs (about God, what God can do, dependence on God). The Bible gives us many examples of men who had to change to follow the will of God. When God was going to send a flood, Noah had to stop whatever he was doing and start building a boat. Jonah had to move to the city of Nineveh to preach the gospel – and give up his prejudice and hatred for the Ninevites. The disciples had to make adjustments in their careers, financial security, home, and belief when Jesus called them to follow him. Paul had to give up being right. Everything he thought was right was wrong – an adjustment in mindset and ego. Moses had to make several adjustments when God called him to go to Egypt and lead the people to freedom.

1. You cannot stay where you are and go to where God is leading you.
2. Changing your actions or circumstances is difficult enough – but adjusting your thinking, prejudices, identity, and relationships can be even more difficult!
3. Adjustments are good for you! God may ask for major changes of you. However, every adjustment will change you to be more like God, and more trustful of God.
4. God is interested in your surrender to him - So that nothing in your life is greater than God, or what he wants to do in your life.
5. If God speaks to you about something and you don't do it you miss out on what God wants to do through you, and you miss what God wants to do in you. Not following God is disobedience and a lack of surrender – and it costs you more than anyone else in the end.

Our tendency is to want God to adjust to us and our plans!! We want to obey God but only on our terms. His ways are different from ours, though. God says, "For us heaven is higher than earth so My ways are higher than your ways, and My thoughts than your thoughts." (Isa. 55:9) Before we can follow Jesus, we must be willing to make whatever adjustment is necessary. Anytime you go from where you are to where God is working, or from your way of thinking to God's way or from your purposes to His purposes, a major adjustment will be involved. Surrender involves giving up our desires, goals and preferences to God and accepting God's will, regardless of how difficult it may be.

Words from Pastor Luke

It always amazes me when I drive through the country on my way to somewhere I am going. I am reminded of how great a God we have. I look at all the crops growing in the fields and am reminded that it is the farmer who plants the seed but it is God who makes it grow. Just think about it.

Every spring our farmers faithfully and trustingly plant these small seeds of corn or beans or wheat and then trust God with providing the rains, sun and heat they will need to grow. I often think with my lack knowledge of plants that I would even, under the right conditions, probably kill those same crops. But God provides.

Have you ever given thought to the amount of water it takes to make our acres and acres of crops to grow? I goggled the answer. One inch of rain falling on 1 acre of ground is equal to about 27,154 gallons and weighs about 113 tons. That's only on one acre. Now multiply it by the thousands and thousands of acres we have just in this area. It's simply amazing. Now God just doesn't provides those rains just once, but in his perfect timing. When we take the time to think about it we are reminded that we are even more significant.

In Matthew 6, I am remind of how God provides for the birds of the air and the lilies of the field and yet how much more valuable are we than they. God will be there for us if we are willing to trust him and give ourselves over to him. We can experience the fullness of life if we truly believe that God will provide. In Proverbs 3:5-6 we read,

Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight.

We need to be willing to trust. God will give us exactly what we need when we need it. Why, because he cares for you. He loves you. After all he did the impossible. Because of our sin we were destined for hell. We were dead to life. And then the impossible, God sent his only Son into this world to live among us, to experience what we experienced and then He died for us. Jesus Christ paid the price. Without God we would be dead just as the crops without the rain, sun and heat would be dead. But praise be to God that He provides for the crops in the field and that because of His love He provides us with salvation.

The next time you are driving through the countryside take the time to look at the crops. Think about the volume of water needed to make them grow. Think about the sun and heat and then be reminded that these come from God because he provides. As you look at the crops be reminded of how much more does he love you and will provide for you if you are willing to trust Him with all your heart.

I hope you are enjoying your summer and may you see God in the many blessings that are around you.

