Bible Study Verses

I Corinthians 3:5-8

What, after all, is Apollos? And what is Paul? Only servants, through whom you came to believe as the Lord has assigned to each his task. I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but



only God, who makes things grow. The one who plants and the one who waters have one purpose, and they will each be rewarded according to their own labor. (NIV)

Thoughts

It was a new stand. We had just stood it up on the pipeline the previous day; yet, there I sat, wondering if it would be a good spot. An hour later, I was admiring a small buck that I had just taken.

On the way back to get the four-wheeler, I saw a huge scrape that I had not seen before then. It was fresh, and its size told me that a good-sized buck had been tending it. I was leaving for the weekend, so I told my Dad about the scrape and urged him to go sit in that stand.

In the rain the next morning, he shot a huge nine-point. Sometimes you just have to set someone else up to succeed in order to accomplish a common goal. In our case, it was fresh deer tenderloin and a mount to go in the game room.

His reward was a filled tag. My reward was having helped him to succeed.

Action Point

Our society puts too much emphasis on having the spotlight firmly on ourselves. But, God's ways are not like our ways.

In the passage above, Paul and Apollos were working hand-in-hand for a common goal - to see people come to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. Sometimes Paul would preach and then Apollos would go talk to the people one-on-one, and they would be saved. Basically, Paul says, "I don't care who gets to lead them to the Lord as long as they get saved!"

Sometimes we're called to plant a seed. Sometimes we're called to water it. Other times, we get to harvest. But don't forget that we do exactly what God calls us to do. Nobody harvests unless God

makes our efforts grow. The spotlight is not on us. We're in the shadows. The spotlight is right where it belongs - on our great and glorious God!

One in 10 couples struggle with infertility, and even more have lost precious little ones—either in the womb or outside of it. It can be easy to feel alienated and forgotten on Mother's Day, because everyone is busy celebrating, and your heart is busy breaking.

There are a few thoughts I'd like to whisper into your weary soul this Mother's Day:

• Cry out to the Lord: The Bible is filled with raw and emotional cries to the Lord.

"O Lord, all my longing is before you; my sighing is not hidden from you." Psa. 38:9

"How long, O LORD? Will you forget me forever? How long will you hide your face from me? How long must I take counsel in my soul and have sorrow in my heart all the day?" Psa. 13:1-2

The Lord knows the pain of your heart. Cry out to him. Don't hold back in your sorrow or your suffering. Prayer is one of the greatest gifts, because it allows us to pour our weary souls into the hands of our Savior. You don't have to clean yourself up before you pray; you can come to him upset, crying, frustrated and sad. Tears give emotion a way out, and the Scripture informs our emotions of truth. These two go hand-in-hand as we journey through life's difficult paths.

- Surround yourself with people who love you: Don't walk through this day alone. Let close friends and family know that Mother's Day is difficult. It's okay to ask for help and tell others that you're hurting. People don't often know you're hurting unless you tell them. Allow the church to wrap around you and care for your soul. Invite tender and gentle people to share in your sufferings, to love you, listen to you, sit with you while you cry and to be present. Sometimes what we need most is a hug, a listening ear, and a shoulder to cry on. It might feel difficult or uncomfortable to allow people into your grief, but the Lord gave us community for a reason. We were designed to live life together, as a band of believers, all working for the same goal—to glorify the Lord as we walk toward heaven. It's easy to feel like your lack of children defines you.
- Stay off social media: Social media has a way of stirring up discontentment and dissatisfaction. This is especially true on a day that vividly reminds you of what you lack. Your soul will benefit greatly from a break and a breath of fresh air. You might think it's no big deal, and hopping on Facebook for 15 minutes to relax might seem like a good idea, but scrolling through post after post of mothers and children probably won't do your soul any good. It's better to err on the side of caution than to find yourself in the midst of a breakdown because you've seen one too many posts about babies.
- Childlessness does not define you: It's easy to feel like your lack of children defines you. Childlessness can be all-consuming. But if you're a Christian, the core of your identity is rooted in Christ, not in your ability to bear babies. Fix your eyes on him, and allow your soul to be saturated in your true identity. Being God's child should be the primary thing that defines the childless. It's okay to grieve over the unfulfilled desire, but do so in a way that shows that your ultimate hope, joy and satisfaction is found in being God's child, not having your own child.

Please remember...You are loved and even though you are not a mother yet you are still special.

Isn't the Bible for everyone? There are 7 billion people in the world and in a recent report I read that 1.2 billion don't have access to the whole Bible. Why not?

Travel often takes me to Africa where we are supporting several hundred active Bible translation projects. Civil wars, disease, poverty and other problems burden the people of this vast continent. With over 2,000 languages spoken in Africa, estimates

are that 1,000 have no scripture in their language. (see: https://www.wycliffe.net/en/statistics)

How can we reach the unreached? There is so much work just to start and support one project. How can all be reached? In Cameroon alone there are over 250 languages. This past week I heard that a new project would be starting this year in the Fefe language, spoken by 200,000 people in western Cameroon. A few portions where translated, but those were done 60 years ago. They still don't have the Bible, let alone the New Testament in their language.

How will they hear unless someone goes? Jean Nicolas responded and the Fefe people will hear the Gospel... in their own language.

Jean Nicolas is from Cameroon and works at the Bible Society. I met Jean less than two years ago and we have worked together a number of times since. It is hard to fully describe a person in words, but he is perfect for the job of reaching the unreached. He has high level skills, but is certainly humble. Even though he has a young family, they support his going to train and work with translators in remote and dangerous parts of the country. Last week, with excitement, Jean Nicolas shared that they will be starting the Fefe Bible project in Cameroon this year.

Pray for Jean Nicolas and his family as he not only helps the Fefe project but many others in Central Africa. Jean Nicolas is gifted and passionate. *Will you commit to praying for Jean Nicolas?*


