Beginning last month and into the month of April we will continue to have our sermon series entitled "The Journey of Stones". With each week I am carrying the stones in my pocket. I humor myself that by the end of this series I will have pocket full of rocks. What I am finding is how often those rocks are reminding me of my relationship with Jesus Christ.

I am reminded I am a sinner who deserves eternal punishment. I am the one throwing stones at others and at times even rejecting God. Satan is constantly telling me I am not good enough, I will never amount to anything and the ways of the world are far better. As I think about

those things it is easy to feel like there is no value and purpose in how I am living life.

Maybe you have felt this same way or feeling that way right now. You are questioning what you are suppose be doing in life. Your marriage isn't what you had hoped it would be. Your children haven't grown up to be the perfect little angles you prayed about. You might be struggling at work, in relationships or simply with yourself. We are even in situations that we don't want to be in but are put there by others or circumstances beyond our control. It can become depressing. I can't imagine those who actually deal with depression and how hard it has to be for them.

But there is an answer. It is a great answer and I believe the only answer. That answer is Jesus Christ. In this Lenten season we are reminded of our humanity and sinfulness. But during this season we are reminded of a God who has loved us in such a way that He sent His one and only Son into this world. His Son would die and suffer on a cross for us. Jesus would defeat sin and change our relationship with God forever.

Jesus Christ allows me, and He allows you, to defeat the lies of Satan. Jesus Christ gives me strength and He is faithful. I am also reminded He is beside me every step of the day. As I carry these stones I am encouraged, strengthened and experiencing joy. God is so good to me. I can find energy in that relationship and a peace that can come from nowhere else.

Jesus Christ wants to be a part of our thoughts, our job, our marriage, our children and even our sin. He wants to bring hope, give strength, pour out love and walk beside us. Jesus wants us to know that He paid the price, so our sins might be forgiven, and that God is good. We are his children and no matter what we do, He will never leave us nor forsake us. So, we need to stay focused.

During this Lenten season I challenge you as I have had to challenge myself, to make Christ that cornerstone. That is where it all begins. With Christ my sins are forgiven. With Christ I can stop throwing stones. With Christ a marriage can be healed. With Christ a child's life can be changed. With Christ you can have a different outlook about work or relationships. With Christ we can take those situations that are out of our control and see His perfect plan work through them.

Philippians 4:13 is a great verse to have upon your heart each and every day. It reads:

I can do all this through him who gives me strength.


From the library--

We have acquired some "new" books by Robert Whitlow, a practicing attorney. Books that are "new" to the library but not "brand" new! I found them very interesting and different from what we already have. They are about a practicing lawyer and all that is involved in defending someone.



The first book is LIFE SUPPORT. Here is a synopsis from the back of the book: "Baxter Richardson survived a fall from a cliff while hiking with his wife in the mountains. Whether he'll make it through the next few weeks is unclear. His survival depends on the machines that help him breath; on the haunted unstable wife who wants to pull the plug and hide her secrets; on the doting father who wants him alive for reasons of love and money; on the conflicting legal documents that send the fight to court; and on the music and prayers of an extraordinarily gifted pianist."

You will want to read the sequel LIFE EVERLASTING because the last sentence of LIFE SUPPORT leaves you hanging!!



LIFE EVERLASTING synopsis reads: "The youngest son of a family consumed by greed, Baxter Richardson lingers on the earth in a coma. His wife wants him dead to protect her secrets. His brother wants him dead to gain control of the family empire. And though Baxter's father fights to keep him alive, even he EVER ASTING has ulterior motives. But Baxter has a surprising ally. A classically trained pianist, Ted Morgan, believes music can be used as prayer. And Ted's divinely RODERT inspired playing has been slowly pulling Baxter back from the brink of death. Attorney Alexia Lindale represents Baxter's wife, Rena, but has no idea that she and her client are being played in a game that has higher stakes than a

single legal case. As Baxter grows stronger, the more endangered he becomes. As Alexia navigates her responsibilities to her client, her relationship with the gifted musician, and her new relationship with God, she must discern the truth as it pertains to life, death...and life everlasting.



Three other books by Robert Whitlow have been cataloged into the library—They are "A Tides of Truth" trilogy: DEEPER WATER, HIGHER HOPE, and GREATER LOVE. His legs were like rubber from fatigue, but he was sure the wolves were trying to cut him off from reaching the safety of the old farm house.

He would of course only tell the story at night around the campfire and as kids it would provoke great fear and suspense. We could feel the fire in his lungs and legs.

As the old farm house came into view, the wolves were starting to come out on the old logging road, closing in. He was standing up peddling now, praying someone would be home to meet him at the door with a really, really big gun.

Action Point

I love that the Bible relates directly to me personally and that within every story there is a promise to me personally. "Fear Nothing, not even wild wolves in the night."

God has my back, my future and promises to rescue, shield, protect, fend off, be my shield, be my refuge and be my fortress. As light takes the fear out of darkness, God takes the fear out of life. It's a choice to let our minds conjure up all kinds of fears or take the promises of God and believe them personally.