News From JJ and Tim Ten Cley

Dear Friends,

I want to start this letter with an important reminder and an apology. For those of you who have supported us from the beginning of our time as RCA Global Mission coworkers, you will recall that we spent our first 10 months in Naples, Italy. The goal was to start new services for migrants, refugees and asylum seekers in the Naples area, mostly those arriving from Africa and the Middle East. Last June, a joint decision was made between the Waldensian Church of Italy (our local partners in mission), the Reformed Church in America, and our family for us to move from Naples to Palermo (Sicily), Italy, and we moved in July 2015. This move from Naples to Palermo brought us closer to the “frontlines” of the Mediterranean Sea migration crisis, allowing us to help support existing services for migrants, refugees and asylum seekers run by the Waldensian Church. It also has given us the valuable opportunity to live among migrants, refugees and asylum seekers. For us, this has been a dramatic and important shift in our ministry here in Italy, giving us the opportunity to fully embrace migrants, refugees and asylum seekers as friends, colleagues, classmates, supervisors, neighbors, friends, and part of our church family.

Unfortunately, one of the downsides of moving has been that the news of our move and change of address did not reach all of our supporters. Last week Tim attended a meeting where the president of the consistory of one of our churches in Naples presented Tim with a pile of mail that arrived in Naples for us, dating back to August of 2015 to more recent months. We thank you all for your support, and love when we receive mail from you, and we are sorry that all of you were not aware of our change in address. We will work hard in the next month to catch up on correspondence based on the mail we just received. If you would like our new mailing address here in Palermo, please contact the RCA Global Mission office, or you may contact me directly at jjtenclay@gmail.com. Please know that your mail is important to us and always brightens our day!

For three years straight now, summer has been a time of transition for our family. In the summer of 2014 we were saying goodbye to family, friends, colleagues and our congregation, moving our belongings into storage or packing them for our impending move to Naples. The summer of 2015 gave us the opportunity to re-evaluate our ministry here in Italy and led to a move to Palermo. And this year, as I am typing this letter, we are working on moving from our current apartment in Palermo to our permanent residence here. While we are only moving from one floor in our current apartment building to another floor in the same building (with the same address, so don't worry about having to update our address a third time!), we are moving for the first time to an unfurnished apartment. For those of you who have experienced living in Europe, an unfurnished apartment means that when you move in, the occupants before you

have taken everything, including the kitchen sink, light fixtures, and even the toilet seat! For Tim and me, it is somewhat of an exciting time; for our entire adults lives we have either lived in student housing or in parsonages provided by the churches we have served. However, it is also a stressful time as we are trying to juggle the demands of our work, the needs of our children, putting together lots of IKEA furniture, and packing and unpacking our belongings slowly in our new apartment. Your prayers for strength and patience with the assembly of IKEA furniture, as well as a smooth move this summer, are appreciated!

