# Words from Pastor Luke

This week we celebrate Easter. The words "Christ is Risen" are some of the most life-impacting words we can hear. Because He has risen we are able to find forgiveness, love and hope. I encourage you to take the time to reflect on who Jesus is to you. It is incredibly easy to get so caught up in life that we neglect to ponder, reflect and be thankful for what took

place just over 2000 years ago. It is easy for us to be influenced by the world and its expectations on us. It is easy to place Christ down the list of things important to us.

The reality is, there is nothing more important in life than knowing "Christ has Risen!". The power of the cross is the ultimate reminder of God's longing to be in a relationship with us. This means in order to grow that relationship we need to spend time with Him, get to know Him more and enjoy the companionship that Jesus has brought. I remember singing an old hymn that has continued to stick with me even though it was usually sung around Easter. It was entitled "Every Morning Is Easter Morning From Now On." My prayer is that each day you wake up you would be reminded that "CHRIST HAS RISEN!" It is that fact that makes all the difference.

I also wanted to update you on what is happening around here. The deacons have been working hard and in the next month or two new lighting will be put into place. They found another solution to an upgrade that will reduce our cost to no more than \$10,000. This is a significant savings from the original \$27,000 proposed. I personally want to thank them for their diligence and great stewardship.

This last month at consistory we had an evaluation done by the Classis. They brought great insight into where we are at as a church and encouraged us on moving forward as a church in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. One of the things we have recognized is that we are lacking some real vision for this church in the future. They suggest a program called RIDDER which is a church renewal program. On April 14<sup>th,</sup> myself and several of the consistory members will be attending a "Taste and See" event in Sioux Falls to get a better understanding into what it can do for our church.

I would encourage you to lift us up in prayer as we attend that event and for God's wisdom and guidance for us in being effective in ministry not only for today but for generations to come. We are continuing discussion on becoming a church that can effectively come along side those who are broken and hurting, loving the unloved, and sharing Jesus with the 60% of the people in our community who are unchurched. Personally, I have also been challenged on what we can do to possibly open up some new doors to Hispanic ministry with our church.

Finally, April 5-13, I will be taking my week to study and layout sermons for the 2018-2019 year. I take the time to pray, discern and seek the leading of the Holy Spirit and what should be preached and then outline the entire year. This helps those planning the services including our secretaries, our media person and all those leading music. It also is of great benefit for me eliminating worry and stress as I need to prepare for each week. I am open to suggestions. You can send me an email with your thoughts or slip them under my door. I won't guarantee I will use them but I love the input.

God is good all the time. All the time God is good. HE IS RISEN!

God. Or when you ask, you do not receive because the reason you ask is wrong. You want things so you can use them for your own pleasures. (NCV)

#### Thoughts

"God, I ask you to bless me to harvest an animal today. Give me clear senses to make wise choices and cause the ability you gave me to make the arrow fly true."

The deer came in like a ghost. I never heard even the faintest footfall. She was healthy and strong. Very aware of her surroundings, she kept a watchful eye on every tree branch and leaf that moved. She led what seemed to be a herd down the worn path toward the fence crossing. When she stopped, all the other deer started to feed on the acorns on the ground. She was the matriarch--on guard and continuously snapping her head up and sniffing the air.

I waited for her to be quartering away and head down, feeding, before I slowly drew my arrow and string backward. My drop away rest ticked as it set itself in the upright position and her head snapped to attention. She looked at the base of my tree searching for the unfamiliar sound. I locked my sight pin on a hair on her side and pulled through my release.

"Thank you, God, for this moment in the field, for the hunt I experienced and for the animal you have given me. I am grateful for just being in the woods, but today, you have truly blessed me; and I give You the glory for the harvest."

### **Action Point**

Start now to pray with your spouse, children, or hunting partners before and after a hunt. God wants us to pray whether or not we get a harvest.

Thank you to the donator of two books to the library. They are written by Chuck Norris (Remember him from staring in the TV series, Walker, Texas Ranger?). Here is part of the synopsis from *THE JUSTICE RIDERS*: When General William T. Sherman commissions Ezra Justice to form a secret band of cavaliers to help end the war between the North and South, his order may impact the West as well. Justice, a complex Southerner of simple faith, gathers a pro-Union posse of diverse multi-nationals second to none in their fighting abilities.....



As book two of The Justice Rider series, **A THREAT TO JUSTICE**, begins, Ezra Justice and his elite group of special operation soldiers have just helped General William T. Sherman put an end to the Civil War and must go their separate ways...but not for long.

