As we move into Spring, I am excited about the many different things that are happening. I am looking forward to what God has in store and am excited about the ministry that is taking place. This month I want to highlight several items for information purposes.

The first is the ministry opportunity we have with Hope Haven. Some of you might be aware that for the past year Hope Haven has been using our church to gather 3 days a week. It is their opportunity as well as a requirement to be in

the community. Every once in a while, they do little jobs around church and help us out in simply ways. As a staff we have grown to appreciate them and look forward to their "welcomes" every day.

It has also been a joy to get to know the staff. Josh even takes time to have devotions with them. Beginning the first of April, they are now at church every day of the week. It creates more of a set structure for the clients. If you by chance wander through the church while they are here don't be afraid to say "Hello". They are usually here between 9:00 am and 2:00 pm. If we have something that is planned in our church during that time they can adjust and have another church to use as a backup plan.

Secondly, I wanted to share with you what is happening in the East Sioux Classis. The first is a new church start in Storm Lake, Iowa. They have a Hispanic Pastor in place. First Reformed Church of Orange City continues to be a parent church to them and God is already in the early stages of that plant doing some amazing things.

A couple of weeks ago 1<sup>st</sup> Reformed Church did a fundraiser to help them purchase some land for soccer fields that they hope someday will become a place to build a church. In that one night they raise the \$120,000 needed for the 3.8 acre purchase. Pray that the new ministry opportunity will continue to grow.

There is also a change taking place in the Hospers Reformed Church. They are joining with Trinity Reformed Church of Orange City and becoming one church in two locations. They will do ministry together combining resources to do ministry. It is a venture that really hasn't happened with "rural" churches but they are excited to see where God will take them.

Third, is the Marriage Night opportunity. I am pushing this event hard. One of our goals as a church is to build healthy marriages which will produce healthy families. We can make all sorts of excuses as to why not to go. I say, quit making excuses. If I were to guess, based on current statistics, that almost half of our marriages within this congregation are not what they could be. The day you got married was the beginning of hard work to make that relationship healthy and successful. It's time to act. It's time to sign up and join us on that evening.

God created and intended marriage to be a joyful and wonderful thing. There are way too many marriages that are just hanging on, or simply trying to survive. There are many others that have not made it and have created much heartache and pain. I have committed and dedicated myself to doing what I can to help you grow closer to God and in the relationships around you. I also want to remind you that the example you set for your children is seen in an opportunity like this to improve your marriage.

We are looking into being able to replay this if you by chance can't make it that evening. I am also considering to a 5-7 week marriage study following this event. Earnestly pray and listen to what God is wanting you to do with this night.





Very soon the wall project will be finished. Prayer Requests:


- Children at two feeding centers (wisdom, love for God and neighbors)