As I am writing this letter, I am also feeling deep sadness and frustration as the escalation of this Mediterranean Sea migration crisis continues. While migration from the Middle East and North Africa to Italy across the Mediterranean Sea has occurred for many decades, the crisis has deepened in the past five years (in large part due to the Arab Spring uprisings of 2010-2011 and the destabilization of many Middle Eastern and North African countries, including Syria and Libya) and the death toll continues to increase. Last week alone over 700 people are estimated to have died in three separate shipwrecks between Libya and Italy. Despite the Waldensian Churches great efforts to open Humanitarian Corridors to promote safe passage, we continue to receive weekly reports of death at sea for migrants and refugees. Those who do arrive on the shores of Italy alive are deeply traumatized, having fled their home countries for a myriad of life threatening reasons, and endured months of hardship on their journeys from their home countries to Italy. This year at the RCA General Synod a special emphasis is being placed on the need for a greater Christian response to this ongoing global refugee crisis. For those of you attending General Synod, I encourage you to read the letters that have been prepared for those attending General Synod, and to share the information you learn at Synod with your families, communities, congregations, and classes. I also encourage you and your congregations to participate in World Refugee Day (June 20) or World Refugee Sunday (June 19). 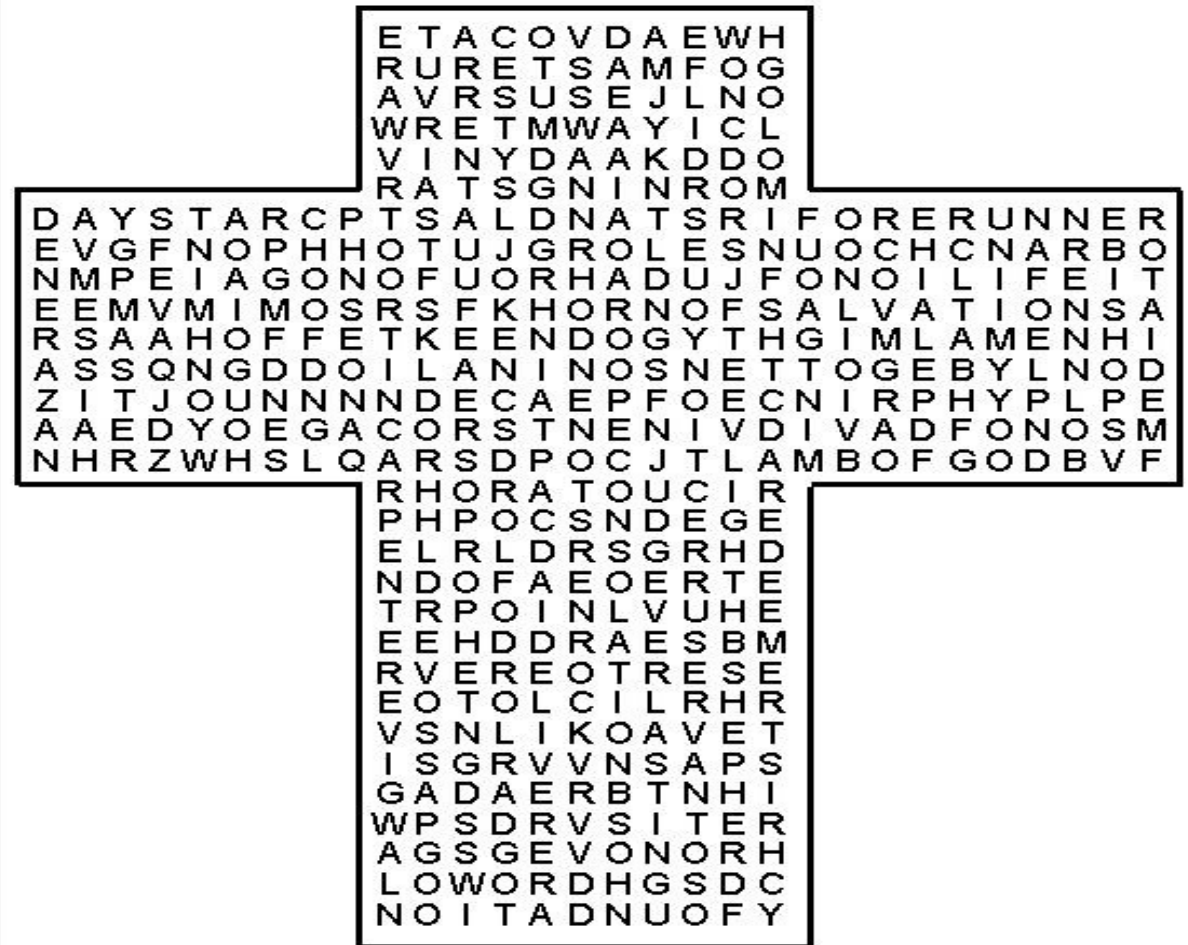

Bible School Macaroni and Cheese Recipe

Slow Cooker Macaroni & Cheese

- 2 – 16 oz boxes macaroni noodles
- 1 – 13 oz. can evaporated milk
- ½ cup butter
- 1 ½ cups milk
- 16 oz. Velveeta
- 1 tsp. salt
- ¼ tsp pepper

Cook and drain macaroni noodles. Place in slow cooker. Add remaining ingredients. Cook on low for 4 hours. (Note: I think 4 hours is plenty, for VBS I placed it in a roaster for about 1 -1 ½ hours. I think you could also cut down the noodles or add more milk, butter, and cheese, I thought it was a little dry.)