We have just added a new series by Colleen Coble, Aloha Reef Series. Obviously, they




take place in Hawaii. The first book is **DISTANT ECHOS**, "Sometimes Kaia Onana thinks her dolphins are more human than humans. He's also in search of a fortune rumored to lie offshore. But an act of sabotage that pushes Bane closer to Leia plunges them both into a tangle of emotion—just as a series of threatening events grip the island."

The fourth book of the Aloha Reef Series is **MIDNIGHT SEA**. "A seemingly random shooting at her aunt's coffee farm has left Lani Tagama blind. Now she must learn to navigate in a world of darkness. With the help of an ex-cop named Ben and a half-trained guide dog, Lani begins to regain her former independence. Then Lani and Ben discover that her injury wasn't caused by a random shooting. It was a botched murder attempt!"



The second London Chronicles book is **A SECRET COURAGE**. "American Emma Hanson came to England to study at Oxford, but joined the Women's Auxiliary Air Force at the height of WW II. She is stationed at beautiful and historic Danesfield House west of London as part of the highly secretive Photographic Reconnaissance Unit. Englishman Will Fleming is a handsome young artist who has been commissioned by the British government to record the changing landscape in paintings. His path intersects with Emma's when his real mission... tracking Nazi spies...leads him to Danesfield House, the target of a sinister plot. Add rest of the batter<br/>& then the rest of the sugar mixture on top.Mix dry cake mix with eggs and pie filling. Place<br/>into a greased 9x13 pan. Combine topping ingre-<br/>dients and sprinkle over the batter in the pan.<br/>Bake at 350 degrees for 35-40 minutes or until<br/>done.Mix dry cake mix with eggs and pie filling. Place<br/>into a greased 9x13 pan. Combine topping ingre-<br/>dients and sprinkle over the batter in the pan.<br/>Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or until<br/>done. Make a powdered sugar glaze and drizzle<br/>it on top.



# ROWLAND JR. & JANE VAN ES

Dear Friends,

In 1998, while still a student at Western Seminary, Rowland attended the World Council of Churches 8th Assembly in Harare. Now, twenty years later in 2018, four of our students from St. Paul's University here in Kenya attended the WCC's 14th Conference on World Mission and Evangelism (CWME) two as young theologians, and two others as delegates to the Conference as we were.

2018 is the 70th anniversary of the WCC which had its first assem-

bly in 1948 in Amsterdam. It is also the 60th anniversary of the CWME which had its first conference in 1958 in Ghana. For their 2018 meeting they returned to Africa, this time to Arusha, Tanzania where the CWME met from 8 to 13 March.

Over 1,000 people came from over 100 countries representing many different churches and Christian organizations. We met people from Finland, Latvia, Germany, Jamaica, Trinidad and Tobago, Philippines, etc. as well as Africans from the North, South, East, and West of Africa. The delegates came from various Protestant, Catholic, Orthodox, Evangelical, Pentecostal, and African Instituted churches.

There was a very rich spiritual life to the conference. Every day had morning, noon, and evening prayers as well as Bible studies, speeches, sermons and plenary sessions. It was a real foretaste of heaven to see so many faces from so many countries and to hear prayers said and songs sung in so many beautiful languages (as Rev. 7:9). As well as being ecumenical, it was also very gender sensitive with 45% women!

In planning for the workshop and in comparing our different experiences of reaching out to Muslims, we discovered three key principles common to all our work: trust building and relationships, peace building, then dialogue facilitation and discussion. When we first get to know each other as people and also do some work together, then we can finally discuss our own faith and our own scripture as friends.

The conference ended with a call to discipleship asking churches and individuals to do 12 things. See <u>https://www.oikoumene.org/en/resources/documents/commissions/mission-and-evangelism/</u><u>the-arusha-call-to-discipleship</u>. The final paragraph simply asks all of us to pray this prayer:

Loving God, we thank you for the gift of life in all its diversity and beauty. Lord Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, we praise you that you came to find the lost, to free the oppressed, to heal the sick and to convert the self-centered. Holy Spirit, we rejoice that you breathe in the life of the world and are poured out into our hearts. As we live in the Spirit, may we also walk in the Spirit. Grant us faith and courage to take up our cross and follow Jesus - becoming pilgrims of justice and peace in our time. For the blessing of your people, the sustaining of the earth and the glory of your name. Through Christ our Lord, Amen.

Please join us and the other 1,000 conference participants in praying this prayer. Pray also for our four students who attended that it would instill in them an even greater passion for mission and evangelism. We thank God for the chance to teach the students at St. Paul's University who

come here from many churches and from the countries surrounding Kenya: Uganda, Tanzania, Ethiopia, Rwanda, etc. May God continue to bless all the members of the WCC, the CWME, St Paul's University, and also the RCA!


