Mom has a list of things she wants accomplished on the outside for the summer. I figure it will probably take a full year to say we are finished. Moving is hard!

When we lived across town from one another, mom usually stopped at my house each night for a visit. These visits were never very long, usually 15-30 minutes. Since we both are not living with spouses, I think we needed that time together to talk about our days. We talked about the good and the bad. When we decided to move to the new houses, I was a little worried that mom would be over here even more. And part of me was worried about that. I love my mom. She is simply the best. However, I would be lying to you if I didn't admit that sometimes she drives me nuts. And I am sure, although I have never heard her say it, I drive her nuts. We don't always agree with one another and sometimes we can be "mad" at one another. That is family. We love whole heartedly even when we may not like the other person at the time. So, I was thinking if she were over more, I might have more times when she drives me nuts.

I am really proud of my momma. This was a HUGE step for her. She has never been one to make decisions and has depended on others to tell her what to do. She made this decision on her own, and I can report that my relationship with my mom did change with this move. Mom is probably over to my house less than before. I don't know why that is. But, for me, it's being able to look out my window and see the lights on at mom's house. It's knowing she is home, safe and near to me. I love that. I don't know if she does that back to me. I have never asked her. I can tell you that for some reason, it makes me feel closer to her than ever before. It's made me love her more and cherish her more. I am very lucky, and I realize that. I don't know if she has benefitted from this move as much as I have, I never asked her that either. I can't thank her enough for all of the sacrifices she has made for myself and my siblings and my heart overflows.

Proverbs 31:25-31 (NIV) says this about women and mothers: *25 She is clothed with strength and dignity; she can laugh at the days to come. 26 She speaks with wisdom, and faithful instruction is on her tongue. 27 She watches over the affairs of her household and does not eat the bread of idleness. 28 Her children arise and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her: 29 "Many women do noble things, but you surpass them all." 30 Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting; but a woman who fears the Lord is to be praised. 31 Honor her for all that her hands have done, and let her works bring her praise at the city gate.*

Over the last couple of months I have been lifting up in prayer our call for staffing. There are four areas I have been concerned about, youth, education, worship and calling. We have been seeking direction on how we can most effectively meet the needs in each of these areas. As much as I want to be there for everyone in this congregation I have recognized that it is a huge task. I often feel like I would never be able to fully meet the spiritual needs of those in the nursing homes, assisted living, having surgeries, recovering at home, those dealing with loss, and the many other sick and shut ins. Beyond that, there are also the individuals counseling sessions that is done for many of the others issues people are facing.

In lifting this up in prayer, God has opened a door for us to be better than what we are in the area of calling and spiritual care. Several weeks ago Kathy Runia (Cal Runia's new wife) came and shared with me her desire to help with those who need spiritual care and help organize those gifted in calling to be more effective in reaching out to those who need spiritual care. To me this was an answer to prayer.

After some conversation with her and the elders we have decided to recognize and receive Kathy as a volunteer to help me in the calling/visiting process. Kathy has had many years of nursing experience and has taken classes in spiritual care of those who are sick, aging and hospitalized.

Kathy will be helping me and this church in a couple of ways. First, she is going to help me organize all those who are in need and arrange visitation by me, the elders, a calling group or herself. She will determine who should visit. Our goal is that there will be more intentional visits from people within the church providing greater spiritual care. She might be contacting you if you are need to make sure we can care for you. As we sat down the other day to determine those in need we came up with a list of over 50 people!

Second, Kathy herself will do some of the calling. She has experience in this area, she is being encouraged to use her gifts. Although she is a nurse her main focus will be the spiritual wellbeing of those within the congregation. This will especially helpful to me if someone has a longer hospital stay.

This new position will be a work in progress. Our goal is to more effectively do ministry and be there for those who are in need of spiritual care. This will be wonderful benefit to all those who are members of First Reformed Church or attend on a regular basis. I have asked Kathy to, share about who she is, her experience and her desire to be unused in ministry in this capacity.

News from Adrian and Bernardeth Bobb-Kelly

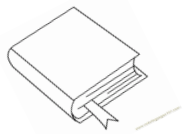

The stories take place in Boston, MA and South Dakota on the Lakota Sioux Reservation. Some of the sites mentioned will be familiar to you. In the first book Evangeline feels called to leave the luxuries of Boston to be a missionary in the wilds of South Dakota.

Three donations were from another person. One was Your Best Destiny by Wintley Phipps. Here is a quote from the back of the book: Mr. Phipps knows what you're seeking—and how to find it. In Your Best Destiny, he unlocks eight secrets that will reveal your unique character and lead you into the most amazing life you could ever experience. These secrets are based on proven truths that will help you grow stronger, overcome obstacles, and achieve what God has in store for your life.

The second book is The Eighth Kingdom. Is God's ultimate plan for the world unfolding before us? Around the world many people have a premonition that current events are setting the stage for end-time events to unfold. Why is there so much global upheaval on so many levels? Where is the world heading? Why are terrorist activities and other threats continuing to increase? We accepted her petition and before she left to receive her training, Luz Elena had already started to eat at the feeding centre. When Yondra's time approached to leave for training, she brought her daughter Luz Elena to us at Tabitha's home. A year has passed and now we are so happy to see Yondra working as a police person and taking care of her daughter. She said that she is so thankful for what we did for her because without that help she cannot imagine where she would be. We humbly give thanks to God Almighty for giving us the privilege to help others in need.

A couple of summers ago, my son and I went on our first Canadian fishing trip. We had been planning this trip for quite awhile with some extended family and were excited about finally getting the chance to land some northern pike.

Well, our first morning out fishing was going to prove to be difficult to top. We anchored our boat near a rock island and my son threw out his first cast. Immediately, he had a fish on and started reeling it in. It wasn't a huge fish, but at least it was a nice start to the day. He reeled it up to the surface, and we could see that it was a walleye.

As he continued to reel the fish over to the boat, a nice northern pike came up out of the deep water and nailed the walleye. The fight was on! The leisurely reel turned into an epic battle between my son and this northern. After a few minutes of fighting with it, my son was able to get the pike up to the side of the boat where we netted it and brought it in--with both the walleye and the northern on! That northern was never on the hook. He simply had bit the walleye on the side and absolutely refused to let go! The first cast of the trip accounted for a "2 fer" - one hook, two fish.

Many times our focus is on me - my salvation, my God, my Lord, and my church. The reality is that faith is bigger than my personal experiences with God. When God looks at a man within a family, he desires a "2 fer."

The salvation and faith of a dad is supposed to be passed on to the next generation by him. One faith, two generations or more. (Dave M)

Action Point

As outdoorsmen, we understand the value of passing on an outdoors legacy to our children. It's up to us to pass on the traditions and the fun of being out in the wild. We also need to recognize that it's up to us to pass on the Christian faith to our children and grandchildren.

Ultimately, the Holy Spirit has to draw each person to Himself; but we have been given the privilege of teaching our children about Jesus. It's God's plan--a "2 fer."