When in bear country I always know exactly where my flashlight and bear maze is when turning out the lights. One is in one boot and the other in the other boot, right by my sleeping bag for quick easy access in a moment's notice. I never lose any sleep.

Coming back to the field after home service is always an adjustment. We were on home service from August-December last year and had a good time visiting 19 of our 23 supporting churches. We enjoyed a lot of quality time with friends, family, and other supporters. We also had a white Christmas in Michigan.

Coming back to Kenya just in time for the second semester at St Paul's University was an adjustment; some easy, some hard. The moderate climate was easy to get used to again after fall and winter in the US.

Driving on the left side of the road (and on the right side of the car) took a few days to get used to again.

Period of Sorting out which classes to teach and on which day of the week they were offered to fit most student's schedules took a few weeks due to the many different groups and several modes of study offered here. We have now finally settled down to our normal full load of teaching four classes each.

Rowland is teaching pastoral care, and Christian ethics again as well as two new ones for him, pastoral counselling and New Testament themes (theology). Jane is teaching Introduction to Sociology to the Theology students, and Gender Psychology, Health Psychology and Research for counselling students.

In addition to teaching, Rowland has already had three opportunities to preach in Jan: once in church on Sunday, once for Monday chapel, and once for the longer Wednesday chapel (with Communion). Jane met with the leadership team of her Women@10 Bible study group and for some Thursday meeting.

We miss the good times we had with our two daughters in Holland and our time with Jane's mother and brothers as well as one full week with Rowland's family. We thank God for skype and for the cheap phone calls from Kenya to the US which keep us informed (though it is not the same as being there).

We take comfort in the fact that we do have many friends and neighbors here that we can talk to and share experiences with. We have many colleagues at work and good friends at church and other people we can socialize with over a meal, on the tennis court, or while walking our dog in the tea fields nearby.

We also realize we have many opportunities to impact our students and other Kenyan's lives

just by being here. Preaching, teaching, praying, Bible study, mentoring, and just having good conversations about life and work and our common Christian faith cannot be taken for granted. Many other missionaries and pastors pray for the kinds of opportunities we have so readily available here in our setting. Training future leaders of the church and society is an important job and we don't do it alone but are doing it together with other qualified staff and all of us only do it with God's daily help.

Yet when the king was at peace he would ride a donkey. The symbolism is the Prince of Peace, Jesus Christ, was coming for purposes of peace between God and man.
- 3. When Jesus entered into Jerusalem at the beginning of the <u>Passion week</u>, the people welcomed Him as king and Messiah. They covered the road with their garments and palm fronds as a symbol of their worship and acceptance of Him as king (Matthew 21:8; Mark 11:8; Luke 19:35, 36; John 12:12, 13).
- 4. Peter (John 18:10)
- 5. Malchus (John 18:10)
- 6. Three times (Luke 22:54-57; Mark 14:69, 70; Matthew 26:73-75; John 18:13-27)
- 7. 30 (Matthew 26:15)
- 8. By giving Him a kiss (Matthew 26:47-49).
- 9. Hanged himself (Matthew 27:3-5)
- 10. Bought the potter's field with the money which is where strangers were buried (Matthew 27:6-8).
- 11. Barabbas (Matthew 27:15-26; Mark 15:6-15; Luke 23:18; John 18:40)
- 12. To leave Jesus alone because He was a just man. She had a bad dream concerning the Lord and she probably felt it would bring bad luck on the household of Pilate (Matthew 27:19).
- 13. Alexander and Rufus (Mark 15:21)
- 14. "Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews" (Luke 19:19). It was written in three different languages according to John 19:20; Hebrew, Greek and Latin.
- 15. "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34)
 - "Verily I say unto thee, Today shalt thou be with me in paradise." (Luke 23:43)
 - "...he saith unto his mother, Woman, behold thy son! Then saith he to the disciple, Behold thy mother!" (John 19:26, 27) / Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani? that is to say, My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?" (Matthew 27:46; Mark 15:34) / I thirst." (John 19:28) / "It is finished:" (John 19:30)
- "Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit:" (Luke 23:46)
- 16. "Truly this was the Son of God" (Matthew 27:54). Slightly different statements, but the same idea are found in Mark 15:39; Luke 23:47.
- 17. The veil in the temple was torn from top to bottom (Matthew 27:51). We call this access to God the "priesthood of the believer." This means that Christians can approach God's throne through prayer without the need of a human mediator or priest. Because the <u>veil was torn</u> from the top to the bottom, that is symbolic that it is God who grants us access and not that we have worked our way into God's throne room; which could be implied if the veil was torn from bottom to top.
- 18. Three hours (Matthew 27:45; Mark 15:33; Luke 23:44-45). From noon to 3 pm.
- 19. Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus (John 19:38-42). Interestingly, these two men did not follow Jesus as He traveled through the region, but they were there when all the outspoken disciples had abandoned the Lord.
