

When Mark and I first got the kids well over a year and a half ago, consciously or sub-consciously, and without speaking to one another about it, we quickly fell into rolls of a "traditional family". Mark took on the role of "dad" and I took on the role of "mom". The kids never had had this before. Their mom had been sporadic at best in their lives, and there was no dad. One of the other things we established early on was to start having all of our evening meals at our family table. This was new to the kids as they were accustomed to eating in front of a TV at various times throughout the day. There were no set times to eat. That became our new routine.

The table that we had at Mark's was not ideal for all of us. It was too small and did not fit the space in his small house. After a year or so of trying to cramp all of us around the table, I desired to have a different table. These meal parts of my day quickly became the highlight. Not only did we start the tradition of eating our meals at the table, but we also enacted the policy of the kids doing the dishes after the meal. I became the "dishwasher" and the kids were supposed to rinse and rack the dishes. I love this time because the kids will whisper secrets to me and talk quietly with me and share things with me. No doubt about it this was a wonderful time.

Recently I purchased a new table and chairs for the house. Last week while standing in the kitchen, Alicia said to Mark and I that the dining room area was her favorite area in the entire house. And I looked at her and I said, "It's funny that you say that Alicia, because I was just thinking that that table is my favorite piece of furniture, not only in Papa's house but in my house too." That table has come to mean something to us. It is much more than "just a table" I don't know if it represents stability for the kids, or the idea of a family for the kids, or just the tradition and the guidelines we set up for the kids. Whatever the reason it all comes back to that table....which got me thinking

Another table of great importance to us as Christians is The Lord's Table. It is something very meaningful to all of us as believers. It too represents something more than what meets the eye. The body of Christ is represented by the bread that we take and eat. The blood of Christ is represented by the wine (or juice in our church) as the blood of Christ being washed away for our sins. John 6 conveys a similar idea. After Jesus proclaimed himself to be the "bread of life," he said, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day" (verse 54). Our spiritual food is in Jesus Christ. We show that we live in Christ, and he lives in us. The Lord's Supper helps us look upward, to Christ, and be mindful that true life can only be in him and with him.

At the Last Supper Jesus shared a meal with His disciples and then led them in the observance of Passover. Jesus shared this meal for their benefit and for ours. As Jesus raised the bread and the cup in thanksgiving, He added new significance to this ancient ritual. Luke 22 records that Jesus told His disciples to observe the Passover "in remembrance of me."

Jesus took an old symbol and filled it with new meaning. The meaning of Jesus' words and actions is rooted in His command to remember. Today we observe the Lord's Supper in remembrance of Christ. Don't take the Lord's Supper lightly. It is one of the most precious gifts Christ has given to his church. Let's eat it together.

News From Rowland and Jane Van Es

Dear Friends and Supporters,

Here are some headlines from Kenya's Daily Nation newspaper the last week of January: "**Kenyan's feel effects of ravaging drought.**" Three rivers in Embu have dried up and several more in West Pokot drying up as tributaries already dry. People are moving to Uganda with their animals for water. "**Families cry for food as famine hits counties.**" 50,000 in Tana River area are suffering as the Tana River is drying up. 100,000 in North Rift are also at risk as springs, wells, dams, and boreholes are drying up. "**Residents in drought-stricken areas resort to eating livestock, wild fruit.**" Locals are feeding on meat from their own dead livestock. 700 cows died last month. Some people got sick eating a dead camel. "**Anguish in Garissa as drought worsens.**" Hundreds on the verge of starvation and the situation there is pathetic. Many are walking up to 50 kilometers (30 miles) for water as wells, streams, drying up. "**Drought puts western Kenya at risk.**" No counties recorded normal rain during the short rains. There is crop failure in Embu and below average crop production in other areas.

Reports in early February estimated that 2.7 million Kenyans are in need of relief food. This past Sunday in church we prayed the following prayer from our monthly Family Service liturgy: **Prayer for Rain:** Heavenly Father, you know all the things we need. We pray that you will send rain on this country for the crops to grow, so that everybody may have enough to eat, and for the rivers and dams to be filled to supply us with water and electricity. We pray for those who are suffering from the effects of drought, and ask you to guide those who are trying to help them. In the name of Jesus. Amen. We urge you to also pray for rain for Kenya and for several other African countries experiencing drought. RCA Global Mission has several mission co-workers and Kenyan partners who are working with water and development projects in the affected areas. If you would like to help with water for Kenyans in the short and medium term you can support the Maasai Well Project or the Scheenstra Well Project.

In the long term, we feel that the holistic education provided by St. Paul's University is key to true transformational development. Students who are studying development are learning about ways to help Kenya diversify its food supply, to rely less on rainfall for agriculture, and to find other ways to feed its growing population. If you would like to contribute to scholarships for needy students and/or support our work directly please go to www.rca.org/vanes.

Because we believe that "God is good all the time and all the time God is good," we know that the rain will eventually come and bring new growth and new life. When the rains do come we will pray to God again, but this time using the following prayer of thanksgiving from our same Family Service liturgy:

Thanksgiving for Rain: God our Father, you know all the things we need. Thank you for sending the rain again this year. For the rain which falls on the farms and on our vegetable
