Words from Pastor Luke

This morning I stopped by Subway to get a breakfast sandwich. As I was leaving I said good-bye to the ladies working there. One of them said "Enjoy the sunshine!" She smiled as I recognized the sarcasm in that statement as this morning it is gloomy and cloudy. As I got into my car it hit me. Today I can enjoy the sunshine! Not the sunshine she referred to but the SONSHINE within my life. You see, it doesn't matter what your day is like,

when you walk with Jesus, the Son is always shining. In John 9:5 Jesus says, "I am in the world, I am the light of the world." Following this statement, he spit on the ground, made some clay and then proceeded to put it on the eyes of a blind man. When he eventually washed the mud off his eyes he saw the sun for the first time in his life. But even more important, he saw the SON!!!

Summer has been busy for all of us, vacations, time at the lake, visiting family and friends and just sitting outside enjoying the sunshine. It has been good. But for some, summer has been cloudy, not what you expected, maybe dealing with sickness or other issues. If that is the case I want to remind you to "Enjoy the SONSHINE!" Jesus is always there and as long as we keep our eyes focused on Him we will always be in the light. Today I was reminded that even though it is cloudy today I can enjoy the SONSHINE!

In regards to church business, I want to encourage you in a few areas. First, we will be beginning our fall schedule soon. This means we will be needing Sunday school and Bible class teachers as well as some adult Bible study leaders. Prayerfully consider helping in one of these areas.

Second, I encourage you to challenge yourself in taking the next step in growing your faith. Extend yourself in a way maybe you haven't before. Step out, take a risk and see what God will do! Find ways in which you can use the gifts and talents God has given you and live out the Fruit of the Spirit!

Third, you have had the deacons share with you about our budget. This year our budget actually increased about \$20,000, many of the commitments last year in our budget never happened. Several thousands of dollars were not spent on things like parking lot repair, sanctuary lights and our youth position for 8 months. At the end of 2017 we were in the black having met all of our financial obligations. As we have entered 2018 we are now completing some of those projects, like the lights, and have our staff position filled for all of 2018. As we approved our budget for 2018 we made a commitment to support our ministries within our church and throughout the world.

Three years ago, we made that same commitment in approving our budget and in the end fell short and those mostly on the missional end that we committed to, never got what we said we would give. I struggled with that as your pastor because, as a church we want to fulfill those obligations as a matter of integrity and our word is our word. In the next couple of months our consistory will evaluate our budget. They will have to make some decisions based off our giving this year. I encourage you to make their job a little easier. Seek God on what you should give and be reminded that God dares us to see the blessing that will come. It means stepping out in faith which might be scary but I can promise you God will be with you every step of the way!



From the library--







Sportsmen's Devotional

Bible Study Verse

Joshua 4:21-24

He said to the Israelites, "In the future when your descendants ask their parents, 'What do these stones mean?' Tell them, 'Israel crossed the Jordan on dry ground.' For the Lord your God dried up the Jordan before you until you had crossed over. The Lord your God did to the Jordan what he had



done to the Red Sea when He dried it up before us until we had crossed over. He did this so that all the peoples of the earth might know that the hand of the Lord is powerful and so that you might always fear the Lord your God." (NIV)

Thoughts

My wife's passions are her horses and trail riding. In the past 38 years we have ridden many back country trails and followed cairns, small piles of rock set to mark the trail. Today the Forest Service uses small blue diamonds tacked to trees along the trail.

The older method of marking with stones is still used, especially on unmapped trails or the older less traveled trails. Recently I found cairns over two feet high, stacked by an energetic soul. They still all serve the same purpose, the way.

Action Point

Rock pillars or cairns date back to Moses' crossing the Red Sea during the Exodus. Rock pillars, thought to be set up by King Solomon, mark the crossing site. They represent what God did for His people.

Another analogy that I thought of is stones of remembrance are to point and show us the way. I have discovered is that every page of the Bible, both Old and New Testaments, point to Jesus Christ, The Way.

Genesis 5 holds the prophetic stones that reflect genealogy from Adam to Noah which spell out the Gospel:

Adam=Man Seth=Appointed Enosh=Mortal Cainan=Sorrow Mahalalel=The Blessed God Jared=Shall Come Down Enoch=Teaching Methuselah=His Death Shall Bring Lamech=The Despairing Noah=Comfort

In sentence form it reads "Man (has) Appointed Mortal Sorrow; (but) The Blessed God Shall come down Teaching, (and) His death shall bring The Despairing comfort."

Take time to read and study your Bible. You will be amazed at the stones of membrance that you will find. I guarantee it will keep you on the trail.

Some back country trails wash out over the years making it hard to find the way. Invest in a good map and compass or GPS and more importantly, know how to use them.



"I came home the other day after a long afternoon of running errands and this is what my front porch looked like. These shoes mean that I have a house full of kids . . . mostly teenagers. These shoes are a sure sign that it is summer and school is out. These shoes mean there is probably no food left in my house. These shoes mean noise and chaos and laughter and music. It means there are probably kids lounging on my sofa, floating in my pool, playing air hockey or watching a movie somewhere. These shoes mean that we are the designated hang-out house today.

I paused outside of my door and felt a wave of sadness wash over me as I looked at these shoes . . . shoes from a group of kids that have been hanging out at my house for four years now. Some kids have competed on the same teams, some have been in the same classes as far back as elementary school, some have dated and some have broken up. But all have remained good friends over the years. And I love all of these kids who leave their shoes all over my porch. Most of them just graduated from high school which means these shoes will be going in different directions this fall when they head off to college.

They say you only have 18 summers with your kids. I am on number 18 with mine. This realization tugs at my heart and makes me wonder how 18 summers went by so quickly. Big changes are happening around here – for me and all these kids in my house. My heart knows it and feels it and that's why the sight of these shoes has me feeling a little sentimental. I know that after this summer, things will never be the same again. This is a bittersweet part of parenthood . . . this transition from having them home to watching them leave. My head knows this is a good thing, but my heart . . . it just hurts.

I love having these shoes all over my porch because it means that my children are home. It means that I know where they are and who they are with and that they are all safe. I am very aware that these shoes won't be here much longer. All too soon these shoes will be scattered across different college campuses and they will be taking their first steps of independence.
