Words from Pastor Luke

Last night I found great encouragement in our consistory meeting.

Normally we try to get through all the "business" of the church, pray and go home. But last night was different. We had conversation on the passion and love this group of individuals has for this church. There is a longing and desire for spiritual growth, spiritual awakening and proclaiming the Word of

God. There is concern for those broken and hurting and how we can be the church to help them in time of pain and brokenness. There is a heart for those in our community who don't know Jesus. I think it was a conversation God loved to hear.

More importantly we recognized that we needed to humble ourselves and go to God in prayer. The prayers of your consistory were powerful, passionate. With sincerity in their hearts words were expressed that would bring tears because of such a longing for people to know Jesus more and healing to take place. For over 30 minutes we prayed for you, this church, empowerment through the Holy Spirit and wisdom to be effective in ministry. We also prayed that God would bring vision to who we are.

Our desire is for revival and to see God working through this congregation. As a consistory, we are committed to not only to continue to pray for awakening but also for wisdom. I want to encourage you to join us in a commitment to pray for this church and for our people. Pray that we can become a church who is reaching out to the broken-hearted, passionately living for the Lord 24/7, worshipping in a manner that is truly glorifying God and boldly sharing Jesus with those around us. For me there is excitement in what God will do with each of you and this church if we will fully commit to humble ourselves and faithfully seek God through prayer.

This morning I read this passage from Psalm 108:1-5

"My heart, O God, is steadfast; I will sing and make music with all my soul.

Awake, harp and lyre! I will awaken the dawn. I will praise you, LORD, among the nations;

I will sing of you among the peoples. For great is your love, higher than the heavens;

your faithfulness reaches to the skies. Be exalted, O God, above the heavens;

let your glory be over all the earth.

One other piece of encouragement as well as a reminder. Last year towards the end of the year we tried to inform you of where we were financially to meet our 2017 budget. You were incredibly faithful and I cannot thank you enough for your generous giving. As we now enter into this new year I want to remind you that each month we need about \$32,000 to stay on budget. Last month we collected approximately \$24,000.

I want to remind you that two years ago we had a youth salary in our budget and never had to pay it out. Last year we only paid out a quarter of what was budgeted. As we enter into 2018 we celebrate that we have a youth pastor as well as looking to update our sanctuary lighting, but we also need to make sure that we can financially support the commitment we made to the entire 2018 budget. If we are faithful in our giving we will see blessing in the ministry God has called us to as a church.

Nursing Home Prizes





Dear Friends,

If you have ever been to a tulip festival in any one of the quaint Dutch towns in the Midwest, you might have an inkling of what the town of Tomioka once was before it became a ghost town five years ago when the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant in the town which boarders their north was crippled in the aftermath of the March 11, 2011 earthquake and tsunami. In early spring the Cherry Blossom Street in the center of town was where folks from near and far would gather to watch locals dressed in traditional costumes dance in the parade under the canopy of blossoms in full bloom. Now the street has become the dividing line in

which the Government has determined that the radiation levels on left side of the road are so dangerous that people will not be allowed to enter for thirty years and meanwhile on the right side it is safe enough that people can return to live next spring.

Last week Sayuri and I led a group from congregations in Tokyo for their fifth annual visit to Fukushima to listen to the stories of those whose lives have been impacted by tragedy and to worship and fellowship with congregations on the edge of the "safe" district. We felt more than ever a deep gratitude for your continued support. With all eyes in Japan focused on the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, the plight of the people of Fukushima has faded into the background. The decontamination efforts by the government to date have filled over ten million one-ton bags of radioactive waste, which will begin to leach out contamination in three years. Many of these bags are piled up in mountains on the seashore and some have been dragged out to sea during the seasonal typhoons.

Amidst all the uncertainty and anxiety, the congregations we visited in Fukushima have been a beacon of hope to their communities. They have provided them with both spiritual and physical help whether that be an open ear to listen, or a machine in the church to measure the radioactivity in their food or clothes. I was particularly moved to hear the story of man who has been struggling to let go of a farm that has been in his family for many generations describe the solace he felt in his first experience of Christian worship.

For the past five years, the Reformed Church in America has been steadfast in its financial assistance toward the disaster relief efforts in Japan, just as our supporting congregations have been faithful in their support of Sayuri and me in our ministry here for the past two decades. You have truly been a source of hope to people in despair.


