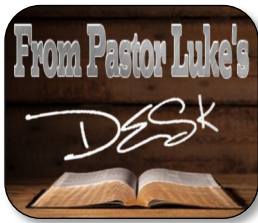

I have enjoyed this latest series on Loving your Neighbor. I have heard many great stories of conviction and the challenge to love those that are around us. As God convicts your heart, I pray that you will find the strength and boldness to get to know your neighbor, love on them and do what is necessary to move them toward a relationship with Jesus Christ with the help of the Holy Spirit.

One of the biggest challenges I am laying out is getting involved. What does it look like to love your neighbor and what can you do? In my letter to you this month I want to share some ways you can get involved and love your neighbor.

The first is Daily Vacation Bible School. This week has always been a blessing to our children from church, but an even greater blessing comes when we have community kids who attend. Over the years we have heard wonderful stories of lives being changed. We would love for you to join us in this fun way to love your neighbor.

Second, on June 8 we will be having a prayer booth at Good Old Summertime. It will be an opportunity for us to pray with our neighbor who might be in need. It might be an opportunity to talk to someone about Jesus. We also want it to be an opportunity for those who might need help in a simple manner, for us to be able to lend assistance to them. I would call this “physical help” like mowing a lawn or moving some furniture. We can use your help in manning the prayer booth and the “physical work” signup as well. Back by popular demand again this year, is our Church sponsored inflatable which we could also use some volunteers to help take care of.

Third, on June 15, it is our goal to get out into our community for the morning and actually love on our neighbor with things like mowing a lawn, moving furniture, maybe painting. Wherever we might find a need. This opportunity is a great way to show our community we really care and want to do something for them.

Fourth, there will be an opportunity for us to help the Presbyterian church with a summer meal program for kids in the community. You will find a sign-up in the back for helping donate food or to help make and serve meals each weekday throughout the summer. That will begin the week after DVBS.

Fifth, find a place to volunteer. There are many opportunities within this community to be the hands and feet of Jesus to the people around you. All you need to do is look to find that chance to serve. It is also a great way to build relationships and love the neighbors that are around you.

Sixth, think of someone you know that needs a neighbor. Take the time to build a relationship, love on them, care for them and encourage them. God will provide the right timing through the prompting of the Holy Spirit for you to talk about what God can truly do within their life.

Taking the time to love on your neighbor might be challenging. It might take time, and sometimes it is simply hard work. But your commitment to get involved will not only make a difference in the life of your neighbor but it will make a difference in your relationship with Jesus Christ! Look for someone today to say, “Won’t you be my neighbor!”

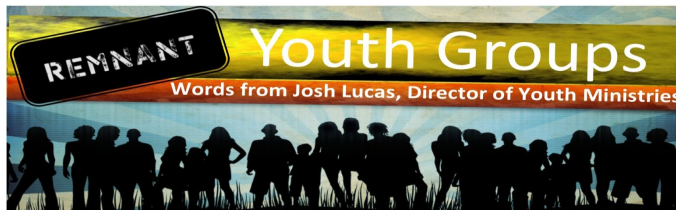

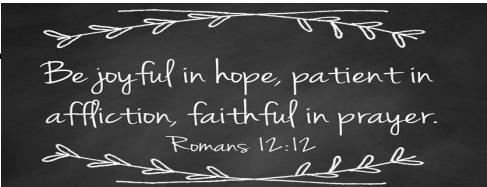

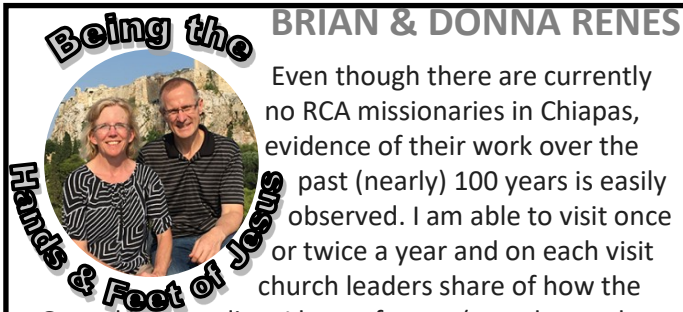

Even though there are currently no RCA missionaries in Chiapas, evidence of their work over the past (nearly) 100 years is easily observed. I am able to visit once or twice a year and on each visit church leaders share of how the Gospel is spreading. I hear of areas (synods, presbyteries) that have far more churches than pastors. I hear of the seminaries and Bible schools started and staffed for many years with RCA missionaries which continue to teach new leaders. I hear of villages once persecuting and prohibiting an evangelist entry now welcome a visit by a pastor to their congregation.

The RCA also has a long history of translating the Bible for most of the groups in Chiapas. While some organizations only translate the New Testament, the RCA missionaries saw that full Bibles were needed for the growth and maturity of the Church in Chiapas. Some of the first full Bibles translated into local languages in Mexico were done in Chiapas and even today 5 of only 8 full Bibles throughout all of Mexico are found in Chiapas.

Looking back there certainly has been great achievement, but more work needs to be done. One group that always seemed distant and nearly impossible to reach was a group deep in the jungle. They were referred to as the Lacandons. From time to time you would see them and know their identity because the men had long hair. I never heard about the Gospel was reaching them until recently. The Bible Society said that a group of believers has started to translate Luke and Acts into their language. Once Lacandon, they now call themselves "Nahá". I hope to help them sometime this year.

The Tojolabals are inching closer to having the full Bible in their language. In Chol a Study Bible project is well underway. In other dialects of Tzotzil and Tzeltal there is an expressed desire to have the entire Bible in their own dialect. Pray for the Church in Chiapas as they continue not only grow in number but so much more so in faith and understanding.