Sportsmen's Devotional

Bible Study Verses: I Corinthians 12:18-23, 27

But now God has set the members, each one of them, in the body just as He pleased. And if they were all one member, where would the body be? But now indeed there are many members, yet one body. And the eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you"; nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." No, much rather, those members of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary. And those members of the body which we think to be less honorable, on these we bestow greater honor; and our unrepresentable parts have greater modesty. Now you are the body of Christ, and members individually. (NKJV)

Thoughts:

Paul portrays believers within the Body of Christ, by using appendages and organs of the human body--the eye, the head, the foot, and the hand. In all of chapter 12, he reminds us of the interaction and interdependence of each part within the Body. Almost in the same words that Jesus used to teach His disciples that the "humble will be exalted,"

Paul refers to, "No, much rather, those members of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary. And those members of the body which we think to be less honorable, on these we bestow greater honor; and our unrepresentable parts have greater modesty, but our presentable parts have no need. But God composed the body, having given greater honor to that part which lacks it," I Corinthians 12:22-24 (NKJV).

Action Point:

It is imperative upon us to treat others, as Christ treats them. How many times have we looked at some in our church, as if they were more important than others, just to find:

Their accomplishments or prominence, was due to someone behind the scenes?

Those who were more behind-the-scenes in their service of others, were actually quietly serving Christ, and not men.

My pastor-mentor from my teen years, the man under whose ministry I surrendered to preach the Gospel, is now 97. Once I told him that after God called me at age 16, the two greatest influences on my life were Billy Graham, and him.

He replied, "That puts me in good company." To which I replied, "No, Pastor Scribner, that puts Billy in good company." This humble, Godly, mostly unknown man, is definitely one who is "worthy of greater honor."

Sportsmen's Tip of the Day:

When teaching others to fish, don't take anyone who won't help dig the worms. My granddaughter (above) and grandson know that it's all a part of the fishing trip, including cleaning and eating the catch. Exception? If you're practicing "catch and release."

When teaching others to hunt, don't take anyone who won't dress their game, and eat it. In this way, you teach them to respect the quarry, do their part on the trip, and appreciate the seriousness of taking an animal's life.

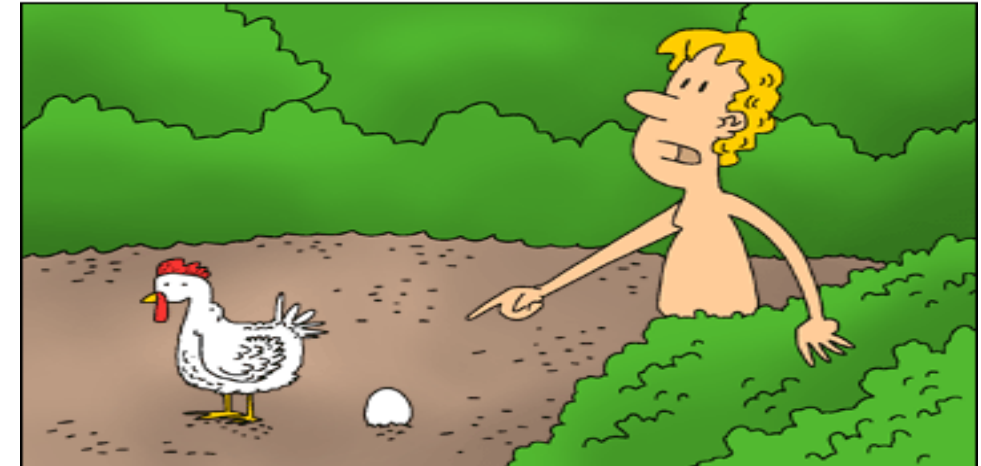
